In the last days some towers of the 60 KV line Matese-Benevento have been cut and brought away. Our patrols sent on the place have reported that the towers are 4:

Number 31-32 near the village of San Potito

" 56-57 " " " Gioia Sannitica

Two of the above towers (31-32) were in good conditions, the other two were damaged but could have been repaired. They have been cut with oxygen and acetylene. According to the reports of men of the place the work would have been done by soldiers of the Army.

We are now trying to investigate where the towers have been used.

This evening we have received news that about 20 poles of the telephonic line Fratta-Liri (now under repair) have been taken away. We have sent patrols to investigate about the exact number of poles and their locations.

SUBJECT : Theft of electrical conductor and material

TO : Chief Commissioner - A.O.C.

1. The theft of transmission line conductor and other electrical material continues to increase. This is seriously interfering with the war effort. Unless it is stopped the supply of power for military and essential civilian requirements will be seriously curtailed and the transmission of power to Rome prevented.

2. It is requested that action be taken to stop such thefts and to apprehend and punish the thieves. Immediate action is required on the transmission line Pratianaggio-Liri in the vicinity of Villa Literno and Cellole Cross.

TO : C.E. A.C.M.F.

1. Within the last two or three days - (exact date unknown) ? wooden poles on the telephone line paralleling the transmission line from Naples to Rome have been taken down and carried away. It is reported to have been done by soldiers using military transport. The poles were removed in the vicinity of Cancello Arnone which is 5th Army Area.
2. This telephone line is essential for the construction and operation of the transmission line to Rome.

1. Reference your letter dated 7 March '44 regarding the removal of poles from the Telephone Line paralleling the power transmission line from NAPLES to ROME.

2. The Signals Officer this H.Q. feels that these poles were removed for operational communications in the forward area due to a shortage of poles there.

3. Poles in considerable quantities are now being railed forward so that such cannibalization of disused lines should not be necessary in future. The Signals Officer is, however, issuing an instruction that this line is not, as far as possible, to be interfered with.

Subject: Theft of Electrical Conductor and material.

To : Regional Commissioners,
Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VIII, IX.
S.C.A.O., A.G., 5 Army.
S.C.A.O., A.G., 8 Army.

1. The Chairman of the Central Electrical Board, A.C.E.F. has brought to the attention of the Chief Commissioner the increasing incidence of theft of transmission line, conductor and other electrical material connected with electrical supply.
2. These incidents are seriously interfering with the war effort and unless they are stopped the supply of power for military and essential civilian requirements will be seriously curtailed and the transmission of power to Rome and the North prevented in the future. Cases of theft are particularly bad from the transmission line Frattavoglio-Liri in the vicinity of Villa Literno and Colle di Crocella.
3. Regional Commissioners will take immediate action to prevent these incidents. Directions or advice should be given to the CC.RR and the courts in order to ensure that rigorous punishment is meted out to convicted offenders. The question of collective punishment should be considered and everything possible should be done to bring this type of theft to an end.

CSO A.A.I. Technical Instruction No. 15 15 March 44.

Utilisation of Power Transmission Lines
for Telephone Communications.

1. Instances are occurring of unused or damaged power transmission lines being employed for telephone communications.
2. This practice is dangerous as such lines are being repaired and re-energised as rapidly as possible.
3. Where such lines are utilised, a special report will be made to CSO AAI in order that the Power Authorities may be informed.
