The power requirements of the Jesi Match Factory have been
kept before the Power Allocation Committee of Ancona under the
chairmanship of 20 CRE acting on behalf of C.E. 1 District.

Ancona Province has been dependent upon four or five small
generating plants along the Esino river and their output has
been absorbed by military requirements. All transmission lines
of 30 KV and over were badly damaged and power could not be
supplied from the south. Distribution of locally produced power
had to be made throughout Ancona Province on low tension lines
and line losses were high, aggravating the situation.

It was hoped to supply the Match Factory early in December
but heavy rains at that time washed out the dam at the Franciolini
Power Station and reduced the output of the Esino group by 280
KW.

Meanwhile to meet the many urgent military and civil
demands in Ancona Province and to augment local production,
repairs were started on the 30 KV Ancona-Fano line (first
priority) and 30 KV Ancona Jesi line (second priority). The
former is completed and work is proceeding on the latter which
is expected to be completed by the end of Jany.

Repairs to the dam at Franciolini are also well in hand
and the station is expected to be in operation again to a limited
extent also by the end of Jany.

Troop dispositions for the winter have increased military
loads much beyond what was expected but with the completion of
the above repairs there will be a general improvement in the

(Attention Maj. Price)

- 1) - According to the new rationing scheme for electric power, become effective from November 1st, 1944, the AGIP Building 181, Via del Tritone, where CIP Offices are located, is entitled to 25 Kws per month only.
- 2) - As you know many of the offices are inside and dark and with the winter short days the activities of this organization, which works for the military and civil are greatly restricted through insufficient electricity.
- 3) - During the first months of 1943 (no comparison can be made with 1944 because AGIP Head Offices had already moved to the North) AGIP had the following consumption :

January about	6.800 KW
February "	6.900 "

We presume that this consumption may be reduced to Kws 3.000 per month, which is the minimum required to work during the day at least until 1800 hrs.

- 4) - A request of power for our Offices has already been recommended by AFHQ Petroleum Section with letter Pet 19/12, 26 Sept. 44, but could not be approved by RAAC, TUC Division because the linking of the building with a preferential line would have given electricity for technical reasons to other 250 units.

A second request submitted by CIP through the above Petroleum Section on 30 Oct. 44 has also been rejected by the Electricity Control Board of RAAC owing to the critical shortage of current.

- 5) - As this matter is of vital importance it is requested that the allocation to the AGIP building be reviewed in order to grant to CIP sufficient electric power to carry out its job.

1. The request for 800 K.W. daily to operate the above railway will be submitted for consideration by 2I CRE's. Power Allocation Committee at Ancona.
2. It is anticipated that an allocation of this magnitude will not be approved under existing conditions and that consideration will have to be deferred until the bulk supply from Galleto is available to augment local production.
3. Reasons for this opinion are :
 - a. Military demands are increasing.
 - b. Civilian demands for flour milling, olive pressing etc which affect the population as a whole are still restricted.
 - c. The line from Porto S. Giorgio to Savigliano is only a matter of 30 Km. in length and serves a very limited population mainly engaged in agriculture. A provincial road follows closely the route taken by the railway and organisation of road transport may be a more economical solution to the traffic problem if less pleasing to the Railway Company.
4. At the moment we are snowed up at this HQ. but an investigation will be made at the earliest opportunity and a report submitted.



1. The management of the Foggia paper mill informs this Sub-Commission that a reduction of the 1,300 KW. allocated to the mill is being considered by the "Società Pugliese Elettricità". It is suggested that power be cut down to 50% between 16 and 22 o' clock.

2. The ~~scheduled~~ paper production is based on use of straw cellulose, manufactured by treating straw with caustic soda and chlorine. Said products are prepared through electrolysis, which is a continuous operation. Therefore the proposed reduction of electric power will bring to a standstill the entire production of straw cellulose.

3. It is pointed out that the Foggia mill is the only one working on the whole of the east coast and its importance is obvious in the present critical paper situation in Liberated Italy.

4. It is requested therefore that instructions be given to "Soc. Pugliese Elettricità" that present allocation of electric power to the mill be maintained and that in future no changes with regard to existing status of power to Foggia mill, be contemplated without previous approval of your Sub-Commission.

- The above company own several paper mills and hydro-electric generating stations in the Fabriano district, but none of the paper mills are working as the power stations have been supplying all their output to the district for essential military and civilian needs.
- The generating plants at present operating, and which were undamaged are:
 - PIANCELIA near Pioraco which is supplying 1,600 KW to the Ancona grid.
 - BALZETTE near Fabriano which is supplying 300 KW to Fabriano and district (This station generates at 42 cycles.)
- The Finance and Industry, Sub-Commission, have each approached this H.Q., and also the C.A.O., at Fabriano with regards to the respective production of Bank Note and map paper. The C.A.O. permitted the mill to manufacture Bank Note paper for a period, but had to cancel this arrangement later as there was not sufficient power available. The Finance Sub-Commission has recently approached the Regional Finance Officer with regard to the urgent production of Bank Note paper.
- The present position at Fabriano is that BALZETTE power station is just capable of supplying the district by running to full capacity, though there is about 30 KW available between 2300 and 0600 HRS.
- If it is desired to produce paper, it would appear essential to provide a "Bulk Supply" to the district via the Camerino-Fabriano 60 KV line which has been repaired. The 60 KV substation at Fabriano has been completely destroyed, but a 60/30 KV transformer is scheduled to move from Antrodoco to Fabriano.
- If the above paper is urgently required, will you please submit the scheme to C.E. No.1 District in order to accelerate the transportation of the transformer and provide the necessary supply. It is anticipated that there may be some difficulty in the switching and metering equipment at Camerino.

1. With reference your 060/PWU dated 12 December same subject. We are informed that the situation at Campo Solino, Comune di Fiumicino, is under control. The pumps are draining the flooded areas satisfactorily.
2. The installed pumping power in Focene is 600 KW. The pumps operate only during periods of heavy rain. It has been impossible to meet this demand of 600 KW due to limiting line and transformer capacity.
3. Originally the plant was fed from 30/8.4 KV at Fiumicino but as this was damaged the supply comes from Ponte Galeria at 8.4 KV over a declassified 30 KV line and is transformed 8.4 KV/220 V at Focene.
4. The Società Romana has made request to AC FW&U for 550 Kg copper to repair Fiumicino's 30/8.4 KV 1.000 KVA but has been informed that May next is the earliest release date.

1) Reference your letter W/5868 of 13th Dec. 44
2) The Electrical Division of this Sub-Commission is of course fully aware of the serious situation of the electricity supply throughout Central Italy and every effort is being made to improve this position.

3) To answer the specific points raised in your letter it is necessary to explain primarily the function of this division. We are charged with the responsibility of rehabilitation of the Italian electrical system, which includes repairs to generating stations, transmission system, sub-stations, switching stations and for the operation of the system.

4) Taking para 2 of your letter it is a fact that on 17th November we gave instructions amongst our many switching orders for the Nera Montoro Station to be isolated on to a northern line terminating at Florence. It is incorrect that this action caused the burn out of four generators on the UNES System. For your information three generators on the UNES System have recently broken down due to faults in stator coils. They are as follows:

1. Reference is made to this HQ even no. of 25 Nov. 44, making application for an allocation of electrical power to the textile industry of Prato, which was not accepted at the last meeting of the Electricity Power Board.

2. It is desired that this application should be resubmitted and is strongly recommended. Revised particulars are as under:-

- (a) Woollen Spinning and Weaving
- (b) Prato
- (c) For various firms. The number ready to operate has increased from 25 to 53.
- (d) 0800 hrs - 1700 hrs 500 KW
2200 hrs - 0600 hrs 3480 KW
- (e) 0800 hrs - 1700 hrs 135000 KWH per month
2200 hrs - 0600 hrs 835800 " " "
- (f) Required immediately and to continue indefinitely with a gradual increase as more machines are repaired.
- (g) Factories are ready to operate immediately.
- (h) Starting and stopping times - see (d) and (e) above.
- (i) The industry has volunteered to work during the night 2200 hrs - 0600 hrs in order to avoid the peak period, and to provide employment and manufacture vital consumer goods.
- (j) The quantity required from 0800 hrs to 1700 hrs is for the purpose of carrying out repairs, and ~~1700~~ setting up and adjusting machines which can only be satisfactorily done in daylight.

(k) JUSTIFICATION

- (a) Employment will be found for 7/8000 operatives who are at present out of work, and who may present a problem of social unrest unless they can be employed.
- (b) Immediate production of 1,000,000 yards per month is possible, rising in the course of a few months to upwards of 2,000,000 yards per month on completion of repairs.
- (c) Raw materials are immediately available for 2 - 3 months work, and more are expected to come forward to maintain production thereafter.
- (d) Preliminary requisitions for raw and processing materials and accessories are being prepared for the woollen industry up to the end of 1945.
- (e) All textiles, including especially woollens, are critically deficient in Liberated Italy, and at best large importations of ready made goods are considered necessary for essential civilian needs. Prato is by far the most important woollen manufacturing centre in Liberated Italy, representing more than 90 % of available capacity, and its contribution of manufactured goods can make an important contribution, not only to consumer needs, but will also relieve shipping by the use of local resources.

1. According to the new rationing scheme for electric power, become effective from November 1st, 1944, the AGIP building 181, Via del Tritone, where CIP Offices are located, is entitled to Kws 75 per month only.
2. As you know many of the offices are inside and dark and with the winter short days the activities of this organisation, which works for the military and civil are greatly restricted through insufficient electricity.
3. During the first months of 1943 (no comparison can be made with 1944 because AGIP Head Offices had already been moved to the North) Agip had the following consumption :-

January	about	Kw.	6.800
february	"	"	6.900

We presume that this consumption may be reduced to Kws. 3.000 per month, which is the minimum required to work during the day at least until 1800 hrs.

4. A request of power for our Offices has already been recommended by AFHQ Petroleum Section with letter Pet 19/12, 26 Sept. 44, but could not be approved by R.A.A.C., T.U.C. Division because the linking of the building with a preferential line would have given electricity for technical reasons to other 250 units.

A second request submitted by CIP through the above Petroleum Section on 30 Oct. 44 has also been rejected by the Electricity Control Board of RAAC owing to the critical shortage of current.

5. As this matter is of vital importance it is requested that the allocation to the Agip building be reviewed in order to grant to CIP sufficient electric power to carry out its job.

2. This railway through default is directly under the Minister of Communications, and it has been suggested that the line cannot be operated for passenger traffic, as it is solely restricted to the conveyance of ballast for road repairs.
3. This Sub Commission has not been able to confirm that such is the case, and perhaps you will investigate the matter in order that there can be no misapprehension before current is granted.
4. The Ministry are most anxious to obtain some passenger facilities in the district, and if it is possible for the track to be operated between Naples and Aversa, it would undoubtedly meet the considerable demand for traffic. It is understood that only copper conductors are required, and these might be met by cannibalisation. Beyond Aversa, it is understood that the track is available for operation as far as Capua by electric traction. From Capua onwards, the track used to be operated by steam traction, and it is not possible at the moment to offer any facilities in that respect.

- 1) - In order to further the programme of getting the Italian Government to assume the direction and control of their own affairs, definite steps should be taken to place the supervision of the distribution of electric power, to all services, other than military and essential civilian, in the hands of a responsible agency of the Commune.
- 2) - After the military and essential civilian needs are met the electric power remaining can be dispensed by this agency as they see fit, as long as they do not exceed the amounts allocated.
- 3) - A rationing scheme is now functioning in the City of Rome which provides an amount equal to 10 Kwh per meter per month which is all that the available supplies will provide at the present time. Commercial establishments are allowed energy of varying amounts depending on the nature of the business, and the size of meter installed. In all cases the ration allowed is less than the amount used under normal conditions before Rome was liberated.
- 4) - The tram services are allocated a definite amount as well as hours of operation.
- 5) - Therefore the way has been prepared for the Italian Government to begin taking over and carrying on. Since definite amounts of power have been assigned arrangements should be made with the Communal officials to assume the supervision of this work.
- 6) - It is understood of course that there are many establishments that are difficult to define as to whether they are military, essential or non essential but each class of customer can be considered and the jurisdiction either retained by the military or turned over to the Italians after due deliberation.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

1. The problems concerning electricity for the City of Rome which you submitted to me in your letter of the 14th November 1944 have been carefully reviewed and I wish to make the following comments: -

2. It may be helpful to review briefly the method of procedure in allocating electricity to all areas of Italy, including the City of Rome. The procedure is as follows: -

- (a) The Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission of A.C. submits a program of rehabilitated plants and increased electrical output to the Electrical Committee of the Allied Forces Local Resources Board. This Committee is made up of representatives of the various Military Authorities having jurisdiction over certain areas within Italy.
- (b) The above named Sub-Commission receives all requests for electric energy from the various Army Commands, including the Rome Area Allied Command, which data is also submitted to the above named Electrical Committee.
- (c) This Electrical Committee of the Allied Forces Local Resources Board reviews the availability of electric current, and the various Military demands made for such current, and then makes allocations to the various Military districts, in accordance with these demands, including the Rome Area.
- (d) The Rome Area Allied Command, a military body, then arranges for the distribution of the current made available to it by the above named Committee, allocating first the amounts required by the Military and giving to Rome, for civilian consumption, the available balance.

3. The rehabilitation of electric power-plants is a slow and tedious procedure and every possible effort is made to rehabilitate

plants as fast as it is possible to do so. When a plant is rehabilitated and the current is sent out over the grid distribution system, as this is rehabilitated and extended, additional current will become available at any point within this transmission system. In view of the increasingly greater demand made upon electric power by the Military, it has not been possible to increase appreciably the current made available for Rome. You may rest assured that this Commission is well aware of the need of securing additional electric current for Rome and that it is doing everything possible to this end.

MEMORANDUM FOR H. EX. THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL

The Commission appointed by the Municipality of Rome for the coordination of the public services asks the support and the intervention of his Ex. the President of the Council, so that the Allied Authorities should grant the under-mentioned requests, as an indispensable minimum.

1. That a suitable amount of the electric power which has not, at the present moment, be otherwise assigned, or that it will be possible to obtain from the hydroelectric power plants which are being rehabilitated, should be allotted to the town of Rome. X

This concerns in a particular way the Galleto power plant, for the Azienda Comunale Elettricit  ed Acqua largely contributed to its equipment, and the Ministry of Public Works did some important works for it, even re-building a bridge so that the power produced by the said power plant could be principally destined to the town of Rome. no X

2. That the Allies should decide what amount of power they will require for their own use out of the total amount that the town can dispose of.

3. That the Administration of the Municipality should be left to study how to make a just distribution of the electric power destined to the civilians and to the Italian Authorities, according to public utility. ?

4. That, if this request isn't granted, the following criterion suggested by the Municipal Administration for the said distribution, should be followed:

- a) Allotment of more than 85,000 Kwh a day for the tramway service.
- b) Reestablishment of public illumination.
- c) " of the tramway service at night.
- d) Allotment of electric power to light the halls and staircases according to the decree of the Prefect.
- e) Allotment of power for industry during the night.
- f) Collaboration of the Municipality and the Allied Authorities for granting a privileged distribution of power to the civilians, so that they can see whether it is advisable in the interest of the town. 2

5. As for transportation in common, we remind the Allies that the orders which have been given do not take in consideration the customs of the population and the local conditions.

The Azienda Tramvie e Autobus of the Municipality could take the matter in hand quite well, if only a minimum of means was given to it.

With about 40 filobus in working condition, which the Azienda has already got, equipped with tyres, and what is left of tramcars (provided that a certain amount of electric power should be supplied), also with 20 motor trucks (torpedoni) which could be obtained from the Transportation Office, and with 12 busses now used by the various offices of the Allied Command and which would have to be returned, and with a small quantity of tyres and fuel, the Azienda Comunale (A.T.A.C.) could realize a service which would be satisfying for the public; such a service cannot be

Obtained by the means of transport which have now invaded the whole town, which are very expensive and rather dangerous for the travellers; their service and tariff are irregular, and they are driven without any regard for discipline.

We draw the attention of His. Ex. the President of the Council of Ministers to avoid the serious trouble in the public order which is a cause of the preoccupation for the competent organs of the municipality and for the press; we ask the Italian Government and the Allied Command to make the necessary regulations, in order to avoid the unpleasant consequences of this state of things.



- a) letter of Count Orlando, owner of the Dockyards of Gaeta, Rome 4 November 1944 (Translation);
- b) letter Ministry of Agriculture Central Office for Fisheries and Hunting Prot. N. 2485 (Translation).

2. In addition to the reasons outlined in Reference (a) wherein the loan of two generators are requested in substitution for electric power, the more vital aspects of the question are the following:

- a) The boat building program proposed in reference (a) is of importance in that the craft would replace those destroyed by the war and in the Northern Italian areas destruction is by far more pronounced as it concerns boats than it was in the Southern coastal zones, Sicily and Sardinia;
- b) The more boats working the greater would be the harvest of fish, a vital and needed food for the population as a whole. The more craft the greater would be the availability of fish in large inland consuming centers, such as Rome, Florence, and eventually the larger cities of Northern Italy still in the hands of the enemy.
- c) The dockyards at Gaeta would furnish employment to about 300 idle workers at the start.

3. The concern would need 50 Kilowatt hours a day for the machinery of its dockyards. It is strongly recommended that the power be furnished at the earliest possible date. If the power cannot be furnish=

ed immediately it is strongly and urgently recommended that the two electric generators requested in reference (a) be made available.

H.E. Minister Ryini, during his visit of the town of Gaeta in the name of the Government, desired to lay the foundation stone for the reconstruction of my docks which would give work to a large number of workmen.

The Minister, after having examined the plans for large motor vessels and motor schooners, already approved by the Ministry of Communications, suggested to me and to my experts to undertake simultaneously, giving even priority to the construction of fishing vessels of the "menaidi" and "lampare" type. The Minister of the whole desired quite rightly to occupy himself of that classe of the fishermen of the district, taking into consideration that the fishermen have lost their houses, vessels, equipment and are enduring severe difficulties.

The Minister promised grants by banks of subsidies to fishermen for the purchase of vessels and outfit, and, according to the interpellations, the study for financing the undertaking is in good progress.

On my part I have asked experts to make a study of the classical type of "menaidi" and "lampare" as used in the zone and in the Golf of Gaeta; I have had designs made and a model

has also been built, every thing was submitted for examination to the fishermen who had given their approval and were looking forward for their realization at the earliest possible moment.

In view of these facts I have provided for the creation of a proper and special department, as I possessed a considerable number of machinery in my docks, with specialized labour, for the construction of that kind of vessels in series. I am able to produce with each of those series 18 vessels, with an efficient output as soon as the work has started.

Moreover, should requests by the Government or interested parties be made to increase the output, it would encounter with no difficulty on my part to create other series, limitless in number, for the sake of solidarity, known moreover to those workmen who are expecting, in fact, from me and my dock-yards every support.

According to a study made by my technical experts, naval engineers, it is clearly demonstrated that manual labour could not give an output exceeding three vessels each month, the production becoming thus naturally very costly.

If, on the other hand, with the great number of machinery at my disposal, the processing would be machine made and in series of 18 vessels, the output would be (after termination of the organization) of about 10 vessels each month, and, an appreciable fact also, the price would be one third lower and the waste would about 30% less.

There is no doubt that one should work with machinery and in series; I am ready to provide for sufficient manual labour; the necessary material in my warehouses and depots guarantees absolute continuity of work.

The problem, moreover, cannot be actuated with the use of electric power. As well-known, in the entire zone of Garigliano - where fighting has been going on during nine months - there is lacking electric power and, as H.E. Ruini can confirm it (who takes so much interest in the solution of the frightful problem)

it cannot be obtained according to the most optimistic hypothesis, before six months.

In the meantime, the Allies - and through the intervention of this Office, it could be possible to obtain provisionally (loan) two sets of electrogenerators, one 220/260 watts, 45 frequency, for 40 H.P. capacity; the other 220/260 watts, 45 frequency, for 25 HP capacity, it would be possible to use gang saws on bogie-carriage, band saws, planes, plugs, etc.

I have to specify that the request for the two sets is justified by the circumstance that the docks from two operation centers (processing of large trunks and large saw mills in Montesecco district, and detailed processing and assembling in the Corso Attico locality); one workshop cannot do without the other, whereas the distance between them(about 600 meters) renders the use of one generator only impossible as it would cause a heavy fall of current.

It is understood that the two electric generators would be returned immediately to the Allies as soon as the electric power would reach Gaeta, the dockyard would take charge of their maintenance and use.

I am grateful to the said Office, which takes such an interest in fishery problems, for taking the defence of the above mentioned cause being confident of its success, and should like to express the hope, for my own satisfaction as well that of my experts and workshops, that the Allied Command together with the said Office.

In response to your previous inquiries arrangements have been made to class the electric cable, supplying the hospital, as "preferential".

This will insure better service than has been experienced in the past but it is only proper that state interruptions are apt to occur in the future for varying periods of time.

All power plants and transmission lines, in Central Italy, are being operated to full capacity, with no reserves, with the result that when equipment fails or must be taken out of service for needed repairs large areas of Rome and Central Italy must be disconnected. However military establishments, water pumps, telephone services, hospitals and other important establishments are kept supplied as long as possible and are only disconnected in case of dire emergency.

Everything possible is being done to restore to production the power plants which were deliberately destroyed by the enemy but it will take many months to do it. Power plants which took two and three years to construct originally cannot be rebuilt in the space of a few months.

It is a fact that most of the Ministers and Undersecretaries have to work by candle-light in the evening to do the work they have to get through at home, because of their important charges.

Considering the limited number of these members,

Considering that more than half of them have already obtained the preferential allotment of electric power, and,

Considering the necessity, to my mind, of protecting the dignity of our Ministers,

I think that this solution should be adopted if the Allied Authorities in charge of this control give their approval.

Will you kindly transmit this collective request, which is also a personal request?

As it is well known that in Rome, people dance everywhere, and during the whole night with all the lights on, I think that if the Ministers who are working for their country should also be allotted some light, everybody would have to admit that it is a just thing to do.

The Commissioner of the Azienda Governatoriale, On. ROMITA, wrote to me that the Azienda gave its approval for what concerned my connection, and that he is only waiting for the allied authorization from the Power Allocation Committee.

I shall be most grateful to you if you will see that this authorization is given without delay, for, because of the oncoming winter, it will now be doubly necessary to me, for I have to finish at home the work which I am not able to do in my office.

2. The Director of this Sub-Commission has not requested lighting for the city of Rome but only that the city authorities survey their minimum requirements and submit a request for consideration.
3. For security reasons street lighting is highly desirable.
4. As to priority between street lighting and other establishments of high military and essential civilian priority, this must obviously be decided by the Electricity Control Board.
5. This Sub-Commission can only urge that street lighting is an aid in the control of crime and suggest that conferences be had with the Provost Marshals of Rome on this subject.

As You know, in the Regina Coeli Prison, gravious riot have occurred, which have been made easy by the fact that it was not possible to separate and enclose the rioting prisoners, owing to the breaking of all locks of cellars. Now the Prison has been nearly completely evacuated, and the Civil Engineering Office has been intrusted with renewal of all locks, and works have been committed, according to letter 4383, 25 Nov. inst., to that Society, to Alessandroni Mariano Firm, with workshop in Via dei Riari, 73.

Works are urgent, in order to put the Institute in state of full functioning, but above firm has stated that the supply of locks cannot be performed, owing to lack of industrial electric power.

This stated, we beg that Society, -as Civil Engineering has already asked with above letter - to grant to Alessandroni Firm, electric power, for a period of at least 15 days. (the electric meter is headed: ^{wi 63} Palmèroni Augusto.

We would like to have assurance and we thank very much.
