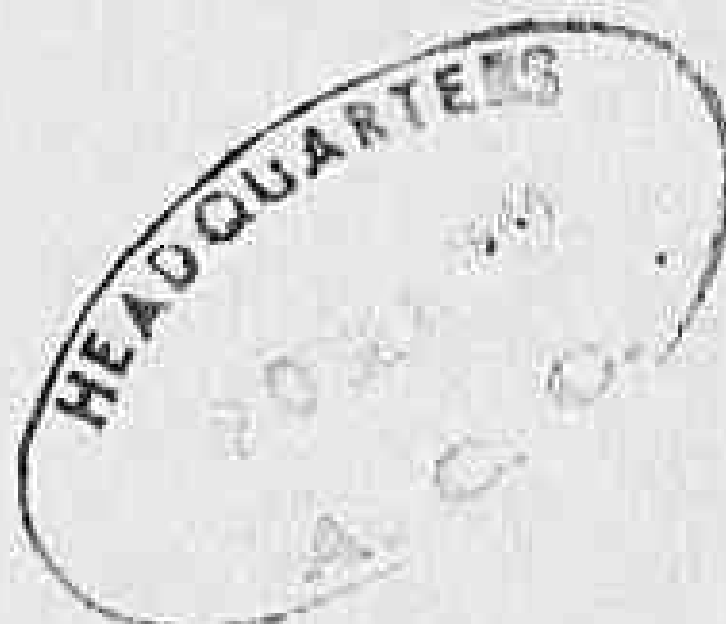

I have been requested by the Director General Tizzano to approve a project for rebuilding the bridge in the town of Cosenza.

As this is not of prior importance to the war effort and requires considerable quantities of cement, it was turned down, quite rightly, by Major Chamberlin.

You will however be amused to know that this project is in the realm of political engineering, it happens in other places occasionally, Cosenza being the home town of the Minister of Public Works. Consequently I would like you to ask Major Chamberlin to change his mind in view of the following:

- (a) Work cannot be started seriously until spring on account of flood danger.
- (b) Cement will not be available from civilian stocks via MAT:10 unless a miracle happens.

What they do when ^{the} spring comes will not keep me awake or hope you either.

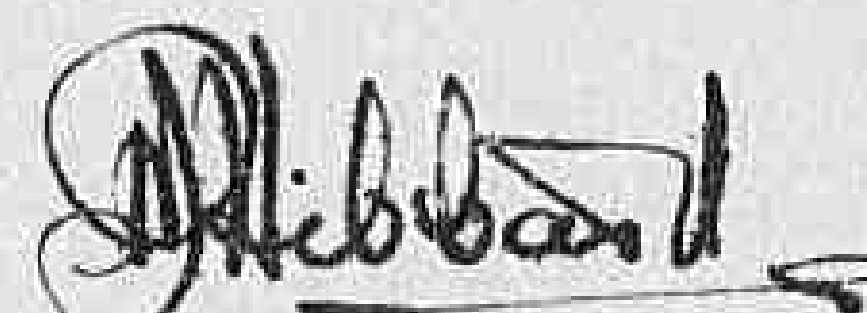

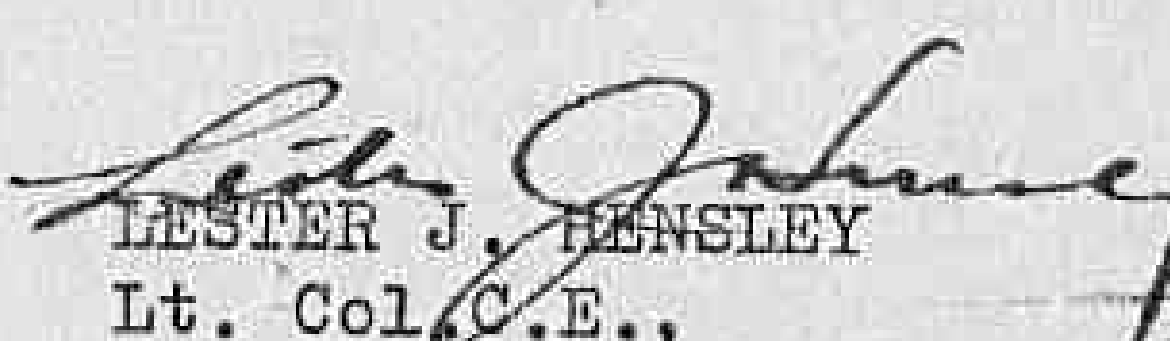

Works of Road Maintenance and Reconstruction of Bridges suggested by Lt. Desiderio of Eighth Army which have not yet been paid.

As requested by Lt-Col Hensley, Chief Sub-Com. Public Works and Utilities, Section VII, ordered the following estimates relative to works laid on by Lt. Desiderio of Eighth Army which have to be financed. After Lt. Desiderio had been transferred by other location the allocations of funds have not been obtained while the works were continuing as requested by Lt. Desiderio.

A. Works executed at the direction of the AASS of Caserta.

- (i) Payment of wages from 15 June to 15 August 1944 on Route No 6, 85 + 87.
- (ii) Reconstruction of Bridges of Km 80 + 150, and 80 + 900 on Route No 87.
- (iii) Reconstruction of Bridges at Km 82 + 760, and 80 + 800 on Route 87.
- (iv) Reconstruction of Bridges at Km 89 + 775, 90 + 325, and 90 + 850 on Route 87.

B. Works executed by the Technical Prov. office of Benevento under the supervision of the Genio Civile of Benevento.

- (1) Repairs to various Provincial roads.

The total amount to be financed is of L. 3,505,000 of which L. 2,005,000 should be allocated to the AASS of Caserta and L. 1,500,000 to the office of the Genio Civile di Benevento which will see that the Technical Provincial office will execute the payments.

Details on the disposal of L. 2,500,000 will be furnished as requested by the organization financing the works.

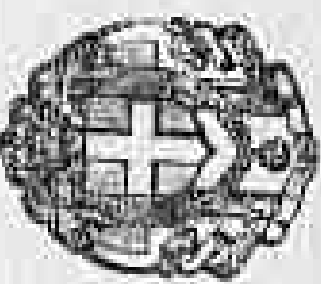
I assure that all works of Road Maintenance will be stopped till other type of estimates have been approved, while, the reconstruction of bridge will proceed as the materials are available and it is desired that they be completed by the coming fall.

1. At approximately 0800 hours 28 July, 1944, an unfortunate accident occurred on the beach at Mercatello at the southernmost point of Salerno Rest Camp, as a result of which two Italian Civilians were killed, five injured, and Chevrolet Lorry No. 4724223 was seriously damaged.

2. The circumstances leading up to the accident were as follows :

The lorry was one allocated to Sig. ANGELO NOTARI, of Baronissi, a contractor engaged in Military Highway repairs within Salerno Province. It appears that for the past six weeks or so, each morning a party of Notari's workmen have been taken by lorry to the beach referred to above, there to load the lorry with sand and gravel.

This procedure was followed yesterday morning; the lorry was traversing the usual route, when an undiscovered German beach mine exploded beneath the lorry causing the casualties and damage stated above.

3. It is to be noted that all this area had previously been "swept" for mines and was considered clear. In fact the site of the mine which exploded was actually within three yards of one of the tents occupied by an engineer unit employed on works in Salerno Rest Camp.

4. Statements before witnesses were taken at my direction and in my presence, from the driver of the vehicle, who was uninjured, and also from two of the workmen present, in case the need for such statements should arise.

5. Further relevant statements are being furnished to me by the Officer Commanding the Engineer Unit encamped on the site of the accident.

6. From the investigations I have been able to make, it does not appear that blame can be attached to anyone for this accident, since it would appear that there are still undiscovered mines in certain areas which have been declared free of mines.

7. The damaged lorry is in the process of being evacuated to CAVA garage, where a complete assessment of the damage will be made.

8. Your observations and instructions are awaited.

1. The three prospective warehouses were visited, Castel Nuovo was rejected on account of the difficulty of access. Excelsior Garage was rejected because of the impossibility of getting trucks while loaded into the space.

2. The space under the Auto Strada in back of the Silk factory would be acceptable for storage of newsprint paper but considerable work will have to be done. To make this into a warehouse for one commodity for civilian use will require the completion of the wall 10' x 250' in length with 3 windows, a wall 20' x 225' with 3 doors of sufficient width to permit entry of large rolls of paper. An approach road will have to be graded and the floor graded.

The approach roadway will be acceptable in dry weather as the material paves wall. It is assumed that the temporary bridge at west end of the space will remain in place.

No waterproofing will be necessary on the viaduct except to repair one expansion joint. There are no indications of water seeping through the viaduct.

This will provide storage for 500 tons of newsprint. Addition of space will have to be found for the other commodities.

(Public Works & Utilities)

1. Exports of materials and goods from Region 3 for official account (i.e. exports of purchases made by ACC on behalf of Allied Services overseas), and imports of supplies other than food (which are handled direct by Food Sub-Comm.) are assuming big proportions. The E&S Division of Region 3 have already reported to you their material difficulties in coping with the demands which are being made on them in this direction. These difficulties are of three kinds: Personnel, Finances and Warehouses.

Personnel.

The question of personnel, it is believed, is being considered by you separately.

Finances.

A co-ordinated directive is awaited covering the financing of these exports and fixing the extent of the Region's powers to draw funds from AFA for making relative payments.

Warehouses.

Directions have been received verbally from Captain Talbot to present to you in a precise form the Region's needs for warehouse space. These requirements, so far as it is possible to gauge them at the present time, are as follows:

Newsprint	500 tons.	This space has been secured and is already in use (Depot No. 1254 situated at No. 81 Via Bologna).
Hemp	400 tons.	It is estimated that 506 tons of hemp will be held in Naples awaiting shipment, and that as soon as one shipment has been cleared, the quantity will be made up to the original 400

tons from main stocks at Prattamaggiore. A first shipment has already left and provisional accommodation is being held for the next one in a flour mill. It is clearly undesirable to immobilize a flour mill for this purpose but owing to lack of other accommodation, there is no alternative at the present time.

Vegetable Seeds ...	50 tons.
Rope	40 tons.
Wrapping Paper and Nails	20 tons.
Reserve Space	430 tons.
Total	1000 tons.

- To provide this additional warehouse space for 1000 tons, an area of 3,600 square feet is needed. This allows for storage on ground floor only. If a two-story building is used, only one-half this area will be called for, but it will be necessary to have at least one freight elevator in the building.
- A new warehouse or one that has been repaired will meet requirements equally well.
- The storeroom/rooms should be inclosed on all sides in view of the valuable nature of most of the contents.
- Location: A site in the vicinity of the present Regional newsprint warehouse (Via Bologna) would be the most suitable.

We consider it necessary to inform the above Command of the following:

From 1940-1941 our firm has carried out and finished fortification works for the Alpine Wall in localities near Tarvisio (Udine). To direct these works we sent out at the time Ing. Guglielmo Gambardella. He acted as procurator of the firm; but with power of attorney limited to the execution and the book-keeping of the works entrusted us in the region of Tarvisio by the XIV Army Corps with headquarters in Treviso.

Once the work was ended all our building-yard equipment endowed with many machines, tools and varied material remained in Tarvisio. Several of our dependants took it in turn to watch over it; until at the time of the Allied attack on Sicily, Mr. Salvatore Capozzi arrived in Tarvisio. Then, when the fighting started near Naples, Ing. Gambardella, who had some time previously returned to the headquarters of our firm, asked and obtained permission to rejoin his family at Carrara, where it had transferred itself to from Naples. He left the 1st days of September 1943 with the recommendation on our part to do his utmost if events of war were hindering communications between the north and our firm's headquarters, to watch over our interests, always regarding the industrial activity carried out in the Tarvisio region, besides watching over our equipment stored there.

Having made this clear we wish to state that news reached us now causes us deep concern as being in complete contrast to the moral and political aims which we pursue above every economical and industrial interest. The news has reached us through Mr. Capozzi, who found himself in Rome at the moment of his liberation and is now in Naples since Saturday June 24th. He has related to us that Ing. Gambardella, coming from Carrara, rejoined him in Tarvisio last November and with 20 railroad trucks conceded by the German Authorities at his disposal, he loaded and transferred to Borgo a Mozzano (Lucca)

the equipment existing there, declaring to this same Mr. Capozzi that he would begin new works of fortification in that locality under the German Military Authorities. These works were to be started that same November 1943. After the departure of the last truck, Mr. Capozzi - his task being ended - left for Rome.

We set forth all this so that it should be known that the use of our equipment in the service of the enemy is against our will and that Ing. Gambardella, who held a very limited power of attorney and anyway exclusively for the works in the Tarvisio region, has with this transfer of the equipment and activity to Borgo a Mozzano, exceeded the limits of his mandate. As however we know from 45 years that is from when he was taken into our service, his moral and political ideas and sentiments, we are entitled to think that he has been obliged by circumstances - or rather more likely still by personal motives - to place himself at the service of the enemy. As however, we do not know what such circumstances may have been, we think it our duty to separate our responsibility from the one which our dependant eventually may have taken upon himself, directly and personally beyond every mandate, or rather in opposition to the one received.
