2. Loans to US/French Zones: It is agreed that figure for Chapel Hill Victory should read 2,801 tons only, for 2,000 tons was in fact off-loaded on this ship for Italy. Yet an equivalent amount was turned over to the representative of US/French Zones at Genoa on S.S. W.M. Wilmer which discharged about 14 August. Thus the total from the two ships is the same as that shown in Appendix "B" to this office letter 90-6/15/FOOD of 7 September 1948.

3. Loans to British Zone: Quantity actually dispatched from SS Byron Darnton is being ascertained from AMS Venezia Giulia.

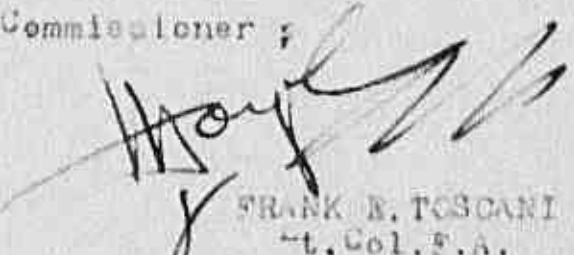
