Come Vi è noto, nei mesi di giugno e luglio 1944, mentre la ns/ officina del gas di Via Ostiense era inattiva per i danneggiamenti prodotti dai bombardamenti aerei, codesto Alto Comando di spose la consegna del carbone giacente nel parco fossile dell'officina a diversi Enti, quali le Aziende Elettriche, Alberghi ecc.

Infatti, con ordine in data 29 giugno 1944, fra gli altri, il Capo della Sezione Elettricità e Meccanica, Maggiore H.J. Rosson, disponeva la consegna di tonn. 500 di fossile alla Azienda Comunale Elettricità e Acqua ACEA, per il funzionamento di emergenza delle sue centrali termiche. Lo stesso ordine, che si allega in copia, disponeva che il fossile doveva essere caricato nel giorno 30 e seguenti su camions dell'Armata Americana. Ora dai registri e bollettini di consegna della ns/ Società risulta che nei giorni 30 giugno, 1 - 3 - 4 luglio furono caricati sui camions dell'Armata Americana, con destinazione all'A.C.E.A., le seguenti partite di fossile:

tonn. 94,300 - 405,600 - 54,900 - 67,400 = T. 622,200

Caricati gli automezzi e usciti dall'officina, essendo i medesimi guidati e accompagnati da militari alleati, la ns/ Società non aveva evidentemente nessuna veste per controllare se effettivamente il fossile veniva consegnato all'ACEA o ad altri, tanto più che l'Autorità Alleata aveva la facoltà di dirottare i carichi secondo le esigenze contingenti.

Per questo motivo la ns/ Società, pur non avendone conferma, non ebbe alcun dubbio sulla destinazione della merce e, avendo a tempo debito stilato la fattura a carico dell'ACEA non si preoccupò, stante i correnti rapporti con la medesima, della loro immediata regolarizzazione. Solo nel luglio 1946, dopo ripetute inda-

gini presso i vari servizi, l'ACEA comunicava di aver ricevuto precedentemente al 30 giugno 1944 diverse partite di fossile provenienti dalla ns/ officina ma che non aveva però mai ricevuto le partite su citate anche se erano originariamente destinate ad essa dall'ordine del Maggiore Rosson.

Questa dichiarazione ha vivamente sconcertato e preoccupato la ns/ Società che ha dovuto intraprendere indagini per conoscere la effettiva destinazione del fossile mancante e così dopo non poco si poté sapere che tonn. 161,100 erano state consegnate alla Soc. Romana di Elettricità per il funzionamento delle sue centrali termiche.

Risultano però tuttora mancanti le rimanenti tonn. 461,100 e qui le possibilità di indagine della ns/ Società incontrano ovviamente insormontabili difficoltà.

Da quanto sopra risultano inoppugnabili i seguenti punti:

- 1) Le 622,200 tonn. di fossile sono state consegnate ai camions condotti da militari americani a seguito di ordine dell'A.C.C. -
- 2) E' dimostrato che parte del quantitativo di cui sopra, pur essendo destinato dall'ordine del Maggiore Rosson All'ACEA, è stato effettivamente consegnato alla S.R.E.
- 3) E' quindi possibile che anche il residuo quantitativo sia stato consegnato ad altri Enti essendo ciò, come è dimostrato dal suddetto avvenuto dirottamento, nella piena facoltà dell'Autorità Militare Alleata che ha proceduto al ritiro.
- 4) E' ovvio che la ns/ Società non ha nè veste nè facoltà nè possibilità di poter venire direttamente a conoscenza della definitiva destinazione delle suddette partite che destinate all'origine all'ACEA, ma da questa non ricevute, sono state, si ripete, consegnate a automezzi dell'Armata Americana.

Conseguentemente questa Società si vede costretta a rivolgersi a codesto Alto Comando pregando di voler fare indagini per conoscere a quale Ente sia stata fatta la consegna delle suddette partite.

Nel caso che codesto Alto Comando non si trovi ora nella possibilità di fornire le su richieste informazioni, essendo in ogni caso esclusa qualsiasi colpa della ns/ Società nell'accaduto, ci permettiamo di richiedere, in via eccezionale, l'emissione di un regio-

I have received a substantial claim from a civilian MICCIOTTI FILOMENA, Via Fiorentina N°2, Borgo San Lorenzo for damage to her property at Battoria del Foggio di Sopra and the loss of 21 vines, 21, poplars, 4 olive trees, 1 pear and 1 cherry tree.

The work was carried out from 23 April 45 and ceased when Bologna fell. The site (Italy road map 1:200,000 sheet 11 Ref 825925) has been inspected and the allegations made by claimant have been confirmed. 310 Works Section 10 who operated in the area during the period in question were contacted and I append extract from their reply.

"Hq. 24 ACHE will doubtless recollect that the responsibility for road and bridge maintenance and replacement passed from Hq 60 ACHE to Regional Engineer AMG, Tuscany, on 16 April; all previous commitments being completed up to the end of the financial period, i.e. 15 April.

"Work on the land adjacent to Paisley Bridge was known to have been commenced by the Regional Engineer, AMG, Tuscany, after responsibility had passed, but the intention which prompted the action taken was never communicated to me".

"Will you please arrange regularisation of losses suffered by claimant, advising this office in due course of action taken.

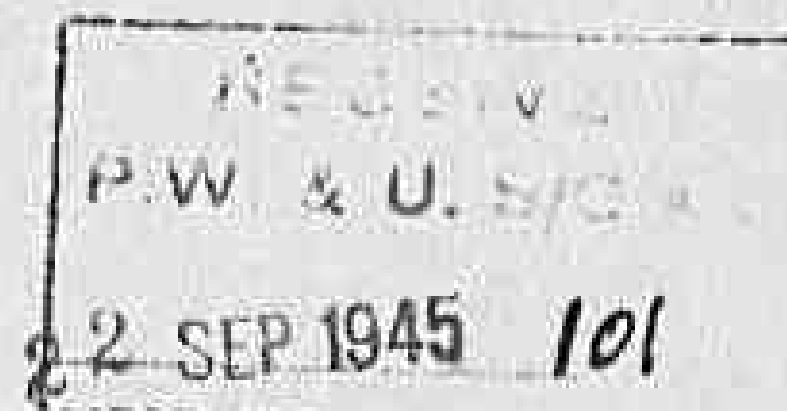

It has been brought to my attention that your office is considering the requisition of part of the apartment now occupied by Engr. P. BENEDETTO at Via Boccaccio No. 11 in Milan.

Upon the liberation of North Italy the Electrical Division of Allied Commission set to work with the electric companies to restore the damaged electric facilities to normal operation. Engineer Benedetto who had served as "Commissario dell'Energia Elettrica" was a key technical representative with whom much of this work was and is now being coordinated. Due to his ill health at the time, however, he could not leave his home, but in order to carry on his work he had an office arranged in his apartment. I personally, have held many conferences with Eng. 1. (a) With reference to the Memorandum ES/1.27 of 1 August 45. The problems most urgent as pertain to the Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission projects are :-

- (i) Coal - for gas plants, for industries producing materials absolutely essential for reconstruction purposes and for some thermal electric generating plants during the low water seasons.
- (ii) Bitumen - for roads of military priority and other important highways.
- (iii) Transportation - for handling debris, for transporting road and construction materials, and for reconstruction of power transmission lines.
- (iv) P.O.L. - adequate supplies thereof especially in the North has restricted the use even of the few trucks available.

(b)

- (i) Allotment of coal is a function of Coal Division.
- (ii) Through Petroleum Section AFHQ. arrangements have been made for importation of bitumen in greater amounts than has been received in the past.
- (iii) The Transportation Sub-Commission is accepting more trucks from AFHQ and from these the Public Works & Utilities Sub-Commission will receive an allotment.
- (iv) Supply of P.O.L. rests with other agencies consequently this S/C must use its fair share to the best advantage.

1. It is requested that the officer or officers directly in charge of the motorcycle despatch riders be required to perform their duties in office No. 10 on the first floor for two or three days in order that they may be made personally conscious of the excessive and unnecessary disturbances created by these cyclists.

2. It is impossible to carry on conversations, ordinary or telephone when these leave the parking area.

One or two of the motor cyclists do leave in a manner that is not disturbing showing that it can be done but apparently most of them feel that they have to accelerate the cycle to top speed within the first 50 yards and "gun" the machine to its maximum.

If the motor cyclists have been instructed on how to drive in cities action should be taken against them; if not so instructed, the responsibility is directly on the officers in charge.

3. For operations in the field motorcycles are very useful and most applicable, but in cities especially in congested sections they are a public nuisance and a menace and should be barred if impractical to operate them without creating disturbances.

4. We are sure your cooperation and efforts to reduce these disturbances will be appreciated by many persons in this building vicinity.

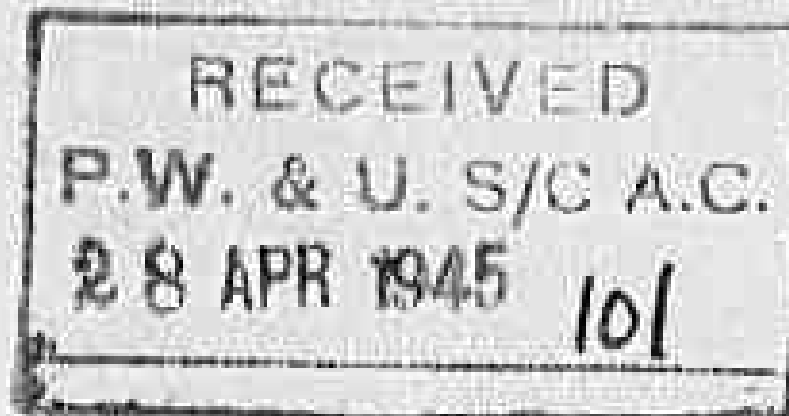

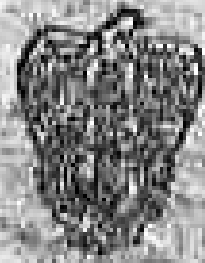

Inspection was made of the two systems in use at the main building and annex.

The conditions observed are these. Fuel used in the stoker fired boilers is of the lowest grade obtainable and will never provide satisfactory heat in these boilers originally designed for oil fuel.

The boilers in the annex are in very bad condition and the type of fuel used will never prove suitable.

RECOMMENDATION

In the annex building the use of Sardinian coal should prove satisfactory after a thorough cleaning of the Flue System.

In the main building as the three boilers installed are especially designed for oil and this oil burning equipment should be restored as soon as possible. The tanks and piping to the supply pump are intact and the other equipment is available in the building, but will have to be installed.

It is estimated the change-over for each boiler will take 36 to 48 hours. The contractor who made the original installation is available in the City and has been interviewed.

The two storage tanks are of 8000 liters each or 16908 lbs. The previous consumption was approximately 10 quintals per 14 hour day operation or 2205 lbs.

As the storage facilities will permit 15 days of operation it is recommended that the supply of oil be set up accordingly, and immediately.

This Sub-Commission is prepared to supervise this work if it is so desired, in cooperation with the HQ Commandant. Authority to proceed with this work is requested.

SUBJECT : Central Heating of Hq.A.C. Building.TO : Director, Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission.

1. There are two central heating systems in Hq.A.C.; that of the main building and that of the annexe. The boilers of the former are mechanically fired and have forced draught, and the hot water is mechanically circulated. The boilers of the latter are hand fired and depend on natural draught. Neither system has functioned satisfactorily of late, and it is known that difficulty has been experienced in obtaining suitable fuel ever since the systems were put into operation for the present winter season. On 1st Dec. 44, Maj. Westwood was called upon to examine the boilers and the unsatisfactory fuel then being supplied to this Hq. (Incidentally, on 5th Jan. 45, he was again summoned in connexion with the heating system of the main building, on account of serious interruptions in the electric power supply).

2. At 1245 hrs on Tuesday 9 Jan 45, Lt. Col. Rhodes and Maj. Westwood inspected the boilers and the fuel stocks of the main building. All three boilers were in operation. The mechanical stokers and forced draught were operating properly but the fires in the furnaces were utterly unsatisfactory. Using the present supplies of inferior fuel, and with the whole central heating system in operation, it is found impossible, under the present prevailing external temperature, to raise the boiler temperature to more than 104° Fahrenheit, which is, of course, virtually useless. There can be no doubt that the only practicable way of improving the functioning of this system is to provide a suitable grade of fuel. That which is at present in use is a mixture of lignite dust and compressed lignite "ovoids", whereas the proper grade of fuel for these boilers is the best (i.e. "SULCIS") quality Sardinian coal. It appears that supplies of either good Sardinian coal

or imported coal are absolutely necessary if the Hq. main building is to be kept at a tolerable temperature.

3. The alternative of using fuel oil ought also to be mentioned. This is referred to in the note (N.B.) of para 3 (a) in the attached copy letter (ACC/101/FMU of 21 Sep.44).

4. There is no doubt whatever that, during the last 3 weeks, the health of the staff and their working efficiency have been gravely impaired. It is not a matter of mere comfort, but one that is, under present circumstances, a clear menace to health. In the offices of this Sub-Commission, for 3 weeks past, the temperature in the rooms has seldom exceeded 45 - 50° F.

If it continues, it is as well to put on record, now, that illness will result and probably admissions to hospital.

5. If hotels and messes in this City can be kept reasonably warm, it is difficult to understand why the A.C.B.Q. offices, where a large staff has to sit for many hours on duty, should be so wretchedly provided with fuel.

6. The whole matter is reduced to this.

The Effect of Italy's Changing Status from Co-Belligerent to Ally upon Local Procurement.

1. Ever since the Quebec Conference, reports, news broadcasts and AFHQ Memoranda have constantly stressed the greater aid which Italy will receive from the Allies with emphasis upon the more complete economic and political freedom which the Italians will receive as a result of this Conference.
2. The first and greatest effect has been felt in the attitude of local Italian Government Officials. In the past they have worked very willingly with us, assisting us greatly to procure local items, but recently, since they have been informed that they will gain economic as well as political freedom, they have tended to hold back supplies and local resources which they are able to use for their own purposes, and only in cases where pressure is brought to bear will they release these items, instances of which are leather and potatoes.
3. The second effect has been felt on the part of the contractors who have taken a more independent stand with the contracts we are making now as compared with those made previously. They have taken the attitude that if we do not meet their terms they will work on civilian contracts where greater profit is forthcoming and where they might take advantage of the Black Market and also to prepare themselves for the coming needs of the newly liberated people in Northern Italy where supplies are short, or they will go to AGC and most likely get a contract to work for them making items for the civilian population under AGC supervision. Two recent cases of this have been, first, the new coffee roasting and grinding contract which price had to be set at 1.10 cents per lb. instead of the figure of 5/4 cent per lb. felt to be reasonable by this office. This price was forced upon us due to our inability to furnish the necessary technicians and personnel to operate our plant ourselves, and therefore, had to rely on the local contractors to do this work. The second case is that of our glass factory which we put into production approximately 10 months ago, and has been selling exclusively to the Quartermaster, P&G. This factory has now found that due to the scarcity of these items they can get from 3 to 4 times the price the Army pays them, on the Black Market.
4. The Black Market which, according to reports has been cleaned up by AGC, has benefitted tremendously by this change in the status of the Italian people and is now flourishing on a big scale. In fact, you can buy almost any item of Army foodstuffs on this market as well as clothing, and all civilian items produced or manufactured locally.
5. The extent to which the Italians will go to withhold local resources from the Allied Armies is shown by the recent killing of a British Officer working for AGC who, on his assignment of making potato crop surveys, was killed in the region of Naples. However, most of the opposition has been in the conversation and attitude of the contractors dealt with.
6. This information is presented in order to keep you up to date on local procurement and its problems, and your suggestions and recommendations are requested.

1. Ref. your letter HQC/II of 15 Dec. 44.
2. The estimate has been considered, and an Officer of this Sub-Commission has visited the Lancia Garage in order to examine the proposals on the site.
3. In the absence of a detailed specification of the work, including an accurate description of the small boiler that is to be provided, it is not possible to make a definite pronouncement regarding the tender submitted by Sig. Attilio TAGLIANOZZI, but we do not hesitate to say that, on the face of it, his offer appears to be quite reasonable. We, therefore, think that you need not hesitate to accept his offer to provide and instal a small boiler, and to make all necessary alterations, for the sum of 36,000 Lire, but we advise you to make it a condition that the onus shall be upon Sig. Taglianozzi to ensure that the installation will function satisfactorily and that payment shall not be made to him until its satisfactory operation has been adequately demonstrated.
4. No doubt, you are aware that the proposed alterations, if put into effect, would interfere with the operation of the rest of the central heating system. For this reason, Capt. Hey has undertaken to obtain for you a certificate from the proprietors, declaring that they have no intention of heating the privately occupied parts of the building during the present winter season.
5. We ask you to bear in mind that the new boiler will, presumably, remain the property of the Allied Commission, and that at some future date it will be necessary to disconnect it and to restore the central heating system to its original condition for the heating of the entire building.
6. Sig. Taglianozzi's tender and diagram are returned herewith.

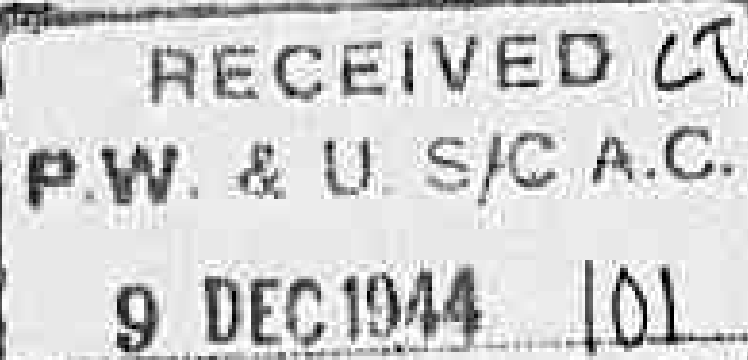

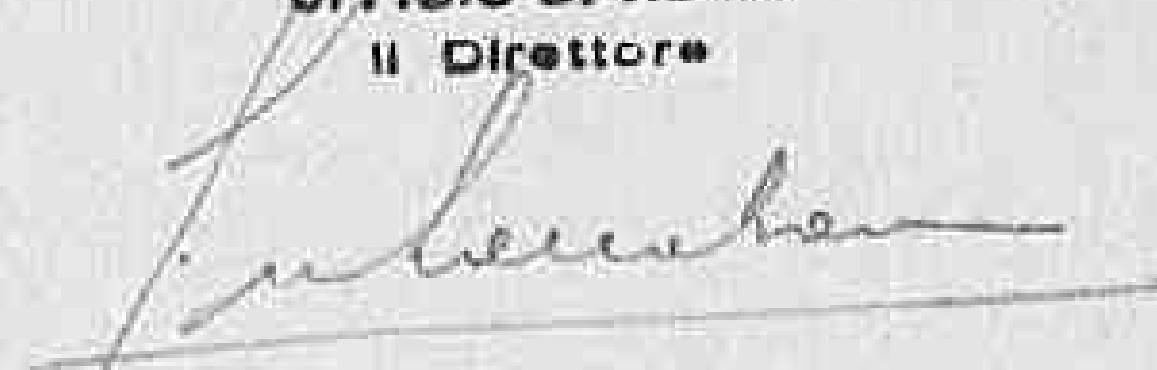

The undersigned S.C.A.C. Spun Reinforced Concrete Company. develops its activity chiefly in the field of electrical lines construction in general, as you know. Especially the S.C.A.C. Factory of Monterotondo Depot, actually requisitioned by the Allied Command for the Hq. Installation E.S.D., has always manufactured and is able to manufacture at present, "Scac" posts of every kind and length for electrical lines of every tension, besides accessories in iron and reinforced concrete for supports of transmission lines (brackets, pivots, clamps, etc.)

At present we have an urgent request from the Soc. Romana di Elettricità and from the Azienda Comunale Elettricità ed Acque for "Scac" posts and corresponding accessories, intended for the urgent rehabilitation of important power lines (150 KV Canterno Cinecittà, 60 KV Anagni Segni, 150 KV Papigno Salisano - Rome). We are not able to comply with these requests, while the requisition of our Monterotondo factory lasts. Likewise we are not able to comply with requests of all the Electrical Companies which are our customers, when they apply to us in order to obtain supplies.

We, therefore, ask you to get our Monterotondo factory derequisitioned, once you have ascertained the interest of the Allied Command in the resumption of activity of our abovementioned factory, in connection with the urgent requests of the Soc. Romana di Elettricità and of the A.C.E.A.

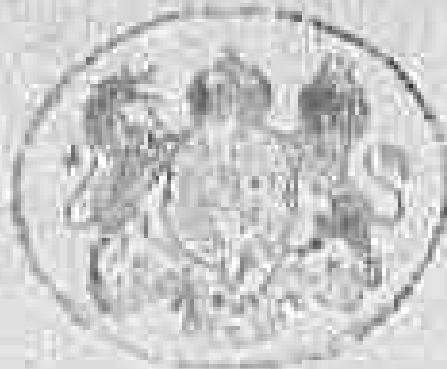
Subject: WATER TUBE BOILER AT PIETRAFFITTA.

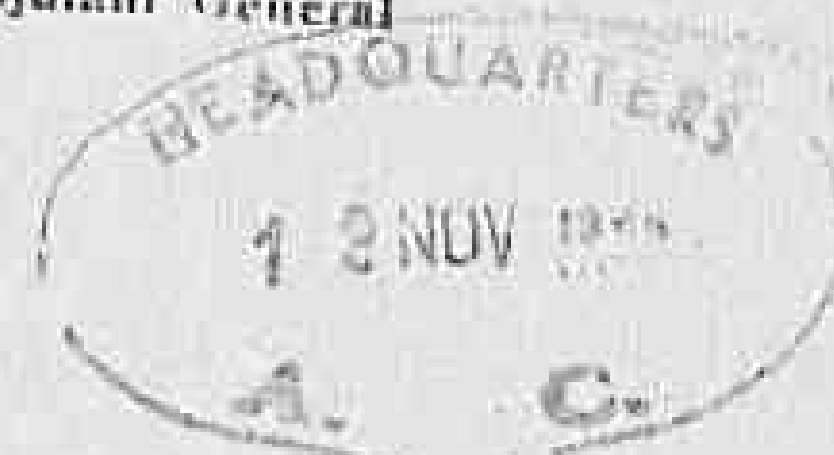
