SUBJECT : P.O.L. Supplies for Contractors on Military Projects.
TO : Regional Supply Officer
TOSCANA Region.

1. Ref. your R/VIII/15.10. of 9.Oct.44 to Regional Engineer and reply thereto.

2. Having been present at the discussion with Col. EYLES, my observations on the points raised by the Regional Engineer may be of assistance.

3. Col. EYLES stated that it was essential that the estimated monthly requirements and details, so far as it is possible to ascertain, must reach Pet. Sec. H.Q. AAI. by the 10th of the month preceding that for which required. Letter Commerce S/C., ACC/5087/Com. of 15 Aug. 44 refers.

4. In view of the conditions which exist, and the frequent changes of policy, necessitating continual alteration of Road and Bridge priorities it is not possible to make forward estimate of three weeks or more with any degree of accuracy. It would assist if a bulk amount to cover emergency demands could be included in the schedule. This is not possible at the present in view of POL. Instruction No.2 requiring a schedule of Military projects and P.W.& U. Sub-Commission instruction that details of Contractors vehicles be shown (Ref. letter to Reg.Engrs. ACC/099/PWU of 19.Aug. 44).

5. POL. required for Contractors, who have been started on projects of urgent Military Priority between the 10th of a month and the end of the following month will therefore not be included. Col. EYLES stated that this situation would be met by the submission of a supplementary indent distributed to the offices as mission of the monthly one. On receipt of this indent Pet.Sec. H.Q. AAI. would give the necessary authority for the supplies to be brought forward. In the meantime the Contractor would be issued with the special coupons and could draw from CIP existing stocks in the normal way. He also intimated that CIP. should hold a supply over and above the monthly requirements to meet emergency demands.

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6. Col. EYLES was emphatic that there was no shortage of supplies and that authority was always given for sufficient to meet requirements. The governing factor, he stated, was transport and that CIP. would have to be given assistance if necessary from Military or ACC. sources, to bring forward supplies to meet such demands.

The military authorities are continually increasing the number of projects they wish us to carry out, and therefore the quantities are likely to be greatly increased at short notice.

1. Reference conversation at this unit H.Q. on 30 Sept '44.
2. It has been reported by A.C.C. Region VIII that petrol is not available for contractors now engaged on work recently commenced, as a matter of urgency, on Route 2.
3. The A.M.G. Supply Officer, ALMA PROVINCE, has stated that, the October demands having already been submitted to Army, petrol cannot be made available until November.
4. The matter was discussed with Major Hyland, of Public Works and Utilities Sub Commission A.C.C., who promised to see what could be done but was not at all optimistic.
5. In the meantime, the work is very seriously delayed and it will be appreciated if you will kindly endeavour to have additional petrol made available.

Subject: Petroleum Products.

To : Regional Engineer Officer, Region VIII.

1. Reference your letter RVIII/100/PWU/18 of 14 Aug.
2. Para. 1(a) Efforts are being made by Pet. Sect. AAI (not AFHQ) to advance the date of their allotments. Your comments are therefore concurred in. I am informed by Major Fegan that as soon as a surplus can be built up with C.I.P. all releases will be honored. So far this has not been possible with the result that unforeseen demands must be taken from current allotments.
3. Para. 1(b) Major Fegan has already made arrangements for September supplies of petrol to Grosseto Province but it must be explained that all of this is not for agriculture or your work will be impossible. See Lt. Col. Smallwood, Supply Officer, Grosseto. Diesel and kerosene dumps are at Piombino.
4. Para. 1(c) Agreed; forecasts can only be based on available information and judgement.
5. Para. 1(d) I am informed by Major Fegan that supplies of PCL are already being sent to Grosseto. The procedure is as follows:-
Obtain release from P.B.F. to C.I.P (Ref. Admin. Instr. No 11)
C.I.P. then sells to contractors up to limit of allotment.
There is a C.I.P. drawing station at the end of the pipeline at Saline (695375) which should simplify matters for bridge contractors.
