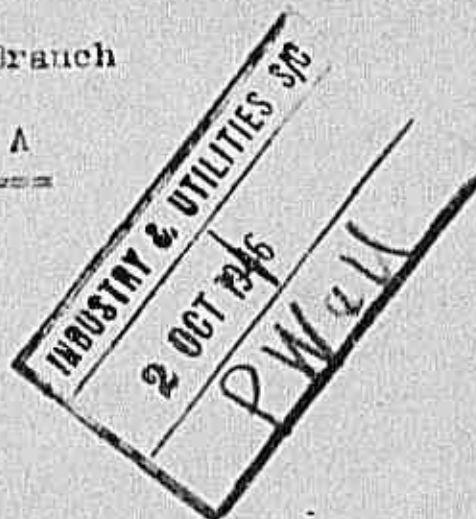

SUBJECT Electricity Rationing. Winter 1946-7.

TO HQ. AC ROME for Utilities Branch, Economics Section.

1. It is very necessary that we prepare a rationing scheme for Venezia Giulia should it become essential to restrict the consumption of electricity during the forthcoming winter.

2. Last winter we produced about 60% of our restricted consumption, the balance being fed in from the N. Italy grid.

3. It will assist in the preparation of our plans if we can be informed as soon as possible of what steps, if any, are contemplated for N. Italy as a whole.

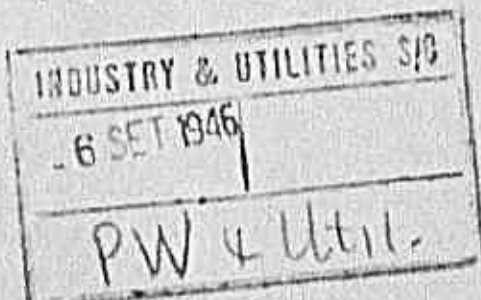
4. While we may not be faced with so acute a shortage of water as happened last winter the rehabilitation of industries may have seriously increased the consumption of energy over that of a year ago.

On the other hand it is believed that the coal situation at stand-by thermal plants is much better.

5. What guidance you can give will be much appreciated.

MEMORANDUM FOR FILE

Visit of Mr. VERDI and Mr. SEGONDI

The two above Italians arrived here from Switzerland on Saturday 31st March 1945. They had been in Switzerland for about one year but have been kept informed of the electrical situation in Northern Italy.

They have spent a few days with the Ministries discussing material requirements prospect for plant rehabilitation in the north and financial matters in connection with purchase of materials from Switzerland.

They visited this office again yesterday to have further discussions. Main points of interest are as follows :

- (a) - Existing transmission line from Bodio to Ponte Tresa - 80 KV 12/15 KW capacity. It is proposed to alter this line to 130 KV - 60 KW capacity.
- (b) - The Swiss are prepared to do this work; that is, increase height of towers, increase insulators and provide new aluminum conductor. Length of line is 40 Km. 80 tons of aluminum is required, but Verdi states that arrangements can be made for this to be allocated to the Swiss Company from stocks already in Switzerland.
- (c) - It is estimated that the cost of alteration will be 1.2 Millions Swiss francs. 6140
- (d) - Swiss will carry out the job if some guarantee is given for payment. Verdi states that Swiss will agree to receive payment in the unit charge. This is not quite clear to us since conditions in north may not be bad and small number of units may be taken; also that it is not quite clear which company will take the units. Verdi's answers to these questions did not appear to be satisfactory.

- (c) - It is clear that the Swiss will not commence work on the transmission lines until they have some guarantee that they will receive payment. After this is satisfactorily settled the work will take approximately six months to complete.
