

Subject: Transportation Needs of Public Works and Utilities

Sub-Commission.

To : Director, Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission

- 1. It is understood that a meeting is scheduled this afternoon to discuss automotive transportation at Headquarters, and that one of the objectives of the gathering is to consider pooling all civilian transport.
- 2. In Colonel Lapper's absence, I am taking the liberty of pointing out the necessity of having transportation assigned to this Sub-Commission.
- 3. In the Electrical Division of this Sub-Commission six officers are presently operating out of headquarters using civilian vehicles. It is through their efforts that the progress of the electrical rehabilitation program can be attributed. These officers have not accomplished this work through sitting at headquarters. They have been on the road. By having cars, they have been able to find material which was believed unobtainable; they have been able to visit offices where work has been held up because of confusion and red tape; they have actively followed reconstruction work and are consequently in a position to foresee difficulties, and to overcome them. Lest it be suggested that the Italians do this work it is pointed out that the Electrical Division maintains e staff of competent italian engineers who are sent to the Field whenever the situation permits. And if it be suggested that the Italian electric companies should furnish the transportation, it is emphasized here that we have been trying, unsuccessfully, since spring to obtain sufficient transportation for the companies. Occasionally, we obtain promises.
- 4. It is further pointed out that in addition to the so-called high level planning, of which the Electrical Division does its shave, we are doing much work of a tangible nature. We can not always foresee that transportation will be needed two or three days in the future.

Several days ago, there was trouble at the Nera Montoro generating station. This plant is very important now; it constitutes

the only source of electricity to Florence. Because a car was available, it was possible for Colonel Lapper and I to proced to the plant, and to act to improve the situation. Two nights ago, trouble developed at the San Paolo plant here in Rome. Our own transportation was in use at the moment; there was no car available at the Transportation Office; the taxi cabs were all engaged in taking the employers home.

- I learned at noon today that the work of dismantling an electric switch at Orte is not proceding as quickly as we had anticipated. The Military Railway, is looking to us to provide electricity to them on a certain date. It will be necessary that the switch be used. Tomorrow one of our officers is going to Orte to expedite the job; before noon today, I didn't know it was necessary.
- 6. Two days ago we were moving a large transformer from Rome to Terni over Route 3. A bridge washed out; the transformer was delayed, and the 3 British soldiers and 6 civilians accompanying the shipment lacked food and blankets for the enforced overnight stay. Because the work was being done under our direction, we were responsible for the well-being of the personnel involved. Because a car was available have within a short time, we were able to send help.
- 7. Because of the importance of our electrical rehabilitation program, and because transportation may be needed upon very short notice, it is asked that the following vehicles continue to be assigned to the Electrical Division:

TO : Economic Section.

FROM : P.W. & U. Sub-Commission.

1. In connection with the establishment of a central Pool for automobiles at this Headquarters I wish to make the following observations: -

- (a) The Public Works & Utilities Sub-Commission Officers are called upon frequently to perform emergency tasks and it is necessary for them to leave Headquarters immediately in the performance of their duties. It is, therefore, essential that arrangements be made with the transportation Officer in charge of the Pool that emergency requests, which invariably require a military car, be granted immediately, so that we will not be held up. We cannot wait and give 24 hours' notice, neither can we wait for Travel-orders. We request Travel-orders immediately to cover the officer and his trip and usually the officer is back at Headquarters when travel-orders arrive.
- (b) When requests are made for travel in Forward grous it is also essential that military cars with military drivers be provided. Our officers are called upon to check flood conditions, necessitating travel over rough side-roads and even through fields and our Electrical Officers have to go to the most remote places where electrical plants are located to the most remote places where electrical plants are located travelling also over by-ways unsuitable for any but the best of cars.

In connection with the above two tasks we have a military duty to perform and we must be given proper equipment and as and when needed.

2. In connection with this general problem I wish to state also that apparently rules and regulations for the use of cars seem to be violated every day and no one seems to do anything about them. We are instructed not to use automobil going to and from billets, except when these are certain

(distances away from Headquarters. We are also told that these cars were not to be used for pleasure purposes.

- 3. As to the latter, one only has to look out into the streets of Rome in the evening to se. Ad. cars travelling about with officers and usually some companions, certainly not on business.
- 4. As to the use of AC.cars going to and from billets, one only has to watch the procession in front of any of these hotels and again in front of AC. Headquarters building, these hotels and again in front of AC. Headquarters building, to see scores of cars bringing officers, civilians and women employees to and from their billets or messes. At noon employees to and from their billets or messes. At noon to-day there were ten cars waiting in front of the Flors Hotel when I left to return to the office. I asked three of the drivers whom they were waiting for and where these of the drivers whom they were waiting for and where these officers were going to. The answer was that these drivers were just waiting for a major or a civilian to return to the office.
- walking to and from my billet, except during inclement weather. I think others should do likewise, as long as we have an order to that effect. It should also be brought out that Administration Officers do not take advantage of the Pool because it is within their division and that they should also be asked to walk the same as others.
- 6. This is not something that has come about suddenly in my mind, but has been brought to my mind very forcibly on many occasions by my officers whom I had directed to live up to our rules and regulations, but who find that others are continually violating such rules.
- 7. Will you please see that something is done and if rules are made to be observed, that they are being enforced, if not that the rules be revised and new instructions issued.

- I. The work of this Sub-Commission, particularly in ferward areas, is seriously handicapped because of the fact that we do not have the proper type of automobiles capable of getting our afficers to the locations required.
- 2. We have a most important military function to perform in the reconstruction of military highways. Many urgent requests have been received from Military sources for immediate eaction due to floods or other causes and it is, therefore essential that we be supplied with 2 military type of cars with military drivers so as to permit us to carry out our tasks.
- 3. Will you please take this matter up with proper authority and request that we receive 2 such cars. There is attached hereta a copy of a letter from the Chief of my Public Works Division autilining some of his difficulties.

Subject: Transportation.

To : Director, P.W.& U. S/C.

1. Recent experience has confirmed the writer's opinion that civilian type vehicles, especially worn out ones, are absolutely useless to this Div. of your S/C., except for short local trips.

- 2. On two occasions recently, important inspection trips, to flood damaged areas have had to be postponed or abandoned due to complete inability of the transportation provided to move over diversions and tracks which are perfectly practicable for W.D., type vehicles.
- 3. Frequent breakdowns have been caused by such attempts and valuable time lost by long hours of waiting, while civilian repair shops in isolated districts do their best to get the vehicle moving again. There are at present practically no Army Workshops South of Siena and it is not practically possible for them to repair our civilian type cars in the extreme unlikelihood of the breakdown being in their neighbourhood.
- 4. It is therefore requested that this Div., H.Q., be provided at once with at least two good W.D., vehicles, preferably C & R Cars, with soldier drivers, preferably Allied, in order that our essential duties may be carried out during the coming months.

 - 1. Public Works Division
 - 3. Electric Division
 - 2. Pool and replacement of above cars when in shop.
- c. If this Sub-Commission had to depend upon one central peol for cars we would be unable to function. It was tried once and did not work when our duties were considerably less than they are today.
- d. This Sub-Commission is doing military work both in connection with highway or electrical reconstruction. On innumerable occasions we are called considerable distances on short notice to attend to emergency situations, conferences, etc. Many of these places are on bad roads, requiring good cors. Even our best cars break down very often. We could not depend on unknown cars for these tasks.
