1. This Headquarters has given recognition to the Civilian Electricity Committee constituted under a provincial decree of the Prefect of 2 February for the RMSS Province. A copy of the minutes of the meeting of the Electricity Control Board, Rome Area Allied Command, dated 26 February 1945 is attached, in which the powers and duties of the civilian committee within Rome Area Allied Command are defined.

2. The Provincial Boundaries and the Military Boundaries do not co-incide, and since it is desirable that the same rules govern electricity distribution to all civilians within RMSS Province, it is suggested that the a/m Civilian Electricity Committee be also recognized by your HQ as the competent body to deal with all purely civilian electricity matters (within the terms of the attached Minutes) in that territory of RMSS Province which is outside the boundaries of Rome Area Allied Command, but within your Area. A copy of the minutes of the meeting relevant to the foregoing is also attached.

3. The full title and address of the Civilian Electricity Committee is as under:

MEMORANDUM

1. Reference your note on 213 PWAN S/C letter, dated 30th January attached.

2. As per para 2 a/m letter it is not correct that, at present, in Naples, all shops must close at 1500 hrs each day. Shops in Naples can be open after 1500 hrs but no shops can use electric energy after this hour. In connection with the increasing day-light time this schedule will be revised in the coming days.

This information has been given by Eng. Masoni of Società di Elettricità della Campania, when he visited this office a few days ago.

(Attention Regional Engineer)

- 1) - The demand for electricity in Rome continues to grow and this is causing some difficulty in meeting the supply to other areas of high priority.
- 2) - In the Naples area an order has been issued under which all shops must close at 15.00 hours each day. This has resulted in an appreciable saving in electricity and system demand during peak load hours.
- 3) - It is suggested that a similar arrangement may be made in Rome where there are many shops and signs lit up late in the evening. The order should include Barber Shops as we feel that the number of their establishments and the water heaters in use are causing much of the trouble.
- 4) - It is hoped that you will be able to put this arrangement into effect at an early date.

SUBJECT: Conservation of Electric Power Facilities
 of Italian Utilities

TO : All concerned.

1. A critical shortage of electric utility service exists throughout wide sections of occupied Italy. In order to conserve the limited supply of electric power available, and in order to meet the increasing military and essential civilian requirements, it is necessary that all possible means be utilized to reduce non-essential electric consumption from utility sources, by both military and civilian users in Italy.

2. The following steps will be taken to reduce loads on commercial electric systems:

a. LIGHTING.

- (1) Offices - No lights will be burned during daylight hours except in cases where natural lighting is insufficient for proper working conditions. Wattage of lamps will be limited to a minimum requirement, and fixtures will be located for most economical utilization of light source.
- (2) Halls and Stairways - Lamps in halls, corridors and stairways will be of the smallest wattage commensurate with safety, and a minimum number will be illuminated.
- (3) Hotel rooms, and private living quarters - No more than two (2) lamps per private living room or one (1) lamp per bath room with bay connected to be connected. No more than one

TO : All concerned.

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- (2) Halls and Stairways - Lamps in halls, corridors and stairways will be of the smallest wattage commensurate with safety, and a minimum number will be illuminated.
- (3) Hotel rooms, and private living quarters - No more than two (2) lamps per private living room or one (1) lamp per bath room ⁵⁰⁰ ₅₀₀ permitted to be connected. No more than one (1) lamp per private living room will be illuminated at the same time. The lamp bulb will not exceed 60 watt rating. Lighting, when permitted in living tents of military personnel, will be limited to one (1) lamp of 60 watt rating in pyramidal or small wall tent.
- (4) Public Space in Hotels, Cafes, Clubs, and public buildings - Reduce wattage to a bare essential commensurate with area, use and occupancy. Discontinue all electric signs or display lighting.
- (5) Other Military Facilities - Lighting of mess halls, kitchens, work shops, etc. will not exceed the following scale:

(6) <u>Outdoor Areas</u> - Guarded areas, POW enclosures, storage areas, streets, etc., will be lighted only in accordance with nec assy.	
(7) <u>TURN OFF OF ALL LIGHTS NOT IN USE.</u>	
Post signs conspicuously and make every individual economy-minded in use of electricity.	

b. HEATING AND COOKING.

- (1) Electric Heating will be permitted only in essential industrial processes engaged in production for the military effort, and in hospitals for the treatment of patients.
- (2) No electric cooking will be permitted.

c. POWER.

- (1) The use of electric power will be limited to:
 - (a) These industries contributing directly to the military effort or essential to the civilian economy.
 - (b) Installations necessary to safeguard public health.
- (2) Elevators will be operated by electric power only for movement of hospital patients or for heavy freight.
- (3) No electric motors will be allowed to idle for extended periods.
- d. ELECTRIC RAILWAY POWER will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFHQ (Italian) Board.
- e. ELECTROLYTIC PROCESSES AND ELECTRIC ARC FURNACES will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFHQ (Italian) Board.

3. Military Commanders will be responsible that these instructions are carried out within their jurisdiction of military installations.

Post signs conspicuously and make every individual economy-minded in use of electricity.

b. HEATING AND COOKING.

- (1) Electric Heating will be permitted only in essential industrial processes engaged in production for the military effort, and in hospitals for the treatment of patients.

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- (a) Those industries contributing directly to the military effort or essential to the civilian economy.
- (b) Installations necessary to safeguard public health.
- (2) Elevators will be operated by electric power only for movement of hospital patients or for heavy freight.
- (3) No electric motors will be allowed to idle for extended periods.

- d. ELECTRIC RAILWAY POWER will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFM (Italian) Board.

- e. ELECTRICITY PROGRESS AND ELECTRIC ARC FURNACES will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFM (Italian) Board.

3. Military Commanders will be responsible that these instructions are carried out within their jurisdiction of military installations, and civilian authorities will be required to enforce similar measures in those civilian installations which are allowed to receive electric service.

- 1) - Reference your memorandum 060/PWU, 1 Dec. 44 subject as above, and letter from the Mayor of Rome 18 Nov. 44, attached thereto.
- 2) - The Director of this Sub-Commission has not requested lighting for the City of Rome but noly that the city authorities survey their minimum requirements and submit a request for consideration.
- 3) - For security reasons street lighting is highly desirable.
- 4) - As to priority between street lighting and other establishments of high military and essential civilian priority, this must obviously be decided by the Electricity Control Board.
- 5) - This Sub-Commission can only urge that street lighting is an aid in the control of crime and suggest that conferences be had with the Provost Marshals of Rome on this subject.

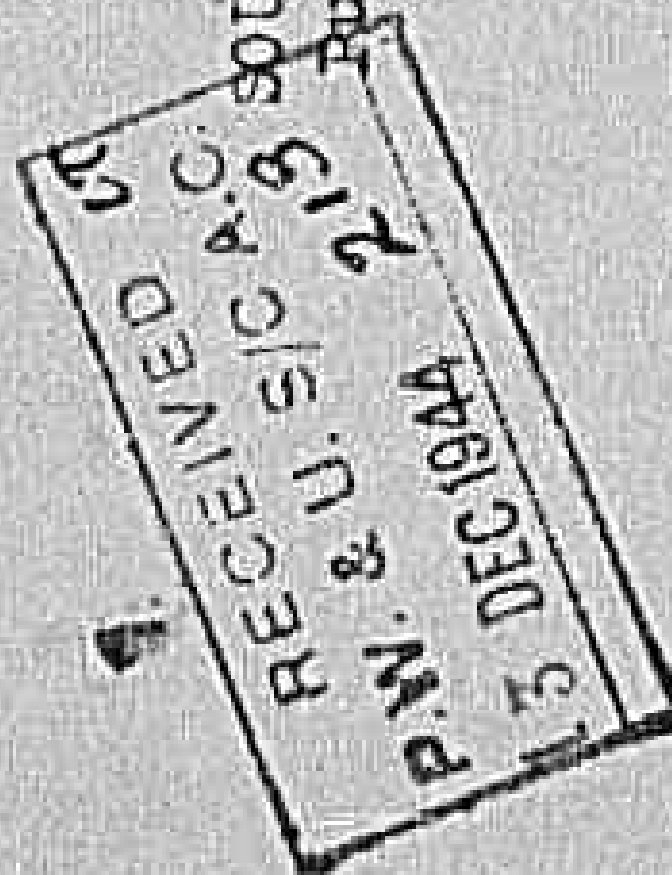

WHY NEW RESTRICTIONS ON THE TRAM-SERVICES ?

ATAC informs that, as the consumption of the electric power must be reduced, the filobus-lines 106 and 105 have been cancelled, the tram-lines 28,35 and 107 will not operate between 0900 and 1330 hrs and the beginning of the service on all radical and circular lines had been postponed till 0600 hrs.; above restrictions have become effective on the 27th ult.

Above sudden and unexpected communication of ATAC, divulged when the population had begun rejoicing at the slight improvement of the public services connected with the supply of electric power, has astonished everybody and we have made some investigations. It results that a 5 KVA alternator has been seriously damaged because the synchronous speed-regulator did not operate and the speed of the alternator exceeded the limits on account of carelessness by the persons charged with surveillance of the plant.

Several weeks and maybe even some months will elapse before the damages can be repaired thus enabling ATAC to re-operate presently cancelled or reduced services; and who must pay for that, it is always the population.

But besides above mentioned reason, there are other reasons for present reduction. The ice-industry consumes presently more electric power than that put at ATAC's disposal for the urbane tram service.

Why do not above industries work only on night-time, when there is even excess of hydroelectric power, so that water is wasted through the overflows, thus making it possible to increase ATAC's share?

We rather think that the main reason for the restricted supply of electric power to ATAC lies with the price of the electric power itself.

Electric Enterprises presently sell electric power for traction below cost so that they prefer to sell it elsewhere.

But if it is so, why do not the authorities intervene in order to avoid that the whole population be damaged to save particular interests?

MEMORANDUM

CONVERSATION WHICH TOOK PLACE AT S.R.E. ON 21 NOVEMBER 1944
10.00 HRS. BETWEEN CAPT. NEFF - ENCR. BIANCHI AND ENCR. DE
ROSSI ABOUT CERTAIN POINTS CONCERNING RATIONING SYSTEMS FOR
SPECIAL CASES.

A - Lighting

1) Two or more civil apartments fed by only one meter

According to rationing plan only a total of 10 KW is available per month.

We propose:

to supply 10 KW for every apartment in addition, as long as every apartment is completely separated from one another with its own services (kitchen, bath-room etc.)

2) Professional and commercial offices (doctors, lawyers, engineers etc.) joined to civil habitation and fed by the same meter of the house.

According to rationing plan these users are considered as habitations and only 10 KW are allowed monthly.

We propose:

to grant an increase of 10 KW per month for the professional or commercial office on condition that the activity is authorized by Professional and Commercial Syndicates.

3) Artisan laboratories (tailors, mechanics, dentists, hair-dressers etc.) joined to civil habitation and fed by the same meter of the house.

According to rationing plan they are considered as habitations and only 10 KW are allowed per month.

We propose:

to grant 10 KW per month for the artisan laboratory on condition that the user is signed at the Artisans Federation and has a permit for his activity.

4) Convents, colleges with united churches, schools, charity institutions fed by one meter.

According to rationing plan they are considered as convents and 0.50 KW monthly are given for every cohabiting.

We propose:

to grant an increase of energy varying according to cases kept within the highest limit of 25% of the normal monthly use in the first two months 1944.

5) Ovens, mills, bakeries, oil-presses

According to rationing plan the allowed use depends on the meter's capacity, as for all the other stores. But this is quite insufficient for the work executed depends on the raw materials at their disposition.

We propose:

to grant monthly a consumption equal to the utmost of 1943.

6) Hospitals and clinics

According to rationing plan they are assimilated to the Hospitals and pensions. 0.75 KW monthly per cohabiting is granted. Many users complained such small quantity. They ought to be preferred since they absolutely need light even at night time in the sick rooms, first-aid places, stairs etc.

We propose:

to grant a consumption equal to 50% of the normal monthly use in the first two months 1944.

7) Nocturnal pharmacies

They are treated as every store.

We propose:

to grant a monthly use equal to the 50% of the normal monthly use in the first two months 1944.

8) Tolerance houses

They are treated as cohabitations (0.75 KW per person). The Prefect of Rome noticed that they are used for public health and that for superior disposition windows are always safely closed.

We propose:

to grant a use equal to the normal monthly one of the first two months 1944.

9) Editorials and newspaper printing houses

According to rationing plan the allowed use varies with the meter's capacity; but this quantity is insufficient because work is almost all done at night time.

We propose:

to exonerate these users from discipline.

10) Night schools

Are treated as offices.

We propose:

to grant a use 50% of what monthly used in the first two months 1944.

11) Various cases

Many users wrote asking to have more quantity of light to keep up with their activities: newspaper men, State Officers, Political Party Seats.

We propose:

to send requests to Electrical Section RAAC.

B) - Motive power

- 1) All quantities granted are commensurate to the normal monthly use of the first two months 1944.

Certain users are active in some seasons only: lifting of water, industrial refrigerators, brick factories, open shows etc.

We propose:

To commensurate the allowed according to the normal use verified in the period of normal activity.

2) Newspaper printing

According to rationing plan the allowed use is 50% of the one in the first two months 1944

We propose:

to exonerate these users from normal rationing.

3) Mills, pastries and industrial refrigerators, oil-pressers

Allowed use depends on the one of the first two months 1944.

Said categories work in relation to raw materials at their disposition.

We propose:

to grant a monthly quantity equal to the utmost ⁵²¹ needed in 1943.

ECONOMY IN THE USE OF FUEL, LIGHT and GAS

AFHQ Circular Number 8, 1943 is rescinded and the following substituted therefor :

- " 1) - A continuing effort is being made to reduce wherever possible the importation of coal from the United Kingdom and United States for use in this theater. This effort is essential and in fact directed by the Combined Chiefs of staff because of the definite world shortage of coal and the amount of shipping required to move a commodity of such bulk.
- 2) - Sardinian coal and Italian lignite will hereafter be used as a substitute for imported coal wherever such substitution can be made.
- 3) - The allocation of coal for consumption in electric and gas plants and other industries is made by this headquarters. The allocations are based on the minimum essential requirements of the various plants and industries. Civilian consumers are rationed in light and gas and are denied coal for space heating. It is, therefore, essential that the military consumption of electric power and gas be kept to the essential minimum in order to conserve coal. Reference is made to AFHQ letter, AG 675/171 GDS-0 of 31 October 1944, subject : "Conservation of Electric Power Facilities of Italian Utilities." Where necessary, a system of rationing or other means of control will be instituted by area commanders concerned.
- 4) - With imports of coal limited to the bare minimum in order to insure a steady supply for operational demands, any wastage of gas and light or fuel will affect the stocks imported. The use of solid fuel for cooking, water heating, and space heating will be to Sardinian coal, lignite or wood.
- 5) - Allowances of fuel for troops whose maintenance is a British responsibility will be as stated in AFHQ Ration and Fuel Scales Pamphlet as notified in G.R.O. 570/43. Allowances for United States troops will be in accordance with MTOUSA Circular Number 133, 1944."

Dear Hughes,

1. I am asking Capt. Laughlin to hand this letter to you as he is attending your meeting to-day. There are some matters of extreme seriousness which, in my view, demand attention.

You are well aware that the machinery at the generating stations in Rome is in a state of constant breakdown and difficulty. Every additional unit of electricity that it has to produce is produced at the cost of time that should be spent on the endless repairs necessary to it. In short, there is no stand-by plant, and if the plant that is working could have rest periods, its standard of maintenance might be at least slightly improved. A reduction of the load on it, during day-light hours, would at least help towards this. The coal supply situation is disastrous, as you well know, and supplies are simply "from hand to mouth". Here, again, constant demands for current make it impossible to build up any reserve stocks.

2. It seems to me that your Committee is issuing orders, with little regard for their actual enforcement. These orders are, in fact, being flagrantly flaunted. I give two examples. Ten days ago we were ordered in this building to stop all lift service. It has 8 floors. We complied, although at the cost of the gravest inconvenience or even more, viz. an element of danger to health in the case of a large number of the staff, not in their first youth who have now to climb 8 floors not twice a day, but several times a day, because of frequent conferences and visits to other officers lower down.

At the same time I was told last week, and I confirmed it by sending an officer to check it, that lifts in certain

Italian Ministry buildings were continuing in operation.

3. Even more important is what we discussed together a fortnight ago, viz. the excessive use of electricity by the local Tram service. I have before me copy of a letter giving orders to the Tram Company, dated 23rd October, to become effective on the 24th Oct. and signed by Lt. Wade-Brown. The chart attached to it shows, amongst various other things, no service of trams at all between 7.30 a.m. and 12 midday on Sundays.

Yesterday, on my own observation, I can say that the order was not complied with, and that throughout the day, for 13 or 14 hours there was a service, not less than 20, to 30 trams per hour along a particular road. It seems to me that this should be drastically attended to.

4. You and I agreed the other day that the only way to deal with this Tram Company, and to make them reduce their demand, which is little less than 50,000 units a day, was to give them a time-table of the frequency of their services. This was apparently not done by Lt. Wade-Brown, who merely gave them the charts.

5. I utterly fail to understand why, with the lighting situation so disastrous in this city, this company should be allowed to use as much electricity as would illuminate ^a hundred thousand houses for several hours. In England, for three years, our public service vehicles have been drastically curtailed, ~~and~~ on Sundays only a very few running in the afternoons, ~~on Sundays~~ with none in the mornings. On my own personal observation, the passengers on these trams yesterday, all day long, were "on pleasure bent", probably merely going to see their friends.

6. Anyhow, I would like to know what is the good of issuing orders such as these, about the working of lifts and the runnings of trams, when the Italians pay no attention to them whatever.

With the lighting situation so serious, and indeed the generating capacity at the two stations also, I see no ^{reason} why these trams should not have their number of units ⁵²⁰ but down drastically from 50,000 to say 10,000 units, i.e. with a skeleton service in the mornings and evenings only, restricted to genuine workers only by special tickets, such as we have

in England and on Sundays say a 10 minutes service in the afternoons only. In any event, the tram service ought to stop at sunset every day, so as to allow the energy to be available for lighting as many houses as possible, from say 5 p.m.

6.

Under the recent AFHQ Memorandum Nr. 43 of 5th Oct., a copy of which you have, it is the responsibility of this Sub-Commission to produce the electricity. It is extremely disquieting to use to find that, at any rate in our opinion, it is not being used to the best advantage, and, secondly, that such orders as you do issue are being flagrantly disobeyed.

From the newspaper "Corriere di Roma", 25 October 1944, I read that supply of electric power to the bakeries shall be 50% of the KW consumed during the month of January 1944.

This same newspaper doesn't mention the hour of the supply, nor the category to whom bread workers belong.

We communicate that :

- 1) On January 1944 bread wasn't worked every day, every other day and the quantity of flower was less because bread ration per day was gr. 150 while now it is gr. 200.
- 2) It is necessary to have a supply of electric power for 8 following hours in order to have a regular bread production.

It is therefore requested :

- 1) To increase ,83% , the electric power used by the bakeries on the past month of January.
- 2) to fix for every bakery the same hour of electric power supply which would preferably be from 2200 to 0600.

Please make us know your decisions for we must inform all Roman bakeries.

Reference your D.O. to ANTOLINI dated 21 October received 25 October. (271)

para 1. Lt. Wade-Brown is the only technical member of the Committee, but Capt. Neff E & M under Col. Medding RAAC and Capt. ^{Hawk} E & M to CRE 104 both attend in an advisory capacity. -

para 2. Without knowledge of the working of the committee 'CHAOTIC' seems a bit strong, that it is capable of Improvement. I agree and what I should like to see in theory was

- (a) Military Requirements specified up to them to screen and necessary KW allotted.
- (b) Remainder available for Civil use - ACC cum Civilian settle allocation.-

In practice it cannot be thus simplified on account of Military and civil consumers being on the same circuits.

I do NOT like the system under which all demands go to the committee and like other things in RAAC there is a lack of definition of duties between Military and A.C.C. -

With one E & M officer for the whole Region it is out of the question him tackling the question unaided without the assistance given willing and with full cooperation by C.E. RAAC.-

Prior to your letter I discussed that with my E & M officer and attach the classification of demands and the lines on which each classification could be dealt with.

Further the SINDACO has appointed a Committee for Coordination of Technical Services. I attended the first meeting last week and they are out to cooperate. - The Electrical Sub-Committee has since met several

times and placed its views before ^{my} Eng. E & M office on 24th inst. - It will help and particularly so in educating the public to the need for stringent economy if given a chance.

I suggested an ACC member of Board ^{asked} ~~one~~ ^{my} officer to suggest it. *This was agreed in principle except Civilian. Intervention -*

para 3. A new Rationing scheme was prepared to come into force on 1st November which is a first step and if successful will be further developed. - At first I did not like it especially the half time darkness but after going into with my E & M officer I am satisfied that even by cutting of trams entirely they cannot risk the full city lighting load on at once.

With the lighting load coming on earlier the committee on 25th decided to reduce ~~every~~ tramload - and it is being watched closely. -

To check of it
The FRASCATI line does run including Sunday. Some days ago I spoke to E & M officer about this and instructed him to go into the reasons as it appeared to me largely a luxury line.

The VITERBO line in my opinion carries too many passengers and too little food and my opinion has been sent in to Region a week ago. -

para 4. The policy up till now of the RAAC Electrical Control Board appears to have been to use available Energy too close to maximum with no margin, and you will probably wish to Rest your machines. -

The latest proposal ^{emanating} ~~concerning~~ from the Meeting of Lt. Wade-Brown with Civil Sub-Committee is to use only the Hydro Energy for Night load (say 11pm to 5am).

The using up of coal in excess of allocation is NOT responsibility of RAAC Control Committee who cannot use energy NOT theirs but indicates need for information being passed from suppliers to consumers.

para 5. 6. The general AAI instruction for Italian Government Territory also indicates that RAAC should eventually relinquish control but definitely NOT before adequate officers are provided to undertake the load. My present staff of one E & M officer could NOT do it unaided. -

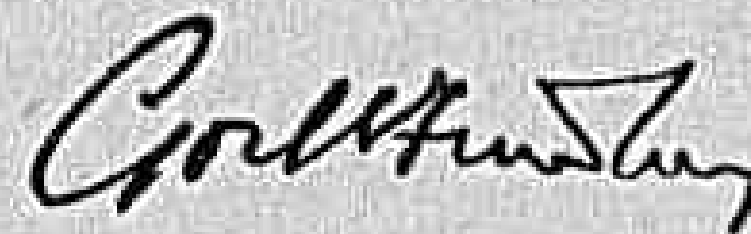
ACC requirements are represented at present and are given a priority above Civil and Lt. Wade-Brown advises me that ^{under} the new Rationing scheme, the RAAC Board have every intention of curtailing

non priority demands (such as Hospitals) - For example lifts in Military Hotels and Military offices have been ordered to be stopped some time ago.

GENERAL. In my opinion Military Needs and amenities should have precedence over Civil amenities although Military Amenities should NOT have precedence over Civil Necessities. Therefore RAAC must continue to have at least a strong representation and if need be Powers of Veto which I think indicate an RAAC Chairman. -
