2. The duties of the Electrical Division include supervising the emergency rehabilitation of Italian Electric Facilities, many of which were intentionally damaged by the retreating enemy armies as they moved northward through Southern and Central Italy.

3. During his tour of duty with the Electrical Division, Captain Trommerhausen was engaged in supervising rehabilitation work. He followed projects involving hydro generating plants, high tension switching stations, and transmission lines. He repeatedly demonstrated outstanding initiative and leadership in finding the essential job to be done, and then in doing it in the face of war-time scarcity and confusion. He has the facility for working well with other people. He has shown himself to me to be technically qualified. I would be pleased to be associated with him at any future time.

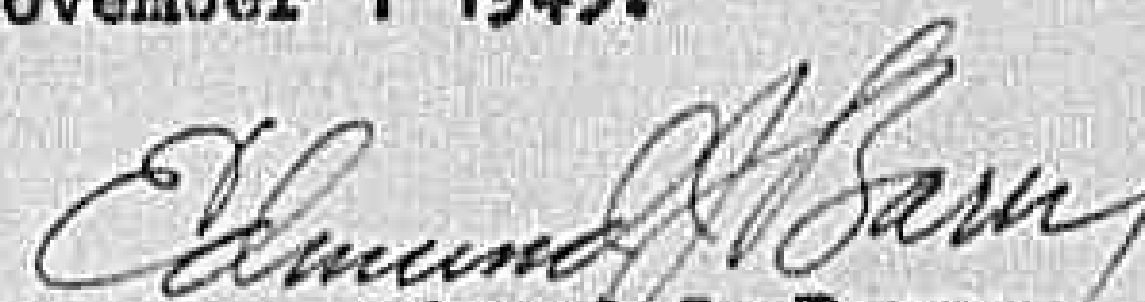

I presume you have learned from some of our engineers that we have started engineering and design work on a large construction program. The most important job is the installation of a 100,000-kw turbine-generator, with a 900,000-lb per hr high-pressure boiler, at Essex Generating Station. This project carries an AA-3 priority rating and construction work is scheduled to start in November of this year. We have purchased the turbine-generator and condenser, and we now are studying boiler proposals.

At the same time, we are proceeding with the complete reconstruction of the 26-kv switchyard at Burlington Generating Station, also under an AA-3 priority. In addition to these major projects, we have a number of smaller jobs under way and we foresee a considerable amount of power plant work in the near future.

The purpose of this letter is to acquaint you with our situation and to inform you that your services are needed here whenever you can be released from military service. Whether or not there remains additional work for you in the Army we, of course, do not know. If you feel that it is proper for you to request a release, however, we want you to know that there is important work here for you and we shall be very glad to take whatever steps are in order to facilitate your return to our employ.

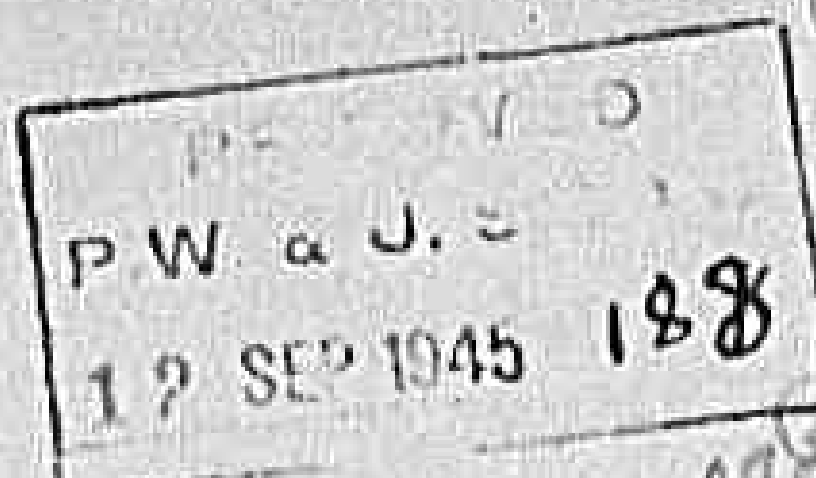

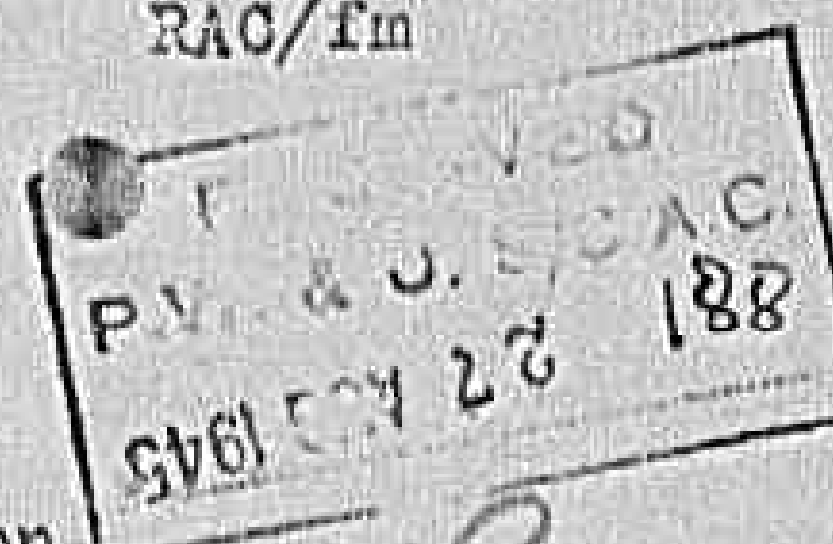

I presume you have learned from some of our engineers that we have started engineering and design work on a large construction program. The most important job is the installation of a 100,000 kw turbine-generator, with a 900,000 lb per hr highpressure boiler, at Essex Generating Station. This project carries an AA-3 priority rating and construction work is scheduled to start in November of this year. We have purchased the turbine-generator and condenser, and we now are studying boiler proposals.

At the same time we are proceeding with the complete reconstruction of the 26 kw switchyard at Burlington Generating Station, also under an AA-3 priority. In addition to these major projects we have a number of smaller jobs under way and we foresee a considerable amount of power plant work in the near future.

The purpose of this letter is to acquaint you with our situation and to inform you that your services are needed here whenever you can be released from military service. Whether or not there remains additional work for you in the Army, we, of course, do not know. If you feel that it is proper for you to request a release, however, we want you to know that there is important work here for you and we shall be very glad to take whatever steps are in order to facilitate your return to our employ.

SUBJECT: Release from service.

TO : Col. E.J. Ristedt,
Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission. Allied Commission.

1. Reference your 188/PWU dated 2 August '45 on the above subject.
2. It is rather urgent from a personal standpoint that I get home as soon as practicable for a period of 30 days. As to whether I am released from the service at that time makes no particular difference, but would like to be released when my services are no longer needed.
3. I have made no previous requests for furloughs or to go home on T.D. as I felt that there was still an important job to be done and did not care to have anyone say I deserted the ship. Now I feel that, with the probable turn-over to the Italian Government in the near future, my services here can be terminated.
4. My reason for wanting to go home within the next two or three months is as follows:
Shortly after I entered the service on Feb. 3, 1941, my wife found it necessary to take in her father and mother both of whom were getting feeble. Since that time either one or both have been bed-fast, and the mother had to undergo a serious operation about one year ago and has been confined to bed since that time. Her age makes it very doubtful whether she will ever be well again. The father too is not in good health and spends much of his time in bed. They have been a constant burden on my wife who is alone and the only daughter. My wife also had to undergo a serious operation in 1942 from which she has never fully recovered. Her normal weight is 115 lbs. but she is now down to 103 lbs.
The constant strain has begun to tell on her both physically and mentally and it is necessary for me to make a change at home as both of the old folks are now in bed most of the time. The old folks are not able to care for themselves and I will have to arrange for someone to care for them before cold weather as well as find some other place for them to live.
5. If I can get home long enough to straighten out the above situation, I would be willing to remain in the service as long as I am needed, but would prefer to have an assignment in the United States at least for several months until my conditions at home can be rectified. I am now on my 29 th month overseas.
