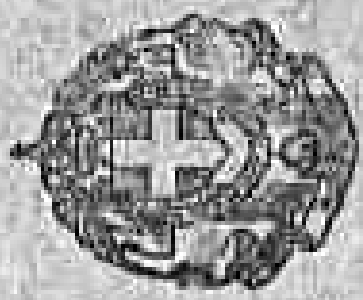

SUBJECT : Disposal of Surplus British C.A. Officers

TO : Distribution: see below

1. Extracts from War Office (CA 9) letter 124/Gen/136 of 17 Aug 45, are sent to you herewith for information and as a guide to the action called for in the paras below.

2. The information given in the above War Office letter is likely to be the most specific available at present, and it is considered that all British Officers must bear this in mind and make decisions accordingly. Every effort will be made here to assist officers to obtain suitable postings.

3. At the moment only the following officers may be considered surplus to AMG/AC requirements:-

- (a) Officers who are being released from the Army before 1 Dec 45 (A/S Group 1 - 21 inclusive) or who will proceed to UK on PYTHON before that date (4 years overseas service by the end of the year will be taken as qualifying for this).
- (b) All other officers NOT included in AMG/AC Liaison Groups, etc. or NOT remaining at this HQ after the final handing over.

4. AFHQ will be asked to furnish special instructions in regard to postings for officers in category 3(a) above. As these officers are being repatriated continuously only a small number of postings will be involved.

5. For all other surplus officers the attached specimen Form Z has been prepared and Part A will be completed by each officer concerned. Regions etc. will complete Part B and return it to this HQ. These instructions also apply to all branches of this HQ. It is anticipated that Form Z will be submitted to the War Office and it forms the basis of each officer's application for Civil Affairs Employment. This HQ possesses the greater part of the required information but it is desirable that every officer knows that the correct and latest data in his case is put forward. Part A of the Form should therefore be completed throughout by the officer personally.

6. The final decision as to whether an officer is surplus must be made by this HQ. In a number of cases officers declared surplus by Regions etc. may in fact be assigned to this HQ or to some other Liaison Group. Similarly officers recommended for Liaison Groups may not be selected by this HQ.

7. Form Z should therefore be submitted in the first place for all officers in the Field (excepting those in the category described in para 3a). 8. In the interests of all concerned it is most important that all Forms Z are completed forthwith and despatched in triplicate to this HQ. Careful and accurate completion of the Form is strongly emphasised.

MEMORANDUM

17 August, 1945.

Reference your G-5:381.1-3 dated 6 August 45.

As you are aware, there is a desperate need for trained Civil Affairs Officers in the EMAs in Middle East and East Africa, and it is hoped to divert to these EMAs many of the officers whom you expect to make available. The balance, it is anticipated, can be absorbed without difficulty into 21 Army Group establishments.

It is not possible to give any firm indication as to how long any officer will be required for Civil Affairs as in Middle East and East Africa it is dependent on when peace talks concerning the Italian colonies are concluded for which no date can be hazarded, and in respect of Germany this is dependent on the conditions yet to be fixed regarding the Control Service. Any officer, however, in Military Government in Germany will have an opportunity of transferring to such a Service, provided of course he is considered suitable.

It would be appreciated therefore, if a list of all officers who will become redundant showing the date they will vacate their appointment could be furnished as early as possible. The names on the list should be numbered serially and should show the officer's

- (1) Number
- (2) Present rank
- (3) Function
- (4) Age service group
- (5) Length of service towards PYTHON
- (6) Whether desirous of deferring release
- (7) Whether recommended for promotion
- (8) Preference where would like to serve and your recommendation

There can, it is regretted, be no promises of promotion, but no officer would be nominated for an appointment in a lower grade than he is now holding unless his agreement were first obtained. This latter point is mentioned as there may be difficulty in placing officers of high rank.

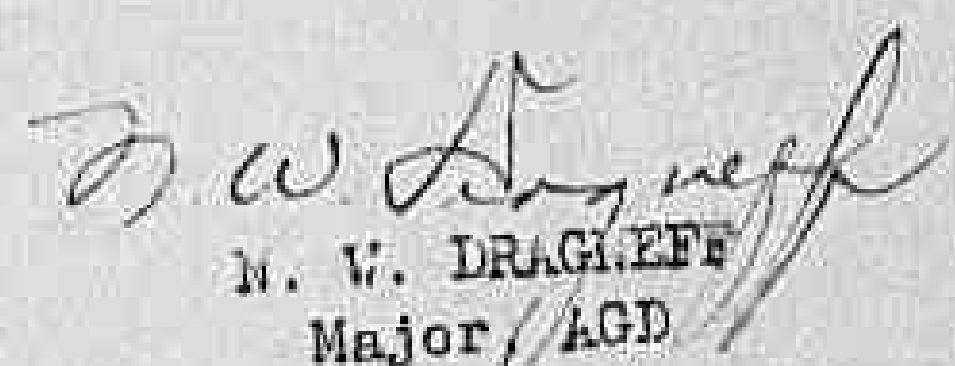

STAFF MEMORANDUM

NUMBER 3

Discipline, Supervision and Control of Allied
Commission Officers.

1. The Chief of Staff has ruled that the Regional Commissioner will be responsible for the discipline of all AC Officers in the Region and for the general supervision and control of their work.

2. This responsibility is delegated to Zone Commissioners in respect of all AC Officers whose activities are confined more or less to the Zone concerned. Officers with wider spheres of action will come under Region HQ.

3. The ruling does NOT apply, of course, to HQ AC Officers visiting the Region on duty.

4. Officers on duty in this Region, other than HQ AC Officers on official visits, will conform to the following rules:

- a. They will report to the Regional Commissioner on their arrival in the Region. If, of necessity, they go direct to a distant Zone, they will report to the Zone Commissioner. Similarly they will report to the Regional or Zone Commissioner on their departure.
- b. Changes of location of such officers will normally take place on Regional Movement Orders. If HQ AC Movement orders are received direct by the officer, he will, of course, carry out the order promptly, but before doing so, he must inform his Zone Commissioner, who will inform Regional Headquarters.
- c. Presumably all communications to such officers on important policy matters will be routed through Regional HQ, but if the officer receives communication on such matters direct, he will supply a copy promptly to the Zone Commissioner for the transmission to this HQ.
- d. The Officer will supply the Zone Commissioner with one copy of every message or letter on important policy which he dispatches, and will keep in general contact with the Zone Commissioner.

e. The Officer may sign his letters as a member of his Sub-

Commissioner Officers.

 - d. The Officer will supply the Zone Commissioner with one copy of every message or letter on important policy which he dispatches, and will keep in general contact with the Zone Commissioner.
 - e. The Officer may sign his letters as a member of his Sub-Commission if this has been his practice. If he requires the wider authority conferred by signing for the Zone Commissioner or for the Regional Commissioner, he must consult the Commissioner concerned before doing so.
 - f. Zone Commissioners will be responsible for coordinating the work of such officers with the other activities of the Zone and such officers will be careful not to take any steps, technical or otherwise, which may have effect outside the spheres of his own activities without obtaining the prior approval of Zone Commissioner.

5. It is NOT desired to interfere in any way with an AC officer in carrying out his normal duties. The job is the important thing. But an AC officer working in the Region must realize that, unless the Regional Commissioner and Zone Commissioners are kept constantly and promptly advised on all important matters, they will be unable to exercise supervision and control in accordance with the Chief of Staff's instruction or, for that matter, to help the officer in his job by use of their wider authority and more ample resources.

6. In short, all AC officers working in this Region are to be built into the Regional team, with all the responsibilities and whatever advantages that may entail.

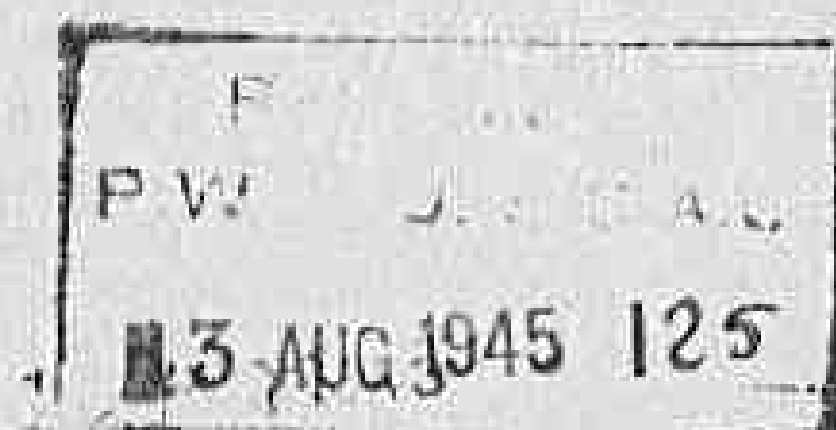

Major Farrar, G-1(B), interviewed the above named officer, and the following appears to be the position :

1. Lt Cagnazzo was commissioned by AFHQ for special employment with IS9, this employment to continue without pay or allowances and in the rank of Lieut so long as this special force existed.
2. When this force was broken up Lt Cagnazzo received verbal instructions from W/Comd Dennis (allegedly after telephonic communication from AFHQ) to find himself another job.

The matter does not appear to have been officially reported to AFHQ, and Lt Cagnazzo is not "au fait" with army regulations and procedure.

3. Lieut Cagnazzo apparently asked Lt Col Thompson of Economics Section for employment and was offered a post with Public Works and Utilities S/C on instructions of Col Jenny (A).
4. He has been employed with that S/C for nearly three months and it has been decided to pay him on a civilian basis.
5. It should be pointed out that Lt Cagnazzo is most anxious to obtain English naturalization and feels that by retaining the privilege of wearing British uniform his case will be strengthened.
6. The whole matter was irregular and no agreement of this nature should have been made without first consulting G-1 (B) at AFHQ or this HQ.

As far as I am concerned there is nothing irregular because Mr Cagnazzo was employed by me as a civilian.

Apparently he obtained permission from W/Comd Dennis to continue to wear uniform altho my understanding was that his commission had expired. He was paid by Region V as a civilian and is still being paid as such in his new assignment.

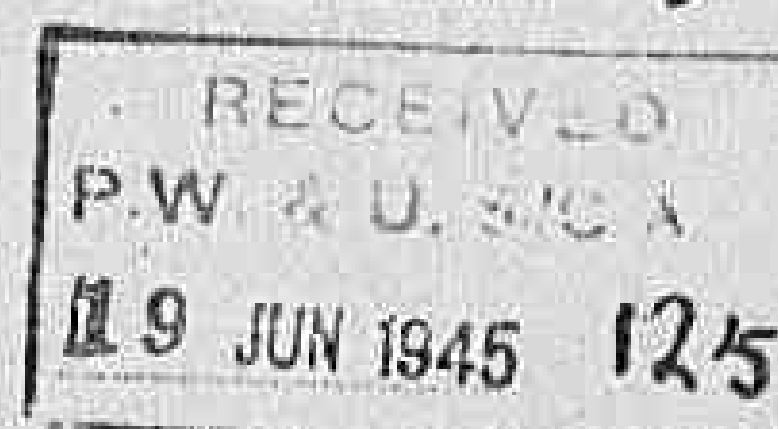

Sir,

I have the honour to submit to you this my request that consideration kindly be given to making better use of my services.

You are, no doubt, aware from my "Record of Service" that immediately before transfer to "Civil Affairs" I had for two years held an appointment as Deputy Commander Royal Engineers (Works Services). Prior to that, I had served first as an officer of an Artisan Works Company R.E. and then as a Garrison Engineer. Incidentally, I have held Field Rank since 30 April 1942, and my Commission in the Corps of Royal Engineers dated from 10 July 1940.

The fact which I most desire to bring to your notice is that my experience in the organisation and administration of a military department, firstly as G.E., but more particularly as D.C.R.E., is at present being put to no purpose. As D.C.R.E., I was the administrative and technical head of an organisation which contained in itself a staff of technical, supervisory, financial and clerical personnel averaging fifty in number, and which controlled large labour forces, both military and civil.

I venture myself to inform you - for none other here can do so - that my proven value in a military capacity is my ability to institute and enforce orderly and efficient procedure, and to marshal information in a methodical manner for the direction of my subordinates. 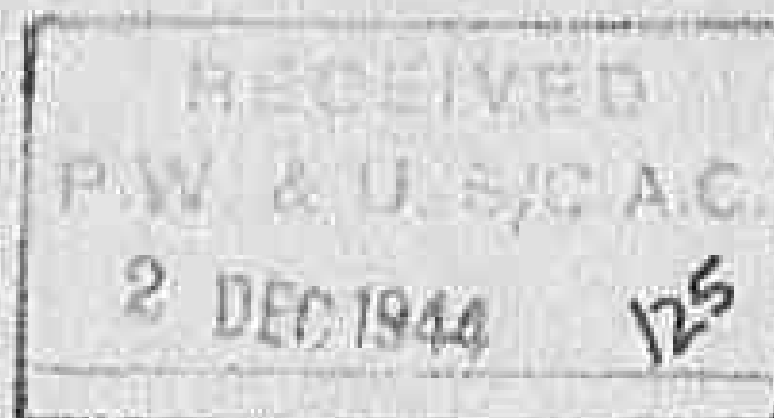

My dear Colonel,

I wish to thank you for your letter dated 20.9.44 and the contents therein. I appreciate very much your recommending me for the Regional Engineership of Venezia Region. It will be very nice to get away from Bari, where I have been so long. I quite realize that there is a great possibility of finding a high percentage of damage done by the Germans, which will entail hard work and much responsibility, but I will welcome this.

I have spoken to day to Lt. Col. Hensley who informed me that he had agreed to my leaving the Region. I understand from him that Major Chamberlain is coming from Catanzaro to Bari to take over.

I heard a rumour that a Region was being formed to go into Austria, and that a number of Officers of this Region would be selected for this new Region, and I wondered at the time whether I might have the opportunity of going with them; however no doubt, when the time is right, we shall all have the opportunity of proceeding either to Germany or to Austria.

Once again I wish to thank you and will do my best to keep the flag flying.
