2. Transfer has been completed on these vehicles except for 13 - 3 ton 6x4 lorries and 1 - 15 cwt truck from 409 R.V.P. Our representative has been in frequent contact with 409 R.V.P. and the vehicles are not yet available. Advice was offered by 409 R.V.P. that the remaining vehicles probably will not become available as the existing policy is to service all class 5 vehicles to class 1 which cannot be released under our present authority.

3. As the effective operation of other equipment now available is dependent upon transport it is requested that early authority be granted transferring 13 - 3 ton 6x4 lorries and 1 - 15 cwt truck from some source other than 409 R.V.P. preferably in the Central Italy Area for easier availability.

(A) The following excerpt, taken from report rendered by the A.C. Public Works Officer in Rome, covers the information requested.

1. The following is some of the work, accomplished at Piumicino by Compagnia Marittima:

(a). 40 vessels of various types raised consisting of 29 motor fishing schooners, a dregger, tug and various barges. (I doubt if more progress has been made in any of the ports from Gaeta to Civitavecchia. Most of the fishing schooners have been repaired and are engaged in fishing operations).

(b) All of the work of removal or straightening of piling of the moles that had been displaced into the stream area of the canal has been completed.

(c) The barrage of 9 boats has been destroyed and or removed to afford a navigable depth of 9.5 ft. (as reported by G.C.). The company doing the work reports that the blasting operations have disintegrated and moved the barrage into the deep hole scoured out below some.

(d) All of the swing bridges has been removed from the channel (as reported by G.C.).

(e) Although a limited width of channel has been navigable since December the movement of coal did not start until about the middle of February. Since then Compagnia Marittima have handled over 5200 tons of coal and charcoal at the harbor. The possibilities of use have been greatly restricted due to the capacity of schooners assigned.

(f) The reconstruction of their main lifting unit to 110 tons capacity has been completed and will now be used on the heavier tank barges sunk in the canal.

2. Information has been requested from our Regional Engineers, Toscana Region on the Ports of Pombino, Leghorn, Viareggio and San Stefano. Advice will be forwarded to you immediately after information is available.

Subject: Maintenance of Road Machinery.

To : Chief Engineer, Allied Force Headquarters

1. To effectively maintain and operate the various items of road machinery being made available to Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission on Requisition N°.MGS-180-ENG., for use on highways of Military Priority, it is imperative that a policy be established whereby stores can be requisitioned from Ordnance or other Military Depots.

2. This authority should cover the issue of small tools, maintenance supplies, parts and servicing equipment. It should also permit the responsible representative of the Sub-Commission to borrow from equipment stores such items as prime movers, large trailers and truck cranes for emergency use in equipment movement. These items are not available from other sources. Authority should also be granted for the Sub-Commission to call upon Military Units for emergency repairs for which proper facilities are not available in the field such as welding and major repairs to plant.

3. The basic purpose of the subject policy would be the authority to call upon military Units for only emergency assistance as required and not anticipated. Since the operation of the road machinery will for the present, be restricted to the maintenance of Military

Highways in strict compliance with the desires of Military Districts and Base Sections, it is essential for all concerned that the same or similar assistance be received upon request, as would be available to military organizations functioning in like manner.

1. Authority for the above named civilian to proceed to Rimini was secured from AMG 8th Army by this Headquarters after representation by the Ministry of Public Works that Ing. Lenzi required additions to his staff. We were advised that Ing. Lenzi personally interviewed this man and requested his assignment to his organization.

2. It was intended that Perulli serve in Army capacity required by Ing. Lenzi and his assignment was in no sense a special or privileged one. If his services are not required or if his conduct is objectionable it is suggested that he be directed to return to Rome immediately.
