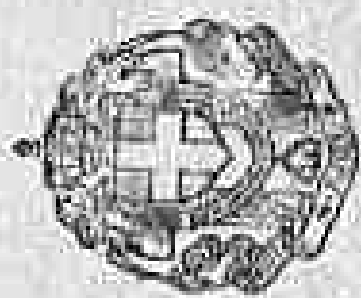

SUBJECT : STORES "DUMPS" IN VENEZIA ORIENTALE.

TO : REGIONAL ENGINEER.

On the occasion of my recent visit to CALDONAZZO (Province of TRENTO), for the purpose of collecting bitumen allotted to this Region, I observed that the "dump" in which the bitumen was lying contained also large quantities of various other materials which would be of great value in the execution of Italy's present reconstruction programme. There were, for example, large quantities of structural steel sections, mild steel round bars for reinforced concrete, bricks, drums of heavy electric cables (lead sheathed), cast iron and bronze hydraulic fittings, meters, pumps, glazed earthenware sanitary fittings, and so on.

The "dump" was guarded by a Unit of the Gruppo Combattimento Friuli, and sentries continually patrolled the ground; but, after having observed the "dump" over a period of a week, I have good reason to believe that many of the stores were nevertheless disappearing.

It was perfectly evident to me, during the week that I was there, that many of the sanitary fittings were wantonly destroyed in that time, and I also have the impression that many of them were taken away, though I cannot vouch for that. I am inclined to attribute the destruction to ill-conceived sport on the part of the sentries, who, being under orders to fire their rifles periodically, probably preferred to select valuable targets, rather than discharge their arms harmlessly.

A week of contact with the locality also revealed that soldiers of the responsible Unit appeared to be able to spend money with extraordinary liberality, and many could be seen feeding like fighting cocks in the local inns, either in preference to, or in supplementation of, their army messing. Although this proves nothing it induces me to draw a rather obvious conclusion.

Also during my stay I observed extensive new trenches in the fence between the "dump" and the adjoining lane.

A Staff Officer of the Gruppo Combattimento Friuli informed me that 168 stores "dumps" were under its care and that the particular one with which I was acquainted was one of the smallest of them. He painted a vivid word picture of the vast quantity of stores that they contained. All these stores are probably suffering from theft, damage, deterioration and other forms of loss, and, moreover, are lying idle at a time when they are badly needed.

I venture to recommend that this matter be represented to the Allied Military Authorities concerned (presumably No. 2 District), asking that arrangements be made for immediate inspection by expert engineers, for the preparation of inventories, and for the early allocation and distribution of the materials in order that they may be advantageously and economically absorbed in Italy's rehabilitation.

1. In the monthly report of the Regional Engineer of Piemonte Region the following extract is quoted :

" MATERIALS

Due to speculation in materials, these are difficult to find and prices are not definitely known. Also much confusion exists due to the activities of the Committees now existing at Milan. The office of the Genio Civile was not represented when these committees were formed. They represent Industry and Commerce. These Committees have tried to block the flow of materials to the projects now under reconstruction. This blocking action should be resisted as it tends to force materials in the Black Market, increase contract costs due to uncertainty and delay construction program.

Additional bitumen is being received in small lots, but not sufficient for all the work necessary on State Roads."

2. It is requested that an investigation^{to} determine whether materials are being manipulated to benefit certain districts or kinds of work to the detriment of others.

COPYREMARKS CONCERNING THE DECREE OF FREEZING OF MATERIALS

1. Distribution on behalf of Allied Armed Forces
- We think that the system, proposed in the request, for Class I, through the Ministry of Industry, and for Class II, through the Provincial Trade Offices, is not admissible.
 - * The very nature of works carried out by the Allied Armed Forces does not admit either delays in collection or losses of time in the allotment.
 - In order to avoid this, it should be sufficient to state that the Armed Forces let it be known month by month their requirements and the producing plants from which they intend to withdraw the materials.
 - The Ministry of Industry should give notice of the said requirements to the producers, and, for knowledge, to the Trade Provincial Offices.
 - The remaining quantities would remain at the disposal of the Ministry of Industry for the distribution, as per the following Paragraph No 2.
2. Distribution to the undertakings depending on the Italian Administrations and to the merchants.
- As it has been stated the requests for allocations should run as follows :
 - From the applicant to the Provincial Office of Commerce and Labour.
 - From the Provincial Offices of Commerce and Labour to the Ministry of Industry, and from this to the Provincial Office.
 - From this: (to the applicant
to the supplier
 - Considering the difficulty of mail communications and the time necessary for the preliminary inquiries by the Provincial Offices, and the one needed by the Central Allocating Commission, it is foreseen that it will take at least two months to know the result of the applications.
 - It is also remarked that that, while the works which should have the priority in the allocations are those executed for account of the State Administrations, no validation of the quantities requested in the applications, is required from the Technical Directing Offices

On the other hand, owing to the limited production in comparison with the needs, it is evident that only the responsible State Administrations are able to arrange the execution of works in connection with the output of the production itself. It appears from what has been set forth above, that the agencies best fit for taking care of the allocations would be the State Administrations, for account of which the works are executed. In other words, it is proposed that the Commission to be set up by the Ministry of Industry, should be intrusted only with the distribution of materials to the aforesaid Administrations, allocating to every one a global monthly share (quota). Each Administration should then distribute the said quota to the Provincial Offices under it, and these to the Undertakings.

Substantially it is proposed:

- 1.) That the Ministry of Industry, having deducted the requirements to be foreseen for the Allied Governments, should distribute monthly the materials to the following Administrations :

- a) Ministry of Public Works
- b) " " Communications
- c) " " Agriculture
- d) " " War
- e) " " Marine
- f) " " Air Forces
- g) " " Industry (for the industrial plants and for the merchants, for the maintenance)

Every Administration will provide, on his own account, to collect the proposals of the Offices under it, and will distribute the allocated quota to the various Offices, in connection with the more urgent works, giving immediate notice to the Offices, which, in turn, will make the allocations for the works, and will issue the invoices on behalf of the Undertakings, forwarding copy of them to the producers.

We do not deem it necessary that the invoices pass through the Provincial Offices of Industry and Commerce : it would be a useless loss of time.

At the most, only for statistical purposes, copy of the invoices could be sent to these Offices.

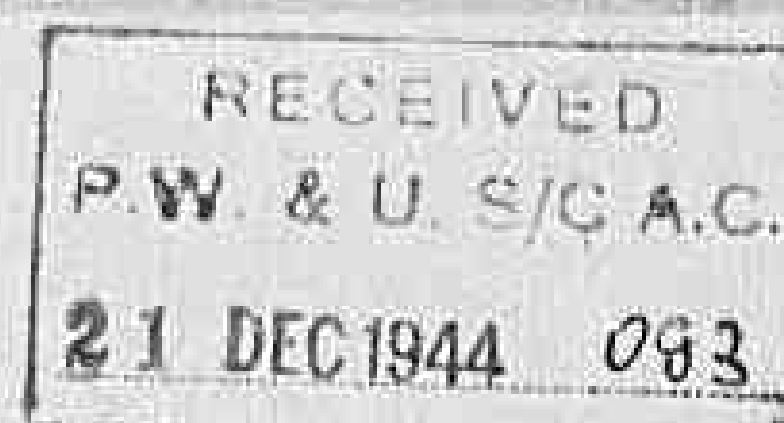
The circulation would be reduced as follows :

- a) Transmission of the global monthly proposals from the Provincial Technical Offices to the central Administrations concerned.

- b) Return of proposals from these to the Offices, with the decisions of the Administrations.
- c) Issue of the invoices from these Offices, within the limits of the allocations received, with the directions of priorities to be considered, delivery to the Undertakings and transmission to the producers, and, for information, to the Provincial Offices of Commerce and Industry.

Besides this, in order that the deliveries can actually be effected, it would be necessary that, in stating the quota, even the producers that should deliver the amounts are pointed out. This work could be easily done by the Central Commission, which has all the informations on this subject.

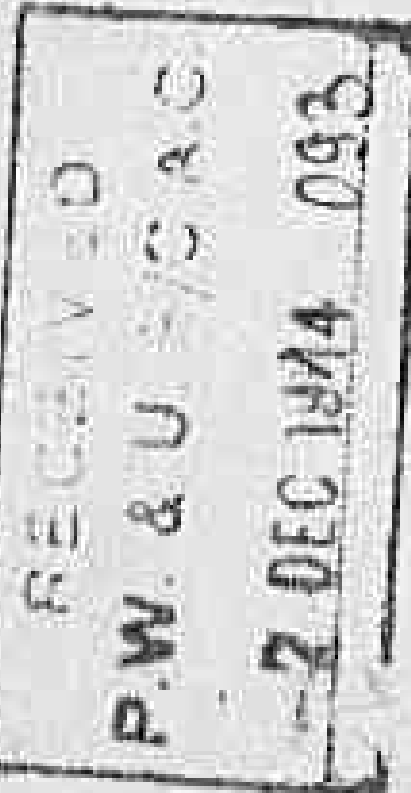

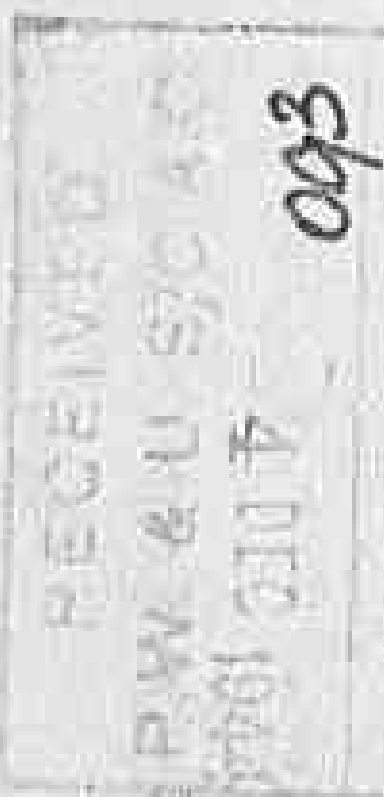

We are in receipt of a copy of the above named communication and wish to offer the following comments :-

1. Arrangements should be made at this Headquarters for distribution of lists received and this list of distribution should include the Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission.
2. Paragraph 5 states that "if in the event purchaser does not acquire within five (5) days of date of Allied Commission endorsement to basic letter, material will be sold on open market". As we have had considerable experience with such matters, we know that five days is entirely inadequate time to permit anyone to arrange for and proceed to the location where the material is, to claim it. This should be changed to a minimum of fourteen days or preferably twenty days. With our transportation problem as it is, we feel that this is essential and the change should be requested.

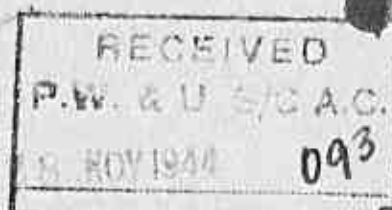

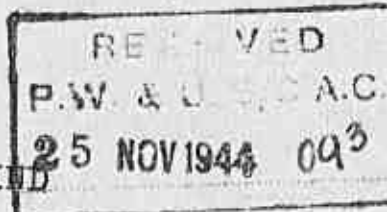

1. Several days ago, Dr. R.S. Opatowski of the Industry Sub-Commission reported that a large quantity of electrical materials were contained in a train of railway cars, wrecked near Tivoli.

2. Subsequent to Dr. Opatowski's report, a civilian engineer of the Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission visited the site of the wreck, and found the railway cars piled in a ravine. He learned that the electrical material is claimed by the Società Cartiere Meridionali, a paper mill at Isola del Liri. The only pieces of electrical material which were found, which might of possible interest to this Sub-Commission were the two halves of a generator stator, apparently rated at 1.000 KVA. The rotor was not located in the wreckage.

3. This Sub-Commission recognizes the desirability of early salvage of this material. However, in consideration of the facts that the equipment is not intact, that it is of relatively small capacity, and that supervisory personnel to follow such a project is, and for some time will be fully occupied on other work, it is regretted that no assistance can be given by this Sub-Commission at this time toward the recovery of this material.-
