SUBJECT: Synopsis of Progress Report, January 1945
Public Works and Utilities Section.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Southern Region.

NAPLES, AVELLINO, BENEVENTO, SALERNO

Electricity situation slightly better, field offices in Caserta and Salerno closed, officers operating from Naples. Field engineer Catanzaro zone transferred, no replacement. Salerno area - 5 bridges in hand, 91 km. regular maintenance, 92 km. of repairs. In Naples, Avellino, Benevento area 4 bridges completed 2 started, 11 in hand. 134 km. repairs started, 32 km. completed, 562 km. in hand. Electricity rationing continues. Two serious breaks in lines this month. Water normal. Gas production shows an increase over last month.

B. & R. I.

Winter weather is proving a stumbling block to road repairs and Public works. Labor disputes are current. No change in personnel. Inspection tours curtailed due to lack of transport. New priorities received. Work involved with new priorities greater than civilian organizations can perform. Work underway on 6 bridges washed out in November. Electricity rationing continues, situation better. Two main power failures during month. Water situation normal. Gas normal. Transportation inadequate.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Southern Region.

GENERAL REMARKS

Responsibility for the execution of Public Works is being shifted more and more to Italian agencies. In keeping with this, three field offices have been closed down; Catanzaro, Cosenza and Salerno. However, two field engineers are operating these territories, working from the Naples office. Military requests are being directly handled by this office, which has liaison with both British and American Military Headquarters in this area. Civilian work is being handled directly by the Italian organizations in this area.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL

Mr. Conrad Rapp, American civilian acting as field engineer in Catanzaro has been transferred. Captain R.N.J. Hibbard has been moved from Salerno to Naples where he continues to handle military work in Salerno and Caserta areas in conjunction with Mr. Townsend.

MILITARY HIGHWAYS

91 kilometers of maintenance has been carried out in Salerno zone on highways 88 - 19 - 18. Regular road repair is underway at the present time to highways 19 and 88. The total amount of kilometers involved in road repair are 92. Railroad bridge on route 88 is started. Avellino bridge on this same route is 80% finished. Ponte Tunciano in Battipaglia is 40% complete. Ponte Sole on route 19 is 70% complete. Ponte Casalbuono on route 19 is 70% complete. Ordinary maintenance continues on routes 16, 19 and 88. Repairs to route 26 to Auletta are in progress. Rains and snow fall are hindering progress of repairs to route 88.

PUBLIC WORKS

Demolition of buildings has been carried out on the following streets: Rione Montecalvario, Via Nuova Santa Maria Ognibene, Vicoli I and II Portapiccola at Montecalvario, Via Cesare d'Eugenio and Traversa Santa Maria Ognibene. Debris was cleared from damaged parts of buildings number 31 and 34, Via Santo Spirito di Palazzo, Naples; sewer maintenance on Via N. Sauro, repairing of Piazza Benedetto XV, Casoria, rubbish and debris removal near the Royal arsenal. Work labelled as urgent was the partial reconstruction of sewers and drains at the Royal Arsenal near the State railroad station, sewer repair in Frattamaggiore, repairs to the roof of the Danzur barracks used as an allied telephone office, repair to Via Cisterna, in the comune of Cimislile.

The following work is in hand:

Demolition and debris removal of damaged parts to building located between Via Favia and Ferrara, Aquila and Genova; building between

Corso Meridionale and Via Nazionale, Via Genova and Pavia; Via Nazionale 12, Via Ferrara 43, Via Bari 90.
Repairs to street in the town of Gardito in order to warrant public safety following the floods of 5-10-44 and following days.
Removal of debris caused from floods in the streets of the Comune of Gragnano.
Removal of debris from damaged buildings for the repair of streets in Torre del Greco.
Torre Annunziata: Restoration of building S. Maria la Foca.
Torre Annunziata: Removal of debris and demolition at Corso Umberto I, Via Maresca and Via Alfani.
Arco Felice: Coast defence in the building zone.
Naples: Enlargement of thermal establishment, S. Vincenzo pier.
Naples: Repair of square near the dry docks in the port area.
Maintenance of dry docks at Quarto.
Reconstruction of 5 bridges in the drainage zone.
Works of utmost urgency for the drainage of rain waters through canals and reservoirs clogged around the Ippodrome of Agnano, flooded by the above-mentioned waters.
Urgent repair of retaining walls of Sarno River near the Napoli-Castellammare railroad bridge.
Completion of repairs to the drainage works of Naples and Villa Marchese.
Reconstruction of pumping house and transformation cabin in the drainage of Licola and Varacaturo.
Repair of North-east Wing: College S. Vincenzo alla Sanita.
Repair of Istituto Suon Pastore, Via Belvedere 5.
Repair of thermal establishment Subvini Romini in Pozzuoli.
Repair of bldg used as College PP. Gesuiti alla Conocchia.
Repair of gas pipes in the industrial zone of Naples.
Repair of bldg Industrial Institute Casanova, Naples
Restoration of bldg, Vico Guardi 25, Naples.

ELECTRICITY

Electricity rationing - The peak load situation in the Naples area has shown some improvement due to the discontinuation of heating apparatus, and the closing of the shops, elevators, business offices and schools at 3 o'clock daily. The situation nevertheless remains serious, and this section has already discussed the necessity of placing factories on off peak operation. The Calore Plant started operation this month however at a reduced capacity. Repair work which could be done to the Grechiella Plant on the premises has been completed; however other repairs to units to be installed there are being carried on in Naples at the present time. Due to snow slides heavy snow falls and rain there has been considerable difficulty in installing the transformer which we moved

from Bari to Timpagrande.

This transformer was in Crotone on the 25 of this month at which time we arranged with 3rd CRE. for a trailer to haul it to Timpagrande.

There were two serious interruptions in the lines this month:

a. A break in the 150 KV line between Sila and Bari. During this break, power was supplied through Benevento at a 50% reduced capacity.

b. The Sila Tuscianno line which feeds Naples was interrupted causing service at a drastic reduction.

The delay in repairing these lines was caused by the lack of transport needed to take coalmen on the job to repair these breaks.

WATER.

Repairs to the Naples water system are continuing satisfactorily. The water situation is normal, and these repairs are limited to local breaks which are gradually being repaired.

G. A. S.

The average production per day has been 80,000 cubic meters with a maximum of 90,000 cubic meters on the 15 January. Gas production has been improved by mixing pit coal with coke. As was pointed out in the December report, this pit coal when used alone threw off a high tar content reducing the gas production.

The gasometer with the capacity of 80,000 cubic meters went into service the 15 of January. Battery repairs are still going on. Tests in the zones not yet supplied with gas are being taken for future gas service.

BARI ZONE

GENERAL REMARKS

The on coming of winter weather has brought great difficulties

to the carrying out of public works and electrical failures and road blocks from snow and landslides have been numerous. Labor disputes as regard state employees have been experienced in this area and the situation at present is tense and depends upon the action to be taken in Rome at the present time. The approximate date for a crisis in area which may involve all Genio Civile, water and railroads is anticipated to be the 25th of this month. Prices are rising at an enormous rate.

PERSONNEL

No change.

INSPECTION TOURS

Inspection tours have been limited to more or less the immediate vicinity this month due to automobile difficulties. The existing transportation is inadequate and is in running condition only a small percentage of the time.

MILITARY HIGHWAYS

New priority lists have been received from N° 3 District, from 54 Area and from 52 Area. Amount of work involved in these priority routes is above the capacity of the civilian road organisations and the progress on the military highways is unsatisfactory. Seal coat work has been abandoned during this period due to the unsuitable weather. Landslides have blocked the Bari-Potenza road. Two bridges have been opened to traffic during this month.

Landslides have been experienced in Potenza and Matera Provinces on Route 92 and three provincial roads. Work is underway in the construction of 6 bridges washed out during the November flood but is limited due to the snow in the mountains. The bitumen tracts are deteriorating rapidly due to lack of bitumen.

PUBLIC WORKS

ELECTRICITY

Rationing has given better results during this month. During 6 days of this month there has been no need to cut off feeders to reduce power load. There were two main power failures during the

month on the 150 KV line in Calabria. The extreme shortage of transportation results in longer periods of break downs than should occur. For example a break on the 150 KV line at Cibari (Prov. Consenza) the truck that should have been stationed at Nova Siri was at Bari for repairs. There was no truck substitute to take its place. When the break occurred the truck had to be dispatched from Bari and as a consequence did not find the break until the next day. This meant that practically that all of the Apuglia Region was without power from 12-24 hours longer than should have been necessary had adequate transportation been available.

PUBLIC UTILITIES

Water: The water service of the main aqueduct system for Puglie is normal. 145 tests have been made this month throughout the system and all have shown the water to be potable. The aqueduct of Agri serving a large portion of Salerno province has been temporarily repaired but has been broken again due to the poor quality of the tubes used for the repair. The repair of this aqueduct is under way but is slow due to the scarcity of transportation. The small aqueduct system of Cursola in Potenza and Salerno Province has been repaired and is in service with the exception of one town which has a separate hydraulic system of its own.

Gas: Normal.

MATERIALS

Outstanding cement releases for roads and bridges have been cancelled. The BICRIT emulsion plant has been shut down due to the lack of solid bitumen.

TRANSPORT

Approximately 80% of the AAS vehicles have been functioning during this month. The amount of transport is quite insufficient for the work at hand. Transport for the electric and water companies is wholly inadequate and is causing serious interruptions to public utilities. Personal transport for this office is almost unusable.

SUBJECT: Progress Report, November 1945.
Public Works and Utilities Section, Southern Region.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Southern Region.

GENERAL TRADES:

Requests for materials needed by Italian organizations to carry on work which is not of a military nature have been directed to the "Consiglio di Economia" for procurement.

Work of a military nature with a priority as set up by Allied Armies in Italy will be supervised by this Section and executed by Italian organizations; while work of no military importance will be directly handled by Italian organizations. Such work as is requested by a military unit to be used directly by the unit in question, such as clearing space for a dump or repairing a short road to an army unit, will be the direct responsibility of the unit in question.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL:

Major William F. Chamberlin has replaced Major Knight in Bari as Public Utilities Officer.

Mr. Conrad B. Rapp, American civilian, has replaced Major Chamberlin as Public Utilities Officer in Catanzaro.

Captain Daniel Brown has replaced Captain Leslie in Reggio.

INSPECTING TOURS:

Mr. Townsend and Mr. Rapp, two American civilians ~~69~~ added to this Section, completed a tour of inspection covering Reggio and Catanzaro in order to acquaint themselves with conditions in Southern Region. The bridge in the vicinity of Gioia Tauro was inspected. The second span had collapsed after having been fully completed. It was being fully reconstructed as a four arched span bridge. The first span was completed, the second span, was completely poured, but due to the length, width and depth of the concrete, the superstructure

was unable to carry the strain. Its size was approximately 35 feet long, 24 feet wide and 3½ ft. thick. There were three civilian casualties due to its collapse.

MILITARY HIGHWAY:

Approximately 272 miles of ordinary repairs have been carried out in the outlying areas of Caserta. The above repairs have been done to road of military priority number 1. Approximately 192 miles of ordinary maintenance has been done to Provincial roads of a military nature throughout Caserta and outlying areas of Caserta. There are eight bridges in progress, one of which has just been started. Charts attached will show the progress of these bridges.

OTHER HIGHWAYS:

Approximately 30 miles of ordinary maintenance has been carried out on non-military roads in this same area. In Salerno, approximately 34 miles of ordinary repairs have been done to Route 18; about 64 miles of ordinary maintenance to Route 19 and about 31 miles of ordinary repairs to Route 88. These routes are all number 1 military priority. About 33 miles of ordinary maintenance to provincial non-military roads has also been done this month. Two bridges, called Fuscuto and Cincinello have been finished and opened to traffic; a third located at Via Senna Salerno is about 50% completed.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Repairs to hospitals, orphanages and jails, although continuing to proceed slowly due to the difficulty involved in obtaining materials. Street cleaning, sewer cleaning and general debris removal is being carried on constantly.

ELECTRICITY:

Hydraulic Generation.

a. Orichella Plant, on 29 October 1944 the three 18000 KW units at Orichella went out of service due to a fault in one of the units. Two of the units were returned to service within one week and the third unit which is badly damaged will be out of service for 60 days.

b. Timpagrande Plant, On 15 November 1944 trouble developed in one of the 30000 KW units at Timpagrande. This unit is being repaired and it is expected that it will be in operation within 10 days.

c. As a result of certain units being out of operation at Orichella and Timpagrande the hydraulic efficiency of the Sila plants was

reduced and an excessive amount of water was drained from the Sila Reservoirs.

a. It is estimated that the storage of the Sila reservoirs will be 143,000,000 KWH on 1 December 44.

b. It is estimated that the storage of the Matese reservoir will be 10,000,000 KWH on 1 December 44.

Thermal Generation - During the month of November it was necessary to operate two units of the Capuano steam plant of Società Meridionale Elettrica to help carry peak loads. It was also necessary to operate Diesel unit at the Vigliena plant of the Volturno Co. for the same purpose.

Reconstruction.

a. Calore - The unit of the Calore plant is being tested at present and if no serious trouble develops this plant should be ready for operation within the next 15 days.

b. Leto - Reconstruction of the Leto unit has been delayed due to lack of materials and transportation.

c. Aventino - Reconstruction of the Aventino unit has been delayed due to lack of materials and transportation.

d. Orichella - One unit of Orichella is out of service due to serious damage to the alternator. It is estimated that it will require 90 days time to repair this unit.

e. Timpagrande - There has been a delay in obtaining transportation to move the 1200 KVA - 150/10 KV transformer from Bari to Timpagrande. We have been advised that railroad transportation for this transformer will be provided in the early part of December 44. The auxiliary equipment for this transformer has been installed at Timpagrande.

f. Capuano - The third unit of the Capuano steam plant has been tested and is now ready for operation.

Rationing.

a. KW Load - The KW loads on the various substations have exceeded the allotments on several occasions during the month. The power companies working with the representative of the Italian Ministry of Public Works have prepared plans to reduce peak loads by reducing tramway service and shifting factories to off peak operation.

b. KWH Consumption - The KWH consumption in the Southern Region has been within the allocation for the month of November.

INDUSTRIES & FACTORIES:

A cement mill at Vibo Marina has been inspected and it was found that with about 200 tons of cement, this factory could be finished and start operating. Its production would relieve the shortage of cement in that area.

There is a factory in Bari called "Acciaierie e Ferriere Pugliesi" which in the past, manufactured water pipes. This factory not only has

stock on hand of immediate necessity to the Aqueduct of Naples, but its production is urgently needed throughout this Region. The factory itself is now requisitioned by a British unit and the present stock of materials is frozen.

PUBLIC UTILITIES:

Water. The following work by the Naples Water Company is now in progress: Reconstruction of the Canal bridge of Fannarano, strengthening foundations for 800 mm siphons near Vallone di Miano, reconditioning the river bed of the Pietra Cupa river near its point of crossing of the principle aqueduct, preliminary work on the hydraulic booster pumps of Chiaiano water system, repaired main 200 mm water pipe in Via Terracina crossing the bridge; repaired sliding valves of Via Duomo corner of Via Foria size 400 mm and Piazza S. Bartolomeo, size 200 mm. Repaired leak on the 500 mm water main at Via Roma corner of Via Maddaloni, repaired water main size 200 mm in Via Palasciano. Overhauled the 'lyrical' system serving the Vasto area.

Gas Works. The average production has been of 85,000 cubic meters per day with a maximum of cubic meters 98,000 on the 4th November. The repair of gas generators and of the distillation-battery E.D. is being done simultaneously with the delivery of cast iron pieces from the "Navalmecanica".

The 80,000 cubic meters gasometer is almost complete and will probably be in working shape by the end of December. During this month a vacuum-pump was damaged and the service has been kept up by means of a steam operating vacuum-pump of less capacity, so that consumption had to be reduced. It is expected that the vacuum-pump will be put in shape by the end of this month.

Damaged pipe lines in non supplied zones have been inspected and repaired, particularly in the Corso Garibaldi zone, Via Foria and the Vesuvian Communes.

Repair of main pipe along Via Galileo Ferraris is being carried on.

MATERIALS:

(1) The outlook on materials is very grim due to the change in the system of control. We have already had concrete examples of the inefficiency of the Consiglio di Economia here in Naples in its capacity of material control. We cannot point out one single case where materials requested by civilian agencies to them have been forthcoming.

TRANSPORT:

Transportation as has been indicated by previous reports is lacking. The situation as indicated in the past remains the same.

BARI ZONEGENERAL REMARKS:

The policy of turning more responsibility over to Italian agencies for execution is being carried out throughout Bari zone as has been directed to us through higher Headquarters.

The Municipality of Bari is still handicapped in road repairs due to the lack of funds. The sum of 200,000 lire was made available to the Prefect of Bari so that work required by number 12 CRB could be executed.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL:

Major S.F. Chamberlin replaces Major W. Knight as Public Works Officer Bari zone. Captain Daniel K. Brown replaces Captain Lambie as Public Works Officer in Foggia.

INSPECTION TOURS:

Inspected Route 100; good condition to Taranto. Lungomare bad repair. Provincial and Municipal roads to Capurso bad state. 12 CRB responsibility. Provincial road to Bari air port now practically completed. Patching and graveling of haunches being carried out on Route 16 from Bari to Barletta bridge over Ofanto. Route 98 good condition. Improvement on Route 98 to Andria greatly improved. Route 97 to Gravina in good condition.

MILITARY HIGHWAYS:

General maintenance has been carried out on State Roads and some Provincial roads, and patching has been carried out on Municipal roads in Bari. Attached forms give details.

OTHER HIGHWAYS:

PUBLIC WORKS:

The following projects have been recommended for approval during the month of November: Potenza city sewers, bridge over Castelluccio River, the San Primo bridge on the Fossa Pennarone road, estimate for snow plows, Andria by pass road repair and seal coat, building of Hospital Obstetrics ward in Bari.

PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The water situation remains normal.

Gas - The Bari gas works applied for 30 tons of gas coal; 15 tons were granted.

Electricity - Circuits had to be cut off during peak period, in order to remain within prescribed load. Nuovo Lucano Plant now 90% completed.

MATERIALS:

Shipments of emulsion have been made regularly from the Naobit plant, Bari at the rate of 50 tons weekly. This emulsion has been consigned to the Genio Civile per la Viabilità for winter maintenance of state roads. Shipments of stone for Cervaro bridge have also been made regularly at the rate of 60 tons a week from Trani.

TRANSPORT:

War Department vehicles in Bari section have been operating satisfactorily, and the spare tires promised by Col. Fernyhough are beginning to come through. Only 7 out of the 31 vehicles are in the work shops. In the Foggia area only 50% of the transport is working.

CATANZARO ZONEGENERAL REMARKS:

Local Authorities are assuming more responsibility, and are becoming more and more functional. Engineer Pirrozzai has been assigned by the Genio Civile to cover Public Utilities in this area.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL:

Mr. Conrad H. Rapp, American civilian, has replaced Major W.F. Chamberlin as Public Works Officer in Catanzaro.

INSPECTION TOURS:

Inspected Route 18 & 19, from Vibo Valentia to Reggio Calabria. Bridges and roadways held up for lack of cement. Inspected Route 106 to Locri and Route 19 to Catanzaro. Covered Crotone and Timpagrande and visited electric power plant at Timpagrande.

MILITARY HIGHWAYS:

Lack of cement and transportation is hampering the maintenance of military highways. Started work on the lumber road to Crotone. Attached charts show details.

OTHER HIGHWAYS:

See attached charts.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Housing for civilians is greatly needed and progress in initiating projects is being made.

Electricity: Difficulty has been encountered on a supplementary line to the lumber camp. This line is a leased line and in poor condition. The Società Elettrica Calabria has been instructed to see that this line (a 5 KV line) is properly maintained. The labor dispute at the electric company has been settled and an agreement is now in the hands of the Regional Labor Officer.

INDUSTRIES & FACTORIES:

Negative.

PUBLIC UTILITIES:

Water: A new division has been formed by the Gonto Civile to handle this utility.

Gas: The above mentioned division also takes care of gas.

MATERIALS:

Only 14½ tons of cement were received this month for military roads. This cement was assigned to the Petrace bridge. The balance on order is 2212 tons for military roads and the bridges.

TRANSPORT:

40 tires have been promised to assist our transportation. Along with these tires, the military has promised us an additional truck. Transportation is still critical.

1. System installed for military work requests where Italian government is backcharged for materials used provided work is of use to Italians.

2. Major Knight transferred from Bari, Captain Lomio transferred; replaced by Captain Brown, Mr. Townsend, American civilian assigned to this Section.

3. Three generating units burned out with a loss in capacity of 95,000 kw. Reconstruction of 6 plants and substations continues. Transportation and materials are lacking.

4. Repairs to the gas plant proceed. A storage tank repaired.

5. Repairs and maintenance carried out to roads in Naples City and province. Five bridges completed in the Province of Naples.

6. Water distribution system repairs continue.

7. Materials and transport seriously lacking. No cooperation from Comitato Civile.

8. Work on roads and bridges through Bari zone continues slowly for lack of materials and cement. Same condition in Catanzaro.

9. Water supply insufficient.

10. Catanzaro Lacoste Company had a labor dispute.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Southern Region.

GENERAL RELEASES.

Many requests for all types of construction and repairs have been made to this Section by ~~the~~ military, more specifically, by Peninsular Base Section, 3rd District Command, Royal Navy; U.S. Army Air Force, Allied Commission Sub-Commission. A very high percentage of these requests have been extremely urgent due to military demands. In many cases, ~~such~~ requests require immediate attention, as for example, falling walls, buildings, livernons washed out, land slides over routes etc. The policy of this Section in dealing with military requirements has been as follows: if the project was for 100% military use and of no value to the Italians, the military services furnished the materials and transportation delivered to the job. Through the Italian organization, this Section furnished the labor. If the project had value to the Italians, the policy was to backcharge the Italian Government for both labor and materials.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL.

Both Major Knight and Captain Lambie engineer officers in Bart and Foggia have been reappointed. Captain Brown will replace Captain Lambie. It is advisable for higher command to arrange some setup with the military authorities so that allied civilians will have no difficulty in obtaining materials and supplies in the areas where they are replacing military personnel. This plan should be discussed on a higher level in order to avoid any possible complaints. An American civilian, Mr. Townsend, has been assigned to this Section. His services along with his staff will be used to expedite the procuring of materials and transport.

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ELTRICITÀ

The electricity supply situation in Southern Region is as follows:

On the night of the 29th of October the 3 generating units of the Orichella, first stage plant, of the Sila Plants went out of service due to electrical failure. The rated capacity of the Orichella plant is 55,000 KW. One of the three units may be back in operation in about 6 days. The other two units were heavily damaged. Every effort made for restoration of this plant is being made. Transportation difficulties regarding this problem have been ironed out.

The Capusno Steam plant of Società Meridionale di Elettricità has been used to help carry peak loads. On two occasions during October it was necessary to operate this plant at capacity of 30,000 KW due to failures of transmission lines serving the Naples area. An adequate fuel supply has been available for this plant. At the present time there is a 30 day supply of fuel oil in storage.

The following is a summary of the more important electrical reconstruction projects in Southern Italy:

CALORE - HYDRO PLANT. This plant has been completely reconstructed and is being tested at the present time. If no difficulties are found this plant should be ready to carry a load of 5,500 KW by December 1944.

LIRE - HYDRO PLANT. The reconstruction of this plant has been delayed due to failure to obtain transportation and cement. Recently 50 tons of cement was obtained from Peninsular Base Section. This amount of cement will permit continuation of the reconstruction for a short period and if more cement is not obtained immediately the work will be delayed again. We are still trying to obtain transportation for this work. When this plant is completed it will add 6500 KW of capacity to the 150KV system of Società Meridionale di Elettricità.

MUGIO LUCANO - HYDRO PLANT. The repairs to this plant are nearing completion and it is expected that the plant will be ready for operation in November 1944. This plant can supply 2000 KW to the 150 KV system of Società Meridionale di Elettricità.

PUSCIANO - CALORE - PESCARO. 60 KV Transmission line. The

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repairs to this line will be completed 1 November 1944. Then this line is in service the Benevento and Avellino areas can be served from the Naples area and thus reduce the load on the Foggia 150 KV line which is now loaded to capacity.

TISSANOVA SUB-STATION. Arrangements have been made to move a 12000 KVA - 150/10 KV transformer from Bari to Tissanova. It is expected that this transformer will be in service at Tissanova by 1 December 1944. When this transformer is put into operation at Tissanova it will increase the capacity of the 150 KV system of Società Meridionale di Elettricità, by 12000 KW.

PRATIANOIRE SUB-STATION. The 60 KV switchyard at Pratiannoire is being rebuilt and a 60/9 KV transformer is being installed to relieve the overloaded condition in that area.

The above mentioned reconstruction work will add 20,000 KW of capacity to the Società Meridionale di Elettricità, 150 KV system.

FINANCING OF WAR DAMAGE TO ELECTRICAL SYSTEM. The Società Meridionale di Elettricità has submitted 63 estimates involving an expenditure in excess of 200,000,000 lire to cover repair of war damage to power plants, transmission lines and substations. It is expected that estimates for war damage repairs will also be submitted by the operating companies of the Società Meridionale di Elettricità system.

This section has maintained close liaison with Cominuclar Base Section, 3rd District, the Società Meridionale di Elettricità, and the Italian Ministry of Public works during the past month.

For some time now, this section has brought to the attention of higher command the lack of basic materials and truck transportation, vitally needed by the Società Meridionale di Elettricità to carry out present operations and repairs to the electrical system in Southern Region.

This section has repeatedly tried to obtain this much needed transportation and material. Requisitions, sat 10's, and letters have gone forward through channels; but to date the situation remains the same. It has been found that the method of using sat 10's for supplies is entirely unsuccessful. Actually except for a few remote cases, all materials procured by this section, have been through military units in this area.

It is the opinion of this section that control of materials in

this area should be decentralized. It has been our experience that many Army Units are ready to exercise control on pursuant stocks but few are prone to increase those stocks for the civilian and military demands. Paradoxically, army requirements from this Section increase rather than decrease.

It is not necessary to point out that the electricity demands on the Naples mainline & districts are increasing daily. This utility company will soon find itself in a position where it will be impossible to meet these demands, unless something tangible is done at once.

Recent storms throughout mountain section of Calabria, torn down the main lines of the silk plant. Lack of materials and trucks delayed the repairs to the point that Naples had an interruption in service for 24 hours. If the Electric Company had had trucks at their disposal, these repairs could have been completed in 1/4 the time.

It is absolutely impossible to expect the local power company to carry out vital repairs to the damaged power system without any materials, or any source to obtain them. It is obvious that this condition will result in a complete stand still in progress in the near future. This has been verified by numerous discussions with the Electric Company officials.

This lack of transportation and materials is not only a local condition, but is also the case in both Bart and Catanzaro zones. For example, constant poles were needed in the Catanzaro zone for bridge piling. After much boggling, they were procured, only to be rendered entirely useless because transportation by rail was disapproved and truck transport was lacking.

The above applications concern electric power only. The electric light, for private homes, has been hooked up in the ~~6912~~ ⁶⁹¹⁰ Campania area.

A joint meeting was held with the managers of all the power companies of Southern Italy in order to evolve a practical solution for the distribution of power, and the reconstruction of lines. During this conference, it was noted that the incurred indebtedness of the Italian government is extremely high and no payments for services are being made by the Italian government. Technical problems were discussed and it was decided that monthly meetings would be held at which all interested parties would attend.

G A S.

The average daily production of gas has been 75,600 cubic meters with a high peak maximum production of 99,700 cubic meters reached the 31 October.

Another storage tank for the storage of integral gas has been repaired, so that daily production has been increased by an additional 14,000 cubic meters. Repairs to other storage tanks and to the main battery for distillation are continuing. These repairs are being carried out with the help of the Naval Association, a factory now employed in making parts for the above storage tanks and batteries.

The cover of a storage tank which will hold 50,000 cubic meters of gas is in advanced state of repair. When this cover is completely repaired this tank will be able to furnish the balance of the consumers of the city of Naples with gas.

The pipe lines through the following streets have been tested and put into service: Via P. Giovanni a Carbonara, Via Cirillo, Via Foria and Via Museo. This new repair has improved tremendously the gas pressure throughout the entire zone of elevator Vona, San Gennaro, San Potito which had been very low because the gas was furnished from the secondary line through Via Roma. Work on the main pipe line on Via Galileo Ferraris still goes on. Work has started on the repairs to the main net work running through Corso Ugo Foscolo e Teocchio over the bridge "Francesi" which will service the communes around Vesuvius.

CITY OF BAIA.

During the month of October the following city street repairs and maintenance were carried out:

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Via Circumvallozione and Via Miano - Agnano, Via Falcone Beneventani, Via Nuova Montesole, Parco Griffo, Via Antonino d'Antona, Via Domenico Fontana, Via Leonardo Bianchi. Sewer work and road work in Via Guarini at Casalone and Via Costantino Grimaldi. Repairs are continuing at Via Arenaccia and Corso Normanno. The side walls along Via Arenaccia have been finished. Via Trascoli di Foggioroale and Travessa Macella have been repaired along with the main sewer "Surasone". Maintenance work has been kept up throughout all the roads in the city of Naples. Maintenance of public schools and public buildings has been carried out.

PROVINCE OF NAPLES.

Road construction throughout the Province of Naples has been limited to maintenance. On the autostrada from Naples to Pompei maintenance work and minor repairs are being carried out. During this past month due to the heavy rains, it has been necessary for our maintenance crews to clear off parts of the autostrada which were covered over by ash and dirt. The following bridges have been completed in Naples Province territory:

Cannicoli A.R. 118 - 570, Burbon A.R. 177 - 566, C. Cantone A.R. 590 - 732, Sorrento A.R. 599 - 747, Corvo A.R. 629 - 955.

WATER.

Urgent repairs are being carried out to the aqueduct at Torrenza di Pannarano near Ponte Canale where much of the piling has been destroyed. Work on the Chianano reservoir is finished. This reservoir is now functioning along with the Rolla reservoir. The Luriano reservoir will be completed by the beginning of November.

Repairs to the following streets were made to the water distribution systems:

Via dei Fanti Rossi, Via S. Nicotera, Via S. Ferraris, Via S. Prin, 3rd Travessa Stradella, Via S. Falcone, Via Argine, Via Duccio a S. Francesco, Vico Cangiano al Morcato, Via S. Vallotti at Barra and Piazza Mercato.

water rationing after 1900 hours is still being carried out in the City of Naples. It is expected that this will not be necessary after November 15 since the heavy rains have substantially augmented the water supply.

GENERAL:

There is a critical need for stone for military highway construction, military railway construction and airports. This Section has now established a working agreement with the U.S. Air Corps to pool resources and equipment in order to increase production. This accord has been established only recently, and it is believed that a joint effort will be made to reduce the price of stone and at the same time increase production.

The present bottleneck in this operation is transportation. In order to solve this problem of transport, coordinated efforts to use tramways, and narrow gauge railways are being put into effect to reduce normal deliveries instead of long truck hauls.

It is the opinion of this Section that an allotment of salvaged military tracks should be sold to Italian Public Utilities. Allow them to perform their operations in a normal orderly business manner. An allowance of parts should be made to an authorized dealer from whom parts could be bought on a cash basis. This Section is not in favor of instituting military jurisdiction over vehicles for Italian agencies. It is highly in favor of selling to responsible Italian agencies mechanical equipment to make themselves self supporting and independent.

Due to the heavy demand of materials and transportation, this Section is now employing a full time American civilian and staff to expedite the problem of supply and transport.

This Section wishes to point out that officials of the Genio Civile of Naples have displayed an attitude of complete laxity and disinterest. This matter has been brought to the attention of engr. Pizzano for correction.

It has been noted that most of these Italian officials are long winded theorists who are very loathe to do anything practical.

Rather, there seems to be a long line of back-pushing with the net result of nothing accomplished. An excellent example of this is the department of Public Utilities, Genio Civile. The official in charge of this department could theorize for hours at a stretch but to get anything done or brought to a concrete solution is something far beyond his comprehension or intention.

This Italian organization should be functional at the present time, yet it is not. The question of commissions paid to Genio Civile officials for appraisal of work done by private contractors is one which this Section is very much against. Flat salaries should be paid engineers without the added fee for appraisals. This encourages the lazy attitude of the officials who are far more interested in these fees than accomplishing any work through their organization. The present salaries paid Genio Civile employees are ridiculous.

This Section has requested the Minister of Public Works to audit all projects for Cesa Pompieri in this territory.

We have arranged through the Military Railways to transport cement from Ariano to Naples, hauling back coal dust for the cement production in Ariano. This was done to break the cement bottleneck so that Naples public utilities could continue their work repairing their plants.

BARI PROV.Submitted by: Major Knight,

GENERAL REMARKS.

The rate of progress on military highways during October has been much impeded by the rain fall, as many as three days a week being lost due to this reason. It is feared that the seal coating program will not be able to be completed as was anticipated, unless there is a marked improvement in the weather.

General maintenance and patching of State roads has been maintained, also satisfactory repairs made to Provincial roads.

Quarries have on the whole worked well; towards the end of the month there was a stoppage at the Canneto quarry, near L. Ferdinando, and stone was not available for three days for Cervignano-Cervaro sections of Highway 16.

The T.D. vehicles operated better in Bari Province. The Italian supervisor engaged last month to be responsible for the care and maintenance of the vehicles, having managed to obtain spare parts from Army Salvage Depot of M.T. spares and using these to repair and put more vehicles on the road. In Poggia Province the vehicles are not working so well, spares have been obtained, and it is hoped that these will enable the Centro Civile Garage in Poggia to put more vehicles on the road.

A visit was made by a team of officers from A.F.I.C. lead by Lt. Col. Farnborough for the purpose of inspecting T.D. vehicles on loan to the Ufficio Speciale del Centro Civile per la Viabilità and finding out the numerous difficulties we are up against; the object being to line up all T.D. transport used by civilian organizations working with A.C., and set up an organization for the control, care and maintenance of all T.D. vehicles. During the month the Ufficio Speciale del Centro Civile per la Viabilità reported that the Italian Government had not advanced sufficient money to pay contractors and workers. This sum advanced L. 10,000,000 being only sufficient to pay for past work, none being available to pay workers and contractors in Reggio for past and current expenditures. The Ufficio Speciale del Centro Civile per la Viabilità went to Rome on the matter, we also wrote to Mrs. Rome, asking for something to be done. We have heard since that the Ital Govt advanced another L. 20,000,000.

so there should be no further delay in getting work carried out. He understand that contractors were advancing money to the Ufficio Speciale del Genio Civile per la Viabilità for payment of workers' wages, to keep the work going.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL.

There has not been any change in this direction.

INSPECTIONS. The following ins. actions were made during the month.
26 Sept. Went to Soglio. Inspected Route 16, Cerignola-Soglio, seal coating proceeding under difficulties, continuous convoys going northwards delaying rate of progress, 3 km. seal coated. Very little progress made on Carapelle Bridge, informed Capt. Lambie and told him look into the reason.

1. Oct. Inspected Provincial road from Route 100 - Adelfia-Saturo, being resurfaced, found insufficient stone on the road, this was holding up contractors. Visited Altamura quarry, work proceeding satisfactorily. Inspected Route 96 from Gravina-Irsina, seal coating going on satisfactorily.
4. Oct. Inspected Route 97, Gravina-Spinazzola-Jot. Route 98, which is gravel maintained; found road in bad state, plenty of stone on road side, but not much evidence of maintenance. I found later this was due to insufficient funds, being provided by Italian Government. Visited A.A.F. wing B.P. Spinazzola, and arranged for two lorries to be placed at disposal of Ufficio Speciale del Genio Civile per la Viabilità for this road. On return called in the Ufficio Speciale del Genio Civile per la Viabilità, and told him to put heavy maintenance going on at once.
5. Oct. Visited Terlizzi P.T.P. and arranged with officer in charge to allow our vehicle inspector to go there and cancel all class 6 lorries due for breaking up, to obtain spare parts, to put Genio Civile per la Viabilità vehicles on the road.
7. Oct. Inspected Provincial Road to Bari Airport, found work being done satisfactorily, though progress was slow. Visited G.I.C.-I.P. Palma (quarry, large stock pile of chippings, which were not being collected. On ⁶⁹¹² gave Genio Civile per la Viabilità instructions to collect. Visited Lodugno Cement factory re. cement deliveries.
10. Oct. Went to Andria with Lt. Stephens, saw the Mayor and his engineer, inspected the roads that have been approved

- for repairs, which go to military hospital. Inspected Route 96 Canossa-Andria, found work had been held up owing to recent rains. Inspected Route 93 Canossa-Melfi, found road in bad state of repair and needing patching. Have since seen Genio Civile about this and released emulsion for this road.
12. Oct. Inspected Route 97 Gravina-Spinazzola, found great improvement since last visit, also visited quarry in Spinazzola producing stone for this road.
13. Oct. Went to Potenza Route 96, found great improvement in the road, and work progressing satisfactorily.
14. Oct. Saw Genio Civile and Provincial engineer on various matters. Went back to Seri along Route 93 Potenza-Melfi-Canossa. Found road which is macadam to boundary in a very fair condition up to Melfi, and well maintained. Inspected 5 bridges which had been blown, found work being done on five, one 95% complete, and two 50% completed. The remaining three had not been started. Inspected Provincial road Vicoequieto-Route 93, instructed Provincial engineer to make an estimate for, to do gravel maintenance, this road is in bad state, and to be being done by request of D.I. Ingegneri AF.
15. Oct. Inspected Provincial road Gola del Colle-Litium, which is to be gravel maintained, plenty of stone on road, but little evidence of workers spreading gravel. Inspected Sant'Antonio bridge, this is 75% completed, should be finished this month.
21. Oct. Visited Taranto, saw Genio Civile and Provincial engineer, and cleared several matters up. Saw D.G.R.S. regarding release of bitumen and emulsion required for Taranto roads which have been approved.

HIGHWAYS.

Route 96-work been held up due to heavy rains, 5 km. being seal coated during month making total of about 29 km completed. (about 55%).

" 96 Gygrina-Tricina. Heavy rain interfered with progress. 7 km. being seal coated during month, (about 12) completed. 691

" 7 & 94, Tolva-Potenza-Tito. Progress is low owing to rain. 11 km. seal coating being done during month, about 20% completed.

GENERAL REMARKS

Efforts have been made to turn over to the local authorities more of the work in Public Works and Utilities. Inasmuch as the rainy season has arrived, initiation of only problems of the greatest necessity for conserving of life and of military necessity will be attempted. Lack of finance and ever increasing prices has practically brought the civilian public construction to a standstill.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL.

There has been no change in staff & personnel during this month.

INSPECTION TOURS.

Inspection tours have been made to Cosenza, Rosone, Protone, Favazzina, Grimaldi, Chiavavola, Savigliano, and Ustica this month. Numerous small towns have been inspected for water and sewer conditions. A number of provincial and communal roads have been inspected for bridge and road conditions.

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MILITARY HIGHWAYS.

There has been no change in military priorities on roads in this zone with the exception of a general lowering of priority for southern roads as far as materials are concerned. Progress on military highways is still unsatisfactory due to lack of transportation and materials. Only two cars of cement have arrived from N° 3 district this month and releases for October have not been given at the present time. Work has been initiated on the N° 106 (Bivio Lanza to Bivio Belvedere Spinello) in vicinity of Crotone. Heavy repairs are being made on 90.9 km. of road and ordinary maintenance on 434 kilometers. Six bridges are under construction, the Imato, Astrov, Angitola, Sisirico, and the small bridge on mountain north of Morano Calabro. All with the exception of the Imato are being delayed due to the lack of cement. Progress chart for military highways to attached.

WATER.

Inspections have been made of water supply of various small towns in this zone. In general the water supply for the average commune is insufficient and is in bad state of repair. For the interest of public health it is essential that a complete survey of the water supply of all communes be made and projects be started to at least safeguard the water supply. It is out of the question at the present time to build complete water systems but some work can and should be done to improve the existing conditions. The present system of control of communal water supply is not effective. Water is tested in many communes only when the system is first built and having found it to be pure no further thought is given as to possible contamination thereafter. All control and maintenance is left to communes and in many cases there are no technical personnel to deal with the water problems. Only when request is made for aid do the Genio Civile intervene. Request has been made for the Genio Civile to inspect the water supplies of all communes and to initiate projects of moderate demand for repair and safeguarding water supply.

G A S .

Gas has not been ordered for the gas plant in Istranaro. This is the only gas plant in this zone.

ELECTRICITY.

Distribution of electricity has been very successful during the last

month. With the beginning of the rains the demand on the Cila plant has been much less and the Società Elettrica della Calabria is well within its allocation. The Montecatini plant has not gone into full production due to the lack of raw materials from Tunis and therefore the electrical situation from the point of view of available kilowatt hours is quite good for the remainder of this year. Consumption for the month of September for the S.E.C. was 1,149,739 of which 2,110,000 kWh. were furnished by S.A.E., and 1,131,729 kWh from small centrals. Montecatini consumed 1,121,050 kWh in Sept.

There is an ever increasing shortage of light bulbs in this area. There are none left on the market and this shortage is beginning to affect the industry and administration in this zone.

Lat 10's have been initiated for 15,000 light bulbs per month but so far there has been none forthcoming.

There is need for transformer oil (which has been ordered), and transportation. The S.E.C. has now one truck in operation and its tires are in very bad condition. With the winter and rainy season setting in it is very doubtful if all transmission lines can be maintained under the existing conditions.

There was a labor dispute in the electrical company. On the 25 of June the employees syndicate made a demand that wages be increased to the same rate as paid to the employees of the S.M.C. at Naples. On the 20th September an agreement was stipulated in which the employees of the S.E.C. would receive 200 lire less monthly for clerical help and 50 lire a month less for laborers than received by the S.M.C. This agreement was signed by the S.E.C. and the syndicates of Reggio and Cosenza but not by the syndicate of Catanzaro who held out for other demands.

On October 13th regional labor official (Italian) held a meeting in which he stated that the agreement of September 20th would not conform to the policies of the A.U. since the difference in indemnities between the City of Naples and Calabria was 11, litres per day, the agreement would necessarily have to undergo some sort of reduction in pay of laborers so as to result in a monthly payment of at least 300 lire less than that actually paid to the S.M.C. at Naples.

The Secretary of the syndicate of Catanzaro got and gave

vent to his wrath, and made some unpleasant remarks concerning the labor official, who promptly invited him to leave, and broke up the discussion without reaching an agreement. Later in the day it was decided to have a meeting with the labor official of the A.C. in Naples which will take place on October 25th. All suggestions of strike have been called off until after this meeting.

MATERIALS AND TRANSPORT.

No orders arrived during this month from N° 3 district. Releases for October have not been published. The Genio Civile has only three trucks remaining in operation at the present time. We have managed to get a loan 12 tires for use for the Genio Civile, which will be a great aid in their functioning.

The State highway department was advised to pay the contractor at once, so that ordinary maintenance would not be held up in any way. In addition to this, the Regional engineer has discussed with A.C.C. Headquarters the possibility of getting these unfinished jobs properly financed so that everything can be cleaned up leaving no loose ends hanging.

Procedure for future works has been clearly outlined to the Genie Civilie, State highway department and Provincial engineer, emphasizing the fact that no work will be started without the full approval of higher headquarters which will be obtained through channels submitted through this office.

STATE AND PERSONNEL.

Military personnel status in this Section has been unchanged for this month, our civilian personnel however has been augmented in both the Section and the field officer's setup, in order to facilitate the tremendous amount of work required.

INSPECTION NOTES.

Inspection tours were made in both the Salerne and Cesarea areas in order to ascertain the condition of the roads and bridges. The bridge work is coming along very well. The road work has been made of large coarse material, obtained from local quarries. It has been provided for, and it must

TO : Regional Commissioner, Region 3.

GENERAL REMARKS...

The assignment of 4 additional officers to Public Utilities Region III took place about the middle of this month along with their respective territories. This includes some 50 projects in various stages of completion. The territories include north of Naples to Avellino province and south of Naples to Battipaglia. These projects consist of both roads and bridges, their reconstruction and maintenance. Work is divided into priorities, 1st, second and third, and their reconstruction will be adhered to strictly in this order, as designated.

A conference was held on 26th June 1944, at which the Regional Utilities Officer was able to discuss together with these officers, and Sig. Tizzano, Pugliese, Chiaravolo of the Genio Civile along with Sig. Mancini of the A.A.C.C. with representatives from Avellino, Benevento, Caserta, Salerno the work to be done in these zones. It was brought out that requests for materials, gasoline, permits and the like were to go through channels, i.e., first discussed with the officer at the head of the zone who in turn would take it up to higher headquarters. This was to insure the fact that no transaction regardless of what it was, would be carried on without the knowledge of the officer responsible for the Section.

STAFF AND PERSONNEL.

The staff of officers and enlisted men has been ~~of 600~~ and with the new activation of Regions forward, it is expected that it shall be cut much more. In order to have the minimum

loss of personnel, this Section would have preferred to have their men assigned to Headquarters, on temporary duty to this Section. In most cases, the assignments are direct, placing the personnel in the position of being transferred by the Region. If this takes place, it will cripple the working strength of this Section greatly.

INSPECTION TOURS.

An inspection tour was made of the roads and bridges in the Caserta, Benevento, Avellino area; at which time it was noted that work generally is progressing quite well. It was suggested that maintenance crews be immediately set up so that completed work could be kept in a good state of repair. In a few instances, it was suggested that more than one contractor be put on a job which would involve too much time for one man to finish. This speeds up progress and work in the area generally. It was made clear that these contractors were directly controlled only by the officers designated to that particular zone, so that confusion would be eliminated. It is noted that a good part of the delay in road or bridge construction can be attributed to too many Section heads trying to tell the different contractors what to do. If the orders are given by one person only, the workers and contractors will not be confused.

MILITARY AND OTHER HIGHWAYS.

There has been no major change in the different highway priorities as mapped out to us. The general progress of overall picture is good. We are attaching a list of the roads and bridges in progress and their percentage complete.

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MILITARY AND OTHER HIGHWAYS (Contd)

There are two important road construction jobs in Naples city; Riviera di Chiaia which will be complete on the side nearest the aquarium in about a week; and the start of the combined utilities repair and road repair on Via Stelle Polare. Riviera di Chiaia is proceeding according to schedule, its estimated completion time was about six weeks. The road is of trap rock construction with bitumen. Notwithstanding the fact that it is about the only type road construction available today, it can withstand traffic equally as well if not better than the small brick roads found throughout Naples today (not cobble-stone).

The work on Stelle Polare will proceed slower than ordinarily, because it has been arranged to have all utilities repairs done simultaneously in order to avoid the tearing up of the same stretch at some future date. There is work to be done by the Gas Company such as repairing and laying new gas lines previously damaged by bombing; the Circumvesuviana Railway is reconstructing a tunnel; the Telephone Company has work to be done on underground cables; the Water Company, the Comune of Naples, and Genio Civile, have water mains, sewers and culverts to repair. All this work will go on at once. There was a conference held at the beginning of this project in order to ascertain the fact that it would be done at once.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Debris cleaning is proceeding very well. Along with the regular work, the cleaning up of the bombed telephone building is going well. This building presented large problems; simply because the equipment at our disposal was inadequate to cope with the large heavy slabs of concrete found on this location. It is being cleared away however and will be completely cleared up in about two weeks.

The Genio Civile has had the approval of about 400 projects here in Naples and province; these projects range from demolition and clearing of debris to repairing and re-

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construction of public buildings. Of this figure, about 90% have already been started and the balance will be started within the next week. About 35% have already been completed. It has been a policy with this section to get the approved projects started at once, in order to insure the allocation of money for each project be used specifically for what it was intended.

Sewers and drainage have received first priority and work of this type has been rigidly supervised and pushed. The reason for this has been in order to clean up and do away with sections which would be mosquito breeding and malaria producing; work of this type is practically complete. There is no danger at the present time of malarial sections. In order to accomplish this, this Section worked very closely with the Public Health, cooperating with them to the fullest extent.

Consumption for the month of June has been under the allocated amount, due to strict rationing and supervision of each individual application. In proportion, one day's allocation for Naples was 546,666 KWH. against consumption 6875 for a day at 456,556 KWH.

A 5000 KVA Transformer is being installed at Terre Annunziata, and will be operating on 9 July 1944. This

will relieve the load in that area to a considerable extent. We have put another section of the Ilva plant into operation in the Torre Annunziata area with a consumption of about 400 KW. This will operate during off peak hours until July 1, after which time it will go on a 24 hour a day schedule.

The Provincial Tramways have been given permission to operate their trams over all their routes during off peak hours. This completely activates the line from Naples to Giugliano, Aversa, Trentola and Albanova.

A blanket permission to operate the Naples Tramways at our discretion, has been granted this Section by P.B.S.. In compliance with this, the tramway from Fagrigrotta to Bagnoli has been activated. It is to be noted that these lines will be reactivated depending upon their not hindering military traffic at all. In most cases, the tram tracks run to the side of the road not obstructing traffic in the least. Naturally this Section plans to extend service first in those sections where traffic is at its lightest. Naples Tramways have also started to operate from Via Tasso through Via dei Mille to Piazza dei Martiri, from Via Tasso through the Vomero to Via Mergellina, and from Via Tasso through Via Aniello Falcone to Via Salvator Rosa.

PUBLIC UTILITIES.

The water system in Naples is in fairly good condition at the present time. The work on the pipe line from Riviera di Chiaia to Mazzolini is completed. Pozzuoli is drawing water through this line now. The major project on hand is the main conduit on Via Stella Polare. For this work we have provided piping, a compressor and a bulldozer. The estimated time of completion on this job is two months. The main drainage systems are in good order; this Section has been working in close cooperation with the Medical Section, in order to clean up badly drained areas, and repair damaged or broken sewer lines.

Supplies for the Naples Gas Company have proved very difficult on occasions especially their most recent request which was forwarded to A.G.C. Public Works Sub-Commission, for some ball bearings to be imported from England. The general condition of the machinery at the gas plant is such that period-

ically certain parts break down or wear out which can be replaced only in England, since the type plant here in Naples is of British make. Requests for parts of this type are forwarded to higher headquarters for their information.

Coal for the Gas Company is proving to be a difficult product to obtain, since the gas coal is all imported stock. The Coal Commission suggested a ration policy, but this would hinder the complete restoration of the gas lines in Naples; because the proposed allocation of coal would be sufficient only for the present consumption. This does not take in consideration the fact that as new zones become restored, the production of gas per cubic meter must also increase.

COMMUNICATIONS.

Major Knauer, Telecomm. Officer for ACC., located in Naples, turned over his work to this office as he plans on leaving here in a few days. His work consisted of supervising reconstruction of telegraph and telephone lines when they overlap from one region to another.

P.B.S. will not permit the installation of civilian telephones for the next 30 or 60 days due to the shortage of cable pairs.

This section cleared the trolley wires from two street car lines, of all line and drop wires. Spent considerable time with S.E.T. Engineers in connection with building toll lines Naples-Torre del Greco-Torre Annunziata-Castellammare.

Local telephone service for civilians was started at the following cities during the month. Pozzuoli - Torre Annunziata - Torre del Greco - Castellammare; and the S.E.T. is working on the central office at Sorrento.

The following telegraph circuits were put in service this month.

Naples - Torre annunziata

Naples - Torre del Greco
Naples - Messina

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At the present time this Section is working with the State Telephone Co. for telephone circuits from Rome and with S.E.T. for circuits from the south.

This Section is working with Circulo Construction Co. and State Telegraph for telegraph circuits from the north and south. Special equipment installers are here from Rome installing repeaters and other telegraph equipment.

MATERIALS.

Materials in general still are difficult to obtain. The shortage of cement, bricks, stone and bitumen is now an old story. Machinery and equipment has been a problem too. Since we actually have no machinery at our disposal, the job of finding or borrowing it from other army sources is now difficult enough. We have been assigned some 50 trucks to be used in Naples and provinces. This in itself is a substantial help. In this category of materials must be placed tires for the vehicles belonging to the Public Utilities. The tire situation is deplorable; we have presented a detailed list to higher headquarters showing the needs for all the Utilities Companies. This list includes tires for the filobus service and regular bus service in Naples.

b. KW Demand.

During the month of May the maximum demands on all sub-stations in Region 3 were below the allocated values with the following exception: on four days the maximum demands in the Salerno-Torre Annunziata-Castellammare area exceeded the allocated values.

The above data indicates that the electricity situation in Region 3 is not in a critical condition at the present time. This should not be taken as an indication that there is an abundance of electricity for all purposes.

We should continue to ration electricity for the following reasons:

a. We anticipate requests for electricity in many small flour mills and food preserving plants in the centers to come. We expect to satisfy these requests.

b. As soon as the transmission and distribution lines are rebuilt in recently occupied territory, we will receive requests for reconnection of consumers. We expect to have a sufficient supply of electricity available for consumers with high priority.

c. Any essential factories which are now in operation have not reached full production but will do so in the next 60 to 90 days. We anticipate a gradual increase in the requirements for electricity in these factories. We expect to have sufficient electricity available to meet these increasing demands.

d. We propose the re-establishment of limited trolley service in and around Naples. The re-establishment of this trolley service will provide transportation for essential labor.

The electricity situation in the Salerno-Torre Annunziata-Castellammare area has received a great deal of attention from this section during the past month. All small power users in this area were disconnected and many of them have already made application for reconnection. These applications have been screened and those with high priority were reconnected. The disconnection of these small consumers has reduced the total load sufficiently to permit the operation of steel mills for military production in the Torre Annunziata and Castellammare areas.

ROADS - BRIDGES - DRAINS.

The maximum amount of trucks over allotted to us for cleaning streets and removing rubble has been 24. Last week, the motor pool, which had 700 trucks at its disposal was relieved of 100 of these which were sent to the forward areas. Since they have now some 40 trucks to satisfy all demands, it is easily seen why our allotment has been reduced.

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from 24 to 4, with the possibility of not having any at all for the coming week. Naturally our progress is seriously impaired. We have arranged to have the prefect requisition some 13 trucks for Genie Civile use, but these are now being repaired and won't be in service for at least 15 days. In the meantime our work is seriously crippled.

The repairing of Riviera di Chiaia has been started. The completion of this work is to involve one month's time. It has been divided up into 3 sections so that traffic will not be disturbed very badly. We have tried to maintain this street in a state of repair but found it to be impractical from both a financial and practical viewpoint.

The large bridge at the top of Via Ponillipo has been filled in with rubble and dirt in order to permit traffic to cross at this point in the road. This is a temporary affair; the permanent repairs will be done at a later date.

The road from Baiaoli to Foscali has been repaired. The bridge which was used by the Provincial Tramways has been filled in also, in order that our schedule of re-energizing the entire tramway system will not be held up.

Work in the provinces is progressing slowly, due to the lack of materials and equipment. However, seachday bridges and roads are still being constantly repaired and despite obstacles, work is going ahead. Reports from the provinces however, indicate that materials are getting more and more critical.

The overall picture of sewers in the City of Naples is very good. Two months ago we started to clean the sewer system, which at that time presented a serious health problem. They were clogged; the water line was very much above normal and in some cases, whose areas were flooded, turning lowlands into swamp lands. These sewers if not immediately cleaned out would have caused large areas where mosquitos would have bred in great profusion.

Double shifts of workers were put to work in order that the cleaning out would be accomplished before the very warm weather set in. Now most of this work is finished. There is no danger that these areas will flood again.

TRANSPORTATION.

The loss of the plant by requisition of the 16th workshop Unit has proven to be the biggest set back this section has experienced to date.

. is the only workshop which can carry on repairs to the rolling stock used by all of our secondary systems. Even more disturbing than this however, is the fact that all three companies, the Ounans, Circum-niviane, Provincial Transways, Tunioulars and azienda Autofile-raviverin, have at the present time motors and rolling stock on the premises of the R.A.T.P., and it is the intention of the 16th workshop Unit to take this stock along with the This Section is not procrastinating when it states that transportation will be definitely crippled and shortly cut off by the denial of the use of this plant.

There is no other place to do this work. There is no other place to obtain equipment. Without rolling stock one cannot operate any railway system no matter how great an effort is made.

It is to be understood that the following programs which we have mapped out is based upon the assumption that the Naples transportation system will have the use of the facilities.

1. Approval has already been requested for the energizing of the Naples tramway systems in the 3 sections of Naples which take in Naples proper and Posillipo to connect.

2. Approval has been requested for the operation of the Picentino d'Alife railroad for civilians as well as military purposes.

WATER.

When the military railroads repaired that part of their track in Posillipo which was cinned by the garrison, they had to build up a huge fill leaving no possibility to put in our water line. This water line had not been working since the mining of this particular spot. In order to help Posillipo's water system, we had to bypass this fill and lay a considerable amount of additional piping to connect this rupture.

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This work was brought to a conclusion in exactly 15 days. Constant supervision of this work was carried out by this Section in order to rush it through.

We have obtained 15 tons of cement from P.M.C. procurement office to be used in rebuilding the Napolet water reservoir situated on the high point of Naples city. This very important project had been held up for weeks due to the lack of cement. By representing it to P.M.C. as a quasi-military project, we managed to get the release of the required amount of cement to do the work.

Water has been brought to Chiaiano province for civilian use.

Gas.

Gas service has been opened to the section which takes in Gradoni di Chiaia, Corso Vittorio Emanuele, Via Salvatore Don, Via Costantinopoli and Via Port'Alba.

In the following sections, the service extended to the eastern portion: Piazza Deante, Via Sisterna dell'olio, Via delle Quercie, Via D. Capitalli, Piazza Giardino, Via Giacomo Battista, Via Cartonieri alla Poste, Via Conte Oliveto, Via Radice, Piazza Municipio, Via G. Verdi, Via San Cesario and via Chiaia. This service was put into effect 13 May 1944 with no disruption resulting thereof.

This Section obtained the release of 2000 meters of pipe line from P.M.C. and had this pipe delivered to the Gas works, so that they could start work on Via Stella Polare, where their line was badly damaged by bombings and mines. The Gas works itself is rapidly shaping up. Many of its buildings are now in progress of being restored. This work is held up however by the lack of materials.

What little cement we do get is spread over such a large surface that jobs like the restoration of the Gas works buildings are allotted less than more urgent street and water work. This section has assigned the use of 6 trucks daily to the Gas Company during the month of May for cleaning up the plant. General cleaning up of the plant is now done.

700 tons of coal of the mine, Sardinian coal has been

iven to the Gas works, and is practically all delivered now. This coal is of very inferior grade, but a small ratio of it can be used along with gas coal for their use.

Approval of a surcharge, not to exceed 500%, has been granted to the Gas Company by A.C.C. Public Works and Utilities sub-Commission. This action was taken by the sub-commission at the request of the Gas Company.

The proposed plan of work to be done on Via Stella where has been presented to this section and approved. This involves the repairing of the gas line along this street which was damaged by bombing.

We have already arranged it through the Military Police P.M.P. with regard to traffic rerouting and there should be little or no difficulty involved on that score.

COMMUNICATIONS.

This Section requested the Prefect to requisition 2 large trucks for Circulo Construcoes, one small car or motorcycle for the Post Office, & four passenger cars for the Director of the Telefonic and Circulo Construcoes.

We requested and received approval from the proper signals for the restoration of local telephone service in the following cities.

POSSUOLI
TODI ADRIANOVA
PESCARA
CASTELNUOVO
GROSSETO
AVELLINO

Outside plant work has started at Possuoli and we have been assured by the Telegraph Co. that work in the other exchanges will soon be started. There will be a delay in all cities where dry cell batteries are used as the Telephone Co. has exhausted their supply. A request for 5000 of these has been made. The central offices in the above exchanges have recently been inspected and found to be in working condition.

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Considerable time has been spent with Major Knauer and engineers from the Telephone and Telegraph Co. with reference to opening toll and telegraph service.

We are working on plans with Major Green and the Genie Civile for repairs to the Post Office building. Some minor repairs have been made in the offices where the telegraph equipment is located. It is impossible to secure glass at this time.

A request has been made through Brigadiere Lush to P.G.C. signals for 100 cable pairs in the Bureau exchange, these to be used for telephone service by A.M.C. Offices and certain civilian business offices.

The first NAPLES-BAL RHO telegraph circuit was put in operation 0800 17 May 1944.

This Section obtained the approval of an estimate of \$170,000 lire for repairs to the Post Office building on 21 May 1944.

Extra noon day rations for 36 Circulo line employees were requested and this has been approved.

Arrangements for telephone and siren installations for P.A.D. Officer have been made.

All trolley wires of all drops on the street car line between Naples and Regnoli have been cleared of communication lines.

ELECTRICITY

In keeping with the rationing system which we have now in effect, keeping recommended applications down to a minimum, this Section has done the following:

Applications forwarded by us to Economics & Supply Section, Region 3 for their recommendation.....	55
Applications forwarded by us to Public Health and Welfare, Region 3:.....	31
Applications forwarded by us to Public Safety, Region 3.....	5
Applications recommended for service by this Section.....	85
Applications rejected for service by this Section.....	95

It is to be noted that in the three cases of recommendation rejection or deferment, the figure includes all the applications returned to us by the above mentioned sections with their comments.

This is brought out because we have not received the amount which we sent out to them.

The total amount of applications registered in this Section for the month of April, 1944 is.....260

This Section made a survey of power consumers' in Torre Annunziata, Castellammare and Salerno areas.

685

This resulted in our requesting the Campania Electric Company to discontinue the electricity supply of 1325 small power consumers in the Torre Annunziata, Castellammare area.

The total contracted loads of this group is 7641 Kw. After these consumers are disconnected they may make application for reconnection. These applications will be screened and those with high priority will be reconnected. We estimate that the total reconnections will be approximately 3000 Kw of connected load. We estimate that approximately 4641 Kw. of connected load is not essential and will not be reconnected.

This action was necessary in order to provide adequate electric service to two large steel mills which will be started in the area soon.

This Section obtained approval for the supply of electricity for the following large projects:

- A. Irrigation Project Naples Province
- B. Drainage Project Naples Province
- C. Two large Sulphur Mines in Benevento Province.
- D. The Provincial Tramways were energized in order to transport workers to and from Naples.
- E. Several Hemp Mills in the Naples and Salerno Provinces.

The following is a brief summary of the electrical situation in Naples Province:

This Section attended the monthly meetings of the Electricity Control Committees in the 57th Area and the 3rd District.

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ROADS - BRIDGES - SEWERS.

A general scheme of work has been put into effect whereby both the Genio Civile and the Municipio are working together cleaning up the streets, removing debris of bombed buildings, cleaning out sewers, and repairing bridges. In order to expedite this work as quickly as possible, we have arranged with the Genio Civile to submit to this office, load charts, showing the amount of loads per day hauled away by each vehicle (up to date there are 24 american vehicles working for the Genio Civile) in order to speed up load hauling. The average amount of loads being hauled by each truck to date is 8 in contrast to the average a month ago of 4. These loads are dependent upon the distance the debris must be hauled. In order to keep from hauling it all over Naples, we have located dumping points near the various jobs where the debris can be disposed of easily. This Section does not consider the work on the streets of Naples to be progressing satisfactorily, however, with the means at our disposal, we are applying pressure to get the work done. In the case of street repairs, they are being seriously held up because of a lack of materials. This Section has repeatedly tried to get materials, spending days and weeks attempting to break through the barrier of requisitions set up by the Allied Armies, depriving the use of the materials manufactured here to civilian organizations. In this category falls, cement, coal, acetylene, flashlights & batteries, oxygene, tires, tubes, caustic soda, bricks, lumber, crushed stone, asphalt, pipe and others.

These materials are needed to continue our work here. Up to the present time, what little material we have been successful in obtaining has been gotten by long, drawnout processes which were the result of horse trading deals made by this Section. These conditions cannot go on. We must get material if the work is to be done. The equipment needed to continue work here is practically all requisitioned by the Allied Army or Navy, therefore not at our disposal at all.

Work has started on sewer cleaning. After touring the whole network of sewers, this Section started the Genio Civile and the Municipio both working at once cleaning out these sewers which are a dangerous menace for mosquito breeding in the coming warm months. In some cases, there ^{is} ~~is~~ territory near these sewers which is swamp land. These Sections are also to be filled in with dirt or debris, so that mosquito breeding will be brought down to a minimum.

It was pointed out to both the Municipio and Genio Civile that they were to put different gangs of workmen on sections of these sewers so that the work could be accomplished in time. Every precaution has been taken in order to expedite this work at once.

Garbage is being removed from the streets now in a systematic manner. To facilitate this, metal barrels were located and placed all over the city of Naples, so that garbage could be put in them rather than throw it on the street. This system is working nicely and keeps all rubbish and filth off the street, minimizing the accumulation of flies.

This Section has managed to obtain 50 tons of cement from Salerno. This is to be doled out to the most urgent jobs of the Genio Civile and the Municipio so that work will not be bottle necked. In addition to this, it was possible to pry loose 5 additional tons from P.B.S. along with some paint to complete the work to be done on the Prefectura Bldg.

TRANSPORTATION.

This Section has put into service the Provincial Tramway System. For the present time, it is operating from Naples to Capodichino, and back to Naples. From Capodichino to Aversa and back. This tramway line does two things; it brings laborers into Naples from Aversa which are needed very badly by the Utilities Companies, and we are running freight cars during the day on this line, which are used to haul out rubbish and debris to a dumping area in the road to Aversa. The run to Aversa and back is done twice daily. In the morning and late at night.

The energizing of this tramway has been done in keeping with our rationing system of electricity.

During the bombing of April 25, 1944, the Circumvesuviana Railroad was stopped for a period, however it was running in full efficiency by 1500 hours the same day.

WATER.

The Naples Water Company will have completed the installation of water pipe from Naples to Bagnoli by the

end of May 1944. They have already laid over 2½ kilometers of pipe, the balance involves road crossings and the like, which this Section insisted on being done last so that traffic will not be tied up. This line will alleviate the water situation in Pozzuoli a great deal. The Genio Civile is now working on a supplementary line of water from the Pozzuoli reservoir to Pozzuoli, which was damaged at a point where it ran under the Military railroad tracks. This line, with the Naples Bagnoli, Pozzuoli line will take care of the water question in Pozzuoli completely. This Section arranged for some pipe (270 meters) which has been released and hauled by the Military Railroad for the Pozzuoli reservoir job.

GAS.

An auxiliary pipe line has been put into service in Corso Umberto I and an additional section of Naples has been given gas. In addition to this, the batteries at the gas works have been repaired, so that now, a steady service of gas for the assigned hours can be guaranteed. The large repair project on Via Stella Polare is being studied to coordinate the work with other jobs to be done on the same street. This is the last major job to be done in the city of Naples to the gas networks. For this job we have obtained the release of 2000 meters of 200 mm. pipe and arranged for its transportation to the gas works. As soon as all work to be done on this Section can be planned and coordinated, the gas works will start their work at the same time as the Water Company; the Circumvesuviana Railroad, Telephone Co. Genic Civile and Municipio.

COMMUNICATIONS.

This Section made an inspection of the following central offices and requested from P.B.S. and District 3, permission to give local service.

We received permission to open service in Pozzuoli and Sorrento from P.B.S. We have had no response on Castellammare and Torre Annunziata from District 3 as yet.

An inspection of the entrance of the telegraph cable from Naples to the edge of the town, following which telegraph service was opened on 22 April 1944 from Naples to all parts south.

Salerno has one telephone circuit during the day with three at night. All messages are telephoned to Salerno and from there they are transmitted by telegraph. This Section is handling between 500 to 600 telegrams a day, with the required time of 5 hours average from Naples to the furthest point.

SUBJECT: Electric Control

TO : Lt. Col. Lapper

The following is a resume of the work what I have been engaged in during the past month in Region 3 T.C.U. Office.

1) Applications for Electric Service - This office received many applications for electric service. Those applications with low priority were rejected in this office; applications with high priority were sent to the appropriate sub committee of Region 3. If an application was recommended by a sub committee it was returned to our office and we made a request to either P.B.S. or 57 Area that the service be connected.

2) Applications for large power loads were as follows:

a) Irrigation Project - Naples Province 2000 KW Off Peak Operation - Allocation approved.

b) Silk Factory, Caserta + 580 KW. On Peak Operation - Allocation approved and service connected.

c) Hemp Mills, Sarno - 400 KW at present with ultimate load of 1000 KW - On Peak Operation - Allocation approved and service connected.

d) Drainage Project - Naples Province - 300 KW Off Peak Operation - Allocation approved.

3) Peak Load Reduction - The following steps were taken to reduce the peak loads in Castellammare and Torre Annunziata.

a) Eliminated tramway service between Castellammare and Sorrento between the hours of 0850 and 1600 reducing the powerload by 400 KW during that period.

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b) Changed five factories from On Peak to Off Peak operations. These factories have a total connected load of 276 KW.

c) Ordered the disconnection of electricity in 26 Pastificio Factories where there was no apparent supply of raw materials. The total connected load of these factories was 1500 KW.

4. Peak Load Reduction in Naples: The schedules of the Circumvesuviana Railway, the Cumana Railway and the Autofilotramviaaria were reduced on March 13, 1944, the schedules were reduced between the hours of 0830 and 1400. We estimate a reduction of 1000 KW in load as a result of this reduction in schedule (See attached memorandum for details).

5. At the present time we have started a survey of the larger power consumers in Salerno. After completing this survey we propose to change certain factories from On Peak to Off Peak Operation and to discontinue the service on any factories where the operation is not essential.

Subject: Reduction of Peak Load - Naples

(1) The following reduction in schedules of tramways and filobus was made in Naples, March 13, 1944.

a) Circumvesuviana Railway -

1) Eliminated four round trips between Naples and Castellammare between the hours of 0830 and 1400.

2) Eliminated two round trips between Naples and Baiano between the hours of 0900 and 1320.

3) Eliminated two round trips between Naples and Pollena between the hours of 0930 and 1240.

b) Cumana Railway -

1) Eliminated six round trips between Naples and Bagnoli between the hours of 0840 and 1310.

2) Eliminated one round trip between Naples and Torregaveta between the hours of 0730 and 1110.

c) Azienda Autofilotramviaria (Filobus).

1) Eliminated 50% of buses between the hours of 0900 and 1400.

(2) Our estimate of the reduction in load due to this reduction in schedules is as follows:
