

SUBJECT: Quarry crushing plants.

ANCONA, there are 2 crushing and 2 screening plants at dock N.4 waiting prime mover to be carried one to the quarry at the 55 Km. of route 77 and the other one to Campobasso quarry.

In both places roads are not tarred therefor gravel is urgently needed in rainy and snowy seasons.

Crushing plants may be operated only if each plant has five trucks available otherwise there will be halt of production for lack of transportation and space for dump as it happen at Montalto quarry. If transportation is not available when plants are operating waste of men power since gravel instead of being loaded directly at the plant has to be carried to a dump and thereafter loaded on trucks.

When gravel are needed to repairs very important roads there is an unquestionable necessity to help USVS to get gasoline.

The two additional plants of a different type which are now at the Farnesina must be fixed before being sent to other quarries.

PERUGIA, With memorandum n. 45 of July 26 I informed you that the crushing and screening plant working at Cammuccia and after at Olmo which had been sent to Gualdo Tadino in order to produce gravel for route N. 3.

At present the plant has been removed from the quarry and I went to D.C.R.E. Perugia in order to secure informations about eventual release of the plant needed at Olmi quarry for the roads of Perugia area.

Two british soldiers told me that the plant shall be sent to Bari. But by furter talks with Maj. Lewis (Garrison Engineer) I was informed that the plants is being kept idle at Foligno and that Maj. Lewis will ask to the 84 C.R.E. Colonel if plant is needed any longer. Next Saturday I shall get an answer.

1. As you have known, the company of which I was the manager before the war, offered me to take again the direction (technical and commercial) as soon as I would be free of the military duties. This company has worked, since my departure for joining the Allied Forces, in various operations, being very often in very bad position, and being compelled by the circumstances to draw money from my private account to pay the salaries of the personnel, but still keeping the organization in order to give me a chance of work in the line in which I was the only specialist in Italy if I had the luck to come back.

2. This company has now work in construction and constructional materials, and is again on a good basis in Milan, Naples and Rome. So, in my best personal interest, I think that I should sever my connections with the Allied Commission, where I had asked to work whilst I was in the British Army only hoping to do something good in protecting the Allied interests in the line in which I was more acquainted. The withdrawal of my commission, ~~xxx~~ recently occurred, influences also my decision, as my position now towards the Italian people is a little embarrassing. Doing so I will be able to give all my time to my company.

3. I then ask you to accept my resignation for the end of September, or earlier if possible. **504**

4. Of course you may rely on me for anything you think I could do for helping your work, if you consi-

-der that my experiance could be useful to you. This would be without any pay, as my aim is far beyond that point.

have been issued to day on rent from AC.PW. ASPHALT (Florence Agency) the American made truck, Plant n. 2, 1/2 tons, GMC, 6x6, in good condition, as from the release proceeding.

I have accepted the conditions indicated below, without exception or reserve.

1.- The truck will be only used on the works allotted to me by the Administration that rents the truck.

2.- The daily rent is one thousand Liras and I will pay them also for a fraction of a day. At the beginning of a 30 days period, I will pay to the special Office of "Genio Civile per la viabilità stradale" Florence, on order from AC.PW. ASPHALT, 30.000.-Liras, by a Bank of Italy cheque, amount of the rent paid in advance for the whole period.

3.- Should the rent be cut off before the end of the period, the U.S.V.S. Genio Civile will repay back to me the amount of the rent paid in advance for the days I have not used the truck.

3.- The AC.PW. ASPHALT will supply me the circulation permit, to be renewed every month or when the driver is replaced. On the Transport Work Ticket every trip of the truck must be daily written and signed either by myself or by a representative of mine.

4.- I will pay every sum concerning use of the truck as for instance pay the driver, fuel, lubricating oils, and everything else. I will pay also for the truck maintenance and for every necessary repair work, without exception.




