1. Reference your letter dated 31 January 1946.
2. The Public Works Division of the Industry & Utilities Sub-Commission ceased to function after 1 January 1946.
3. It is our understanding that the Ministry of Public Works has allocated to their Provveditore in each Compartment certain sums of money to be used for Public Works, a part of which is designated for roads and bridges.
4. It is suggested that you contact each Provveditore in your District and ascertain his procedure for carrying out his public works program.
5. Regarding the question of P.O.L. for contractors on roads and bridges of military importance it can best be explained by a letter which we have received from the Fuels Department, Petroleum Division, Industry & Utilities Sub-Commission, a copy of which is enclosed herewith.

1. Information has been received that HQ Allied Commission propose to withdraw the Public Works (Roads) Liaison Officer with the Chief Engineer at this Headquarters with the effect from 15 Jan. 46, according to signal LAMP 9476 dated 20 Dec 45 to Economic Commission, Milan.

2. It is considered that this proposal is premature for the following reasons:

- a) The maintenance of routes of military importance, including such matters as snow clearance and the reconstruction of bridges, must remain a concern of this Headquarters.
- b) Experience has shown that some considerable time must be allowed, after the transfer of territory to the Italian Government, before the civil Road organization can function effectively without military assistance. For example, my Chief Engineer is still actively concerned with such matters as the uncover of, and grant of funds for, road and bridge projects, and the provision of transport and essential materials, in the command of Emilia, which passed to the Italian Government on 15 Nov. 45.
- c) There must therefore, be arrangements for liaison between my Chief Engineer, local *Genio Civile* officials, and the Ministry of Public Works in Rome, which liaison can only be done effectively by an Officer of the Allied Commission.

3. It is therefore requested that approval be given to the retention of the AC Liaison Officer until a recommendation is made from this Headquarters that his services can be dispensed with.

1. Loans of Italian Civil Supplies have been hitherto authorized by individuals concerned in Sub-Commissions on an informal basis to areas under Allied military responsibility, namely Venezia Giulia, Udine and Austria.

2. To make for a positive procedure, therefore, as well as to delegate proper responsibility and the maintenance of records, in the future, no loan whether by ship diversion or otherwise will be made without prior clearing with the Chief, Requisition Branch, Economic Section.

3. It is requested that complete detailed information in the form of a report on all past loans and all past repayments made to date to Venezia Giulia, Udine and Austria be forwarded immediately to Requisition Branch.

4. All future loans to Venezia Giulia, Udine and Austria will be made by submitting the loan in the form of a memorandum, each item being listed individually by weight. A brief paragraph should be included putting forth the loan's justification.

5. The above is to become effective immediately.
