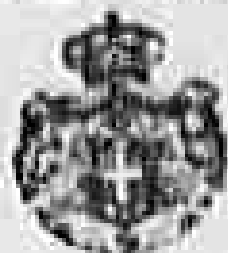

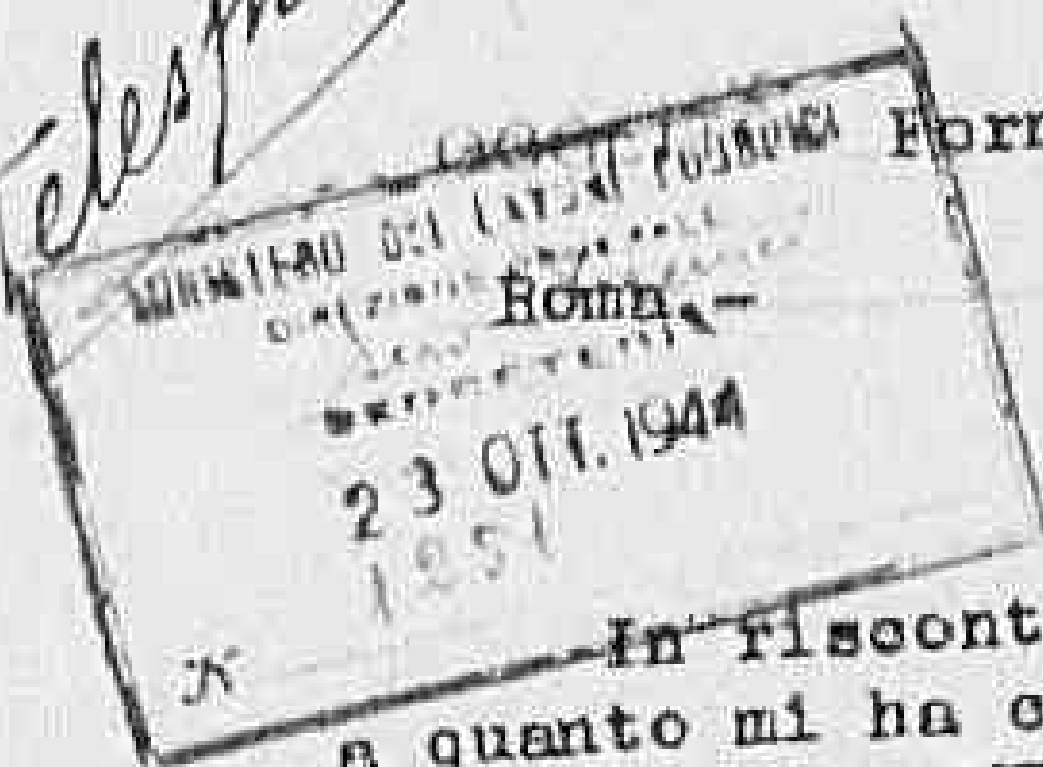

SUBJECT: POL Southern Italy Sicily and Sardinia .

TO : Public Works Utilities Sub/Commission. ✓

1. Your ACC/099 PWU of 19 October 44 refers .
2. Your paragraph 1. The allocations for November are being made by Petsec as it has not been possible to give the Italian Government the necessary figures. They are however going to allocate from Rome to each Province and each category of user in the same way as we have done.
3. Your paragraph 2. The requirements of Contractors working on military account will NOT be included in the Italian Allocations. They will be fed separately into CIF depots but Regional Engineers will have to demand coupons as before from the local licensing authority whose supplies of POL will be augmented accordingly.
4. We understand the Italian Government are setting aside 15 % of the total Petsec Allocation for each area to form a cushion against unforeseen contingencies which would include all but purely military requirements.
5. It is not thought that you should experience any difficulty as the majority of your urgent jobs will be either military or entirely new propositions on which it will be open to ACC to make application for supplementary allocations giving the approval of higher authority for the programmes.

SUBJECT: POL Contractors on Military Account.

TO : Public Works and Utilities Subcommittee
(Attn. Col. Thompson)

1. It is understood you have been having some discussions with Maj. Fagan of Petsee on this subject and that you complained of difficulty being experienced by your Regional Engineers in getting issue of coupons in bulk for their contractors.

2. It is further understood that your Engineers have been applying to S. and T. for these coupons instead of direct to the Local Licensing Authority as laid down in para 3 of POL Instructions No 2 of which a copy is attached for ease of reference.

3. Petsee request that your attention be specially drawn to the necessity for sending a copy of your Engineers' request direct to them so that the supplies may be made available at appropriate CIP depots.

4. It should be noted that, once S. and T., the Army Chief Engineer, have certified their approval of the project as a military one, no further action is necessary on their part, and their certificate is sufficient authority for your Engineers to demand the necessary supplies of POL from the local licensing Authority without troubling S. and T. to issue the demand.

5. Additional supplies of POL Instructions No 2 are available on demand.

POL Supplies for Contractors Employed on Military Projects

1. Civilian contractors employed directly by the Army on Military projects are provided with petrol coupons and drum supplies from civilian stocks which are replenished automatically so that civilian allocations are unaffected.

2. It has now been decided to extend this system to Civilian Contractors employed by ACC/AMG on military projects.

3. Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission will accordingly instruct their Regional Engineers to supply the local licensing authority with a certified schedule in duplicate of these Military projects showing the total monthly POL requirements for each contractor and will send copies directly to Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission, ACC HQ, and to Pet. Sec., HQ AAC.

4. The local licensing authority will issue special coupons in bulk to the total requirements shown. Regional Engineers will be responsible for rationing these out to the contractors in accordance with actual daily needs of the vehicles and will only issue coupons for minimum necessary consumption.

5. Any coupons remaining unissued at the end of the month will be used to reduce the number claimed for the following month.

6. The same system will apply equally in Military Government and Italian Government territory, and ACC/AMG Officers supervising the local rationing authority will see that the new scheme is properly understood. The Italian Government is being advised separately.

7. Steps are being taken to have the special coupons printed. When available, they will be used also for direct issue to contractors employed by the military. Meanwhile the standard coupons will be used.

8. The special coupons will be collected and used by CIP in claiming replacements and one copy of the Engineers Certificate will be supplied to the licensing authority to the ACC/AMG Supply Officer and used by him to claim for replenishment of his civilian stocks. The copy sent direct to Pet. Sec. will serve as advance warning of the quantities likely to be required for the service of these Military projects and as a check against claims for replenishment of stocks by Supply Officers and CIP.

By Order of Captain STONE (USMR):

1. Civilian contractors employed directly by the Army on military projects are provided with petrol coupons and army supplies from civilian stocks which are replenished automatically so that civilian allocations are unaffected.
2. It has now been decided to extend this system to Civilian Contractors employed by AOC/AMG on military projects.

REPORT ON CALCE E CEMENTI DI SESTI COLLEFERRO

SUBMITTED BY CAPT. T.G. Elliott

REPORT The above plant was visited to ascertain the condition of the buildings and machinery prior to the works being handed back to Italian Govt. Control. The works are situated alongside the railway track with sidings direct into the works. Buildings and machinery have been heavily damaged by German demolition squads and also by aerial bombardment, but considerable re-construction work has been carried out by the owners, this reconstruction is continuing.

The plant consists of two separate units :

1) - Hydrated Lime Plant with a normal output of 200 tons/day. This plant has been badly damaged, but one grinding mill out of two units will be repaired in one month's time. Of the 4 silos three are in good condition, one has been completely destroyed.

Of the three limestone kilns, one is in good condition and operable. All elevating and charging gear is in working order. The supply of limestone is brought by teleferica from the firm's own quarry, this conveyor is now in operation.

To operate the plant to full capacity would require 35 tons of coke per day.

2) - Cement Plant with a normal output of 1000 tons/day. The plant has been heavily damaged by German demolitions and by aerial attack, but repair work is progressing well in view of the many difficulties.

The firm estimate that they will be in a position to start producing cement at the rate of 270 tons/day by early January. They are however in a position to start grinding up approx. 6000 tons of clinker & pozzolana immediately a supply of 450 KW to operate 1 grinding mill can be made available, this power will have to be stepped up to 1200 KW by January to enable one rotary cement kiln to be put into operation.

Storage silos, and bag filling gear is in good condition together with a sack making plant, but limited quantities of paper are on hand. Open with

type of bag is produced. The plant for the coating of roofing asphalt covering is in good condition, but only 90 tons of materials is on hand and only 40 tons of this is in sound condition. No suitable asphalt is on hand, but is available at Barietta.

CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) - The extra supply of 450 KW is recommended for operating the grinding mill for cement and hydraulic lime plant.
- 2) - The plant generally is not in good condition but commendable energy has been shown by the firm in carrying out repairs within their means. They will require an allocation of cement out of the first production of the plant to enable them to continue re-habilitation and build a new roof over the rotary kilns.
- 3) - The allocation of 1200 KW to operate the rotary kiln by approx. January 1945 is recommended.
- 4) - The coal supply will be required at the rate of 50 tons/day and is split up in the proportion of 50% Sardinian and 50% lignite. Recommended that bids for the above quantities be submitted.
- 5) - Limestone and Pozzolana are adjacent to the factory and these supplies present no difficulty.

1) - Investigation shows that there are 5000 tons of clinker now available at the plant together with other necessary materials such that 200 tons of cement can be produced each day by making available 700 KW of capacity and 450,000 Kwh of energy per month.

2) - This energy will have to come from the Capreno Plant which is expected to be in operation during the first two weeks in November. The transmission line is now ready to operate.

3) - The present electric supply to Colliferro is not sufficient to carry this new load as the present line is heavily overloaded and is largely used for water pumping purposes for the City of Roma which cannot be reduced.

4) - Since it will take approximately six weeks for the cement plant to get ready for production at Segni and since the Capreno Power Plant will be ready prior to that time it is requested that the Regional Engineer of Lazio-Umbria Region take the necessary steps, through the Military District having jurisdiction, to arrange for the electric supply.

5) - The cement which will be produced from the Segni Plant is needed for the purpose of carrying on the repair works at hydroelectric plants now being rehabilitated in Central Italy and is also urgently needed in connection with road and bridge rebuilding projects in the same area.

6) - The plant will employ about 300 persons.

TO : R.O. Venezia Region.

1. Your R.XII/ES/OIO of 21 October 1944 and R12/ESQ/50.1 enclosed refer.
2. Your Engineering Section have evidently misinterpreted POL Instruction No 2 which works as follows.
3. The Regional Engineer sends a letter to the local licensing authority stating the requirements of the Contractors and requesting coupons which he issues himself to the Contractors in accordance with the actual work to be performed.
4. He must of course certify that they are contractors working on certified military contracts about which Public Works Sub-Commission have issued separate instructions.
5. A copy of his demand must go to Petroleum Section and to HQ Public Works S/C for record purposes.
6. POL so drawn does not count against civilian allocations and is automatically replenished by CIP. Instructions about special coupons will be issued shortly.

TO : Public Works and Utilities Subcommittee
(Attn. Col. Thompson).

1. Region VIII Engineer's RVIII/100/PWU/18 of 15 October 1944 addressed RVIII Supply officer (copy to you) refers.

2. The problem of POL supply to contractors under POL Instruction No 2 is threefold. Firstly the POL has to be made available in the areas where it is wanted and secondly arrangements have to be made for POL actually drawn by such contractors to be accounted for separately from the civilian POL so that civilian allocations do not suffer. Thirdly coupons have to be issued to contractors so that they can draw supplies.

3. When POL Instruction No 3 first came out therefore information was requested on the total monthly requirements for this category of user so that Petsec could have a general idea as to the size of the problem which had, up to that date, not been under very close control resulting in Civilian Stocks running short etc. This information has served its purpose and need not be repeated.

4. POL Instruction No 2 however lays down, and it is essential, that Petsec have a day to day record of all POL allocations to these contractors. It is provided by copies of Regional Engineers demands on the local licensing offices for the issue of coupons either in bulk or otherwise.

5. It is primarily a matter for Public Works and Utilities Subcommittee to decide on details and to instruct their Engineers accordingly since Commerce Subcommittee corresponds only with Regional Supply (and occasionally Transport) offices. It has however been assumed that Regional Engineers would make their own arrangements direct with the local licensing office (via Regional Supply and Transport officer as necessary) for the issue of coupons.

6. Whilst it is appreciated that fresh projects will be added from time to time, or even in batches as Regions take

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- 2 -

(1) over new territory, it will obviously be convenient if Regional Engineers submit their requirements at one time, so far as possible, and, if the coupons are to be issued to them in time for re-issue to contractors for the following month, the requirements should be in the hands of the licensing authority by the 10th of the month previous.

7. It is NOT however necessary for the licensing authority or the Regional Supply to include these in his monthly bid as Petsec will automatically make provision for the necessary supplies and accounting.

- 1 - Your RVIII/15.10 dated 9-Oct.-44
- 2 - The following points are raised for clarification

Is it to be understood from your letter that we are to send the certified lists to you each month, and that you will send them to the "local licensing authority" and other offices, vide ACC Economic Section POL Instruction n° 2 of Aug. 14 or is this office to carry out the provisions of that order so as to get the coupons on which the POL is obtained from CIN by the individual contractors.

According to the letter ACC/5087/OMX dated 18 Aug. 44 it was stated that the certified schedules are the only bids required, and also that the "local licensing authority" will issue coupons for the minimum requirements substantiated by certified requests from Military Units or ACC/AMC Engineers.

From the above you will appreciate that it is not yet possible for me to give details of the requirements for military needs during next November at this stage, nor can we

duplicate the October requirements, because it is quite possible that by that time further Provinces (AREZZO, FIRENZE, PISTOIA, LUCCA) will be out of the Army Area, and therefore the POL requirements for military contracts in those provinces (some of which are already in hand) will no longer be available from Army stocks.

I shall be glad if you let me know when I may expect the coupons for this month, so that I may arrange distribution to the contractors, and also if I am to carry out the procedure of sending the certified lists to RACI and other offices mentioned in Instruction No 2.

a) that there is a contract between the applicant and AOC

b) that the payments made under the contract by AOC are made from War Department funds.

4. If, however, payment is made out of Italian public or governmental funds, then the contractor is not deemed to be working for military account, but, for the Italian national account. Whether or not the work done is on military priority or not.

5. So that you may be informed as to the correct method of application, a copy of Command Directive Order No. 95/44, issued by SAC, is attached hereto.

6. The employing service for the purposes of the application will be the department of the AOC concerned.

7. It is pointed out that this HQ is not in a position to screen effectively these applications. It is, therefore, the duty of the employing service, both under the terms of the application and in the interests of economy, to ensure that only the minimum amounts of petroleum products are issued to the contractors to enable them to fulfill adequately the contracts which they hold.

SUBJECT: Gasoline for Public Works in Regions.
TO : Lt. Col. V. S. Thompson.

1. When you get to Rome will you immediately contact the D.W. at A.A.I. and see what can be done to allocate gasoline requirements for public works to each Regional Engineer so that he may distribute this gasoline as may be required.

2. At the present time Petroleum Section of A.A.I. allocates certain quantities of gasoline to the CIP (Compagnia Italiana Petroli). This Italian company distributes the gas to various pumps located in the Regions in accordance with allocations to these Regions. The Regions themselves have no means of distributing gasoline as they do not possess any tank trucks.

3. In many instances it is necessary for contractors working on highways or other public works projects to travel many unnecessary miles to the nearest gasoline station in order to obtain gasoline, thus consuming gasoline and rubber which could be avoided if a different system were adopted. These gasoline stations are usually located in larger communities or provincial capitals. However, public works are spread all over the country.

4. Some time ago we discussed this problem with the D.W. at Caserta and the suggestion was made at that time we might be able to receive gasoline in drums and with the use of a small hand-pump distribute gasoline to contractors by establishing gasoline dumps at points nearest to where highway projects etc. may be in progress.

5. I have just been advised that in Region III they have been unable to get gasoline for public works because of the fact that the gasoline quota for the month had been exhausted with possibly private consumers getting their share first. Col. Hensley also stated that he had to borrow 10 gallons of gasoline to get some workers out on the road and bring them back in the evening.

6. This is an extremely important problem and should be straightened out with A.A.I. so that we will have a more economical system of distribution and that we will be assured of gasoline for our principal highway projects.

Built in 1939 on modern principles, and not actually completed (as one complete rotary furnace on the spot has yet to be assembled). Commenced operations in 1941 at about half capacity i.e. 200 tons. Clinker equals 240 tons Cement per day - say 75000 tons cement per annum.

A railway siding was projected from Guidonia Station - 25 Km. from Rome - but never started. The factory is a good 2 Km. from the station motor transport was used.

The reason for siting the factory at Guidonia seems to have been that it is adjacent to limestone and clay quarries on the one hand within easy reach of Rome - which then offered a great market with its building programme and its projected 1942 Exhibition. Power was transmitted from Ceprano or Terni via Tivoli.

To these vanished expectations is now to be added the inconvenience of transporting some 15,000 tons Coal from the coast and 2500 tons of gypsum from Torre dei Passeri near Pescara. The necessary 12000 tons of pozzolana came from some 9 Km. away.

In case the plant is considered a working proposition owing to shortage of cement, the following additional information is given:

Of the necessary fuel (about 20% of the clinker) the last composition was:

3/5 ths. Silesian Coal 6500 Cal.
1/5 th. Coke from Rome
1/5 th. Lime Lignite - 4500 cal. (Nr. Carzana)

Minimum production could be 140 tons per day of clinker, requiring about 200,000 Kw per month (2 days per week.)

Workmen employed - 150. Only 25 now employed on maintenance.

The new rotary furnace would require some 6 months to instal - and the presence of the Smid technician from Denmark to do it. 2770

CONCLUSIONS:

In view of its unsatisfactory position it would seem preferable to consider this factory for what it has - as a store from which to put into operation better-sited factories - rather than re-activate it. If this cannibalisation were done discretely the value of the factory in normal times would not be affected.

Without going into details which can be found in the firm's inventory, it has belt, motors, compressors, a complete furnace, a very heavy inventory in fact of everything necessary to a large modern plant. Inter alia it has a stock of 150,000 bags - and of products only 1800 tons Cement and 2500 tons unground clinker - some 70,000 bags to spare in any case.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The inventory book was not taken from the factory, it will be needed there. There is a copy in the office in Via S.Basilio 19, Roma, and it should be secured.

This inventory should be gone through by the Local Resources Section - together with DDW, AAI, and the Engineering Section - who can finally decide:

- a) Whether the plant should be activated
- OR
- b) Kept closed and its stocks used elsewhere.
