My dear Jim:

Your letter of 4th February reached me a short time ago. I was, of course, aware of the nature of the directive creating the Central Electrical Board. It is considerably different from the original concept which I discussed with you, but as Vice-Chairman (Executive) of the Board, you are nevertheless presumably in a position to accomplish the rehabilitation of the power system in a coherent coordinated manner.

The Chairman (Chief Engineer, ACMF) will probably leave to you the planning and coordination of effort behind the Army Rear Boundary as he will be preoccupied with operational problems. Your board will prepare projects, state what work is to be done, and designate the agencies to do it. I believe it is distinctly within your power to direct movement of major electrical equipment from one part of Italy to another. In your capacity as coordinating agency you can certainly pass on requisitions for major items of electrical supplies and equipment.

In summary, it seems to me that you have all the necessary power to do the job despite the fact that you must direct the operations of construction through intermediary agencies rather than direct.

1. A conference was held at Caserta at 15.30 hrs on Saturday 22 January 1944 at which the following were present:

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DRAFT ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION

CONSTITUTION OF ELECTRIC POWER DIRECTORATE, A.C.M.F.

1. There will be constituted as part of H.Q., A.C.M.F., an Electric Power Service. Colonel James P. Crowdon is appointed head of this Service with the title of Director, E.P.S.
2. The field of responsibility of the E.P.S. will correspond with the area controlled by A.C.M.F., and for planning purposes future possible areas of operations by A.C.M.F.
3. While the Director, E.P.S. will exercise unrestricted technical authority, he will operate under the general direction of C.E., A.C.M.F., to ensure co-ordination in demands for and the employment of military engineer stores, engineer troops, labour, transport, etc.
4. The Electric Power Service will be responsible for the rehabilitation, technical development and operation of Italian state and privately owned electric power generating installations, including such transmission and transformation facilities as may be necessary to the restoration of the primary grid system. The Director will also ensure that action taken by Districts, Base Sections etc, in connection with local distribution systems and using facilities conform to the general plan of development. This applies equally to work carried out by the forward troops in Army areas.
5. The Electric Power Service will make the maximum use of

While the Director, E.P.S. will exercise unrestricted technical authority, he will operate under the general direction of C.E., A.C.M.F., to ensure co-ordination in demands for and the employment of military engineer stores, engineer troops, labour, transport, etc.
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5. The Electric Power Service will make the maximum use of civil labour, civil organization and material available locally.
6. In so far as it is necessary to employ military resources the Director will operate through existing military engineer organizations. He will arrange to supplement these organizations by the attachment of such additional technical staff to Base Sections, Districts, Area etc, as may be necessary and agreed between him and the Commanders concerned.

7. When no assistance from military resources is involved the Director will deal with the Italian civil organization, establishing for the purpose such local field organization as he may consider necessary.

8. The Director will deal direct with the users of electric power to prepare estimates of their requirements. Allocation of power to meet these requirements will be made by the Electric Power Committee of the Local Resources (Italian) Board, to which body the Director will present the estimates referred to above and his recommendations thereon.

9. Priorities for reconstruction and development will be laid down by D.C.A.C., A.C.L.P., who will receive advice on this matter from the Local Resources (Italian) Board (Electric Power Committee).

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DRAFT ADMINISTRATIVE INSTR.

CONSTITUTION OF ELECTRIC POWER DIRECTORATE A.C.M.F.

Responsibility for the operational control of existing ^{Italian} power organisations will be transferred to the Electric Power Directorate as soon as possible, dates being agreed between the Director and C.E., A.C.M.F.

The Electric Power Directorate will deal direct with A.C.C./A.M.G. in regard to its requirements of stores and equipment not obtainable locally by requisition.

In principle the Electric Power Directorate will make use of local civil labour, but Allied or Italian troops may be placed at its disposal by H.Q., A.C.M.F., if necessary.

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The Director, Electric Power Directorate, will deal direct with the users of electric power to prepare estimates of their requirements. Allocation of power to meet these requirements will be made by the Electric Power Sub Committee of the Local Resources (Italian) Board, to which the Director, Electric Power Directorate will make recommendations based on estimates referred to above.

The Electric Power Directorate will set up such field organisations composed of Italian technical personnel as may be necessary to supervise the work of re-construction and operation. It will be the duty of these field organisations to co-ordinate the construction work of the Directorate with local distribution construction undertaken by Base Sections, Districts, etc.

The Director, Electric Power Directorate will present to D/C.A.V., A.C.M.E. details of the organisation which he will require to carry out the above responsibilities, in order that application may be made to A.F.M.C. for such personnel as cannot be found from resources available locally.

ELECTRIC POWER AND ELECTRIC POWER FACILITIES, ITALY

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1. Electric power facilities in Italy are heavily interconnected between systems and regions. The great bulk of power is generated in hydroelectric plants which in most cases are dependent upon seasonal flow of water. This requires seasonal interchange of energy. Frequencies vary also as 42, 45 and 50 cycles are used depending upon the region and the system.

2. Electric power must therefore, be dealt with on an overall basis if the war effort is to be most effectively served. The facilities for generating, transmitting and transforming the energy must be considered collectively and from a coordinated stand-point. This will become increasingly important as damage and demolition occur from the hands of the enemy. There is much evidence of this condition already.

3. Emergency facilities to meet essential military and civilian needs must be planned for and dealt with on an overall basis also. These must precede the operation of rehabilitated, existing or other more permanently installed equipment. The availability of emergency equipment is limited due to the needs for other theaters of operations. Requirements in Italy must be weighed along with requirements elsewhere. Consequently emergency facilities must be moved from one location to another as the need arises.

4. To meet the need for having electric power available for the necessary military and civilian uses there is hereby established an Electric Power Directorate which will be responsible for accomplishing the following:

a. The securing and organizing of a competent staff of experienced personnel.

b. The operation of existing, emergency, and rehabilitated generation, transmission and transformation facilities already within allied control.

c. To plan ahead in a similar manner for those areas not yet in allied control.

It is not the purpose of the Electric Power Directorate to deal with the problems relating to local distribution facilities which remain the responsibility of the local area command.
