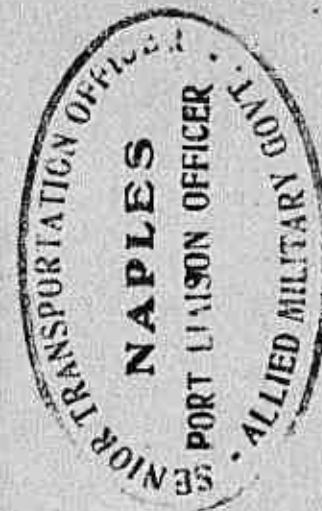

SUBJECT: S/S "LANGDON CREVES"

Further to my letter of June 26th, reference S/32, subject as above, copy of which was sent to you; A.F.H.C. now informs us that it is not possible for this vessel to discharge in Genoa. It has therefore been decided to lighten her in Naples by taking off approximately 1,000 tons, and then discharging the rest of the cargo in Civitavecchia.

It has been ascertained from A.C. Transportation Sub-Commission that railway wagons, sufficient to discharge this ship, can be provided at Civitavecchia, but only approximately 50% of these wagons will be closed. It will, therefore, be necessary for extra precautions to be taken for the guarding of the supplies in their journey from ship-side to the Warehouses in Rome, and shall be grateful if you will take the necessary steps to get guard for the work on the docks, in the town of Civitavecchia, and on the railway between the Station of Civitavecchia and Rome.

The Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari will warehouse the goods in Rome, and our Warehouse man, Mr. Miele, is already working with Federazione Representative in obtaining the necessary warehouse space.

The ship is expected in Civitavecchia on, or around, July 5th.

Mr. Lemmer of UNRRA will act as Port Liaison Officer during the discharge of this ship at Civitavecchia.
