Reference my cable to you yesterday copy attached:-

Some days ago the Minister informed me that Dott. Ing. GIUSEPPE CENZATO had been appointed to his Ministry as his electrical expert.

Signor CENZATO called at the Office yesterday with very full details and statistics regarding the Societa Meridionale d'Electricita (S.M.E.) of which he is the Head. The Society covers the whole of present Occupied Italy.

Having had the good fortune to erect several Power Lines for the Central Electricity Board in England, I was able, although no expert, to talk reasonably intelligently to him, and to learn something of his intentions and difficulties with regard to linking up for the supply of electricity to ROME. He was not counting on the PESCANA Supply but had certain plans for increased production in the NAPLES Area.

Learning, that he and you had not met, and realizing the importance of such a meeting, I gave him your name and undertook to give you his address.

I enclose copy of the front page of one of the dossiers which he left with the A.C.C. Industry & Commerce Advanced Post here. This will show the extent of his activities. At a rough estimate 50% of these resources are available to-day. This dossier also contains details of consumption by industries in 1942, (classed as Large, Middle and small) in the five Regions.

Please command me.

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If I can be of any further assistance please command me.

NOTES ON ITALIAN ELECTRICAL MANUFACTURE
AND ELECTRIC POWER COMPANIES

The principal electrical manufacturing companies with whom the writer has had contact are the Marelli Company and the Magneti Marelli Company, both located in Milan. Also the Magrini Company located in Bergamo, 50 kilometers northeast of Milan and the Electric Department of Ansaldo located in Genoa.

The Ercole Marelli Company of Milan manufactures all kinds of electrical equipment except switchgear. The chairman is Mr. Benni, one of the most important industrialists in all Italy. At one time he was a member of the cabinet in Rome in charge of Italian industries. This company made a license agreement with the Westinghouse Company about 1934, and therefore uses Westinghouse designs extensively on larger machinery. It is a long established and successful company with a good record for quality of workmanship.

The Fabbrica Italiana Magneti Marelli of Milan is owned 50% by Marelli and 50% by Fiat of Turin. It manufactures sparkplugs, radios, storage batteries, and magnetos. Before the war, it was the leading firm in Italy on this class of material. Its chairman is Mr. Quintaballi, who is known as an extremely resourceful and aggressive manager. I recall that he used to visit the United States almost every year in search of new ideas for his plant. The Magrini Company manufactures switchgear, in which it occupied a leading position in Italy. Since 1928, it has had a license agreement with Westinghouse and consequently, its designs have been modified toward American practice. Likewise, the Westinghouse Electric had until 1941, a controlling interest in this company through ownership of shares. The chairman of this company for some years prior to 1941 was Mr. Aldo Tamai, who had also been Westinghouse representative in Italy since 1925. Mr. Tamai is loyal in his duties to Westinghouse. He enjoys a good reputation and broad acquaintances in Italy.

The Electric Department of the Salado Company in Genoa received a license from Westinghouse about 1937 to build a certain specialized rectifier equipment. This firm has specialized in building electrical equipment for locomotives, but has also built substations for railway electrifications which include transformers and the converting equipment. We will endeavor to locate the names of some of the manufacturers of this group.

It should also be mentioned that the Compagnia General di Electricita of Milan is an important company having connections with American General Electric Company, and there was also an approachment arranged about 1938 between this company and the Marelli Company. The chairman for 1940 was the Marquis Caragani, who was for a number of years employed by the General Electric Company in their Paris Branch.

GENERAL NOTE:

-2-

The quality of Italian workmanship on electrical material has noticeably improved in the past twenty-five years. Presumably this advance has been greatly aided by contact with American firms and a knowledge of American designs. One proof of this is that electric locomotive equipment built back in 1912 to American designs have operated very successfully up to latest records. Furthermore, it is known that the Magrini Company supplied a considerable quantity of large high-voltage circuit breakers to the USSR with favorable results. Also, other Italian companies have supplied large power transformers to Russia which have operated successfully.

ELECTRIC POWER COMPANIES:

While German firms had a large share in making original promotions of power companies in Italy, this German capital was liquidated as a result of the First World War. However, Swiss, French, and Belgium capital came to Italy in the early part of this century for promoting power companies, and some of this still remains.

One of the prominent Swiss developments was the Adriatica near Venice, but it may be that Italian interests have taken over most of the Swiss shares in this instance.

The Societa Anglo Romano supplying power to the City of Rome was, according to last reports, under Belgium control. Furthermore, a considerable amount of Swiss and French capital was invested in the Meridionale de Electricita in Southern Italy.

With these exceptions, we believe that power producing companies of Italy are under Italian ownership. Our records show that in 1925 Italy had about 2,000,000 k.w. of electric power stations including both steam and hydraulic. Since that time, there has been little expansion of termic plants, but it is reported that by 1940, the hydro-electric development amounted to about 3,000,000 k.w., which represents about 50% of the total possible water power in Italy.

Unfortunately, during the development of Italy, the Seiman's Company adopted 42 cycle frequency on their plants, whereas Gantz and Company of Budapest, who engineered a number of plants used 50 cycles. There was also a tendency on the part of the Swiss to use 42 cycles. As a result, we find that Northern Italy has a great deal of 42 cycle current, which includes the whole area around Milan. Turin happens to be 50 cycles, as is the case in Central Italy. However, Southern Italy has both 50 cycles and 42 cycles.

We have no way of judging the state of repair or condition of Italian plants. However, it is our opinion that stocks of repair

materials would be very much limited. It has been a difficulty in Italy for the last six years in getting critical materials, and copper has been especially scarce. Hence, it is probable that any materials available would have to be used in actually producing power.

Dear Col. Growdon:

I didn't have an opportunity to give you the background of Dr. Mortara. I had not known him during my visits to electric and gas utilities in Italy but we had mutual friends in those industries. My subsequent contacts with him and my knowledge of the character of the various installations which he constructed or which he had under his charge lead me to believe that he is an engineer of ability and good executive qualifications in the Italian field.

His firsthand detailed knowledge of the field of operations of the Meridionale Company, extending north of Naples to the toe of the Italian boot, is extensive. This specialized knowledge may be of importance in the working out of plans for both temporary restoration of limited service and ultimate rehabilitation of the plants in that area if someone wishes to make use of his special knowledge. He was Chief Engineer of Meridionale.

His knowledge, of course, is not confined to the southern part of Italy. He has visited many of the other Italian installations and has come in contact with a number of other Italian engineers.

If there is some contribution which he can make, I am sure he will be glad to do so if you call him.

Dear Col. Growdon:

There has not been time to rewrite the accompanying list of names. A number has been assigned to each name and following are the comments on the individuals. The list was prepared hurriedly. Some names appear in it by error. Some of those mentioned may have been long since or recently dead or may have changed their employment. The comments are not in numerical order but in an order that would seem to classify the individuals. Neglect the notation of page numbers appearing occasionally. They were for my personal reference in making up the original list.

The positions and addresses listed may be much out of date. They give some indication, however, of the importance of the individual or may help to locate him through inquiry of someone who is still in the employ of the Company mentioned.

No. 28 - I regard him as the most outstanding electric utility leader in the country. He has built up the largest enterprise, is a man of great integrity and of force. I believe there is no one who could be more helpful if he decided to cooperate. His standing is such that he should be treated with the highest consideration, for he occupied a very dignified position and he should not be left to be handled by subordinates or one who would not realize the diplomacy proper in such a case. He will speak his mind freely and is a man of courage. No one knows the electric utility situation throughout the whole of the country as well as he. He is named first because of his especial importance. He does not speak English but speaks French fluently.

No. 33 - He is not an electrical engineer but was one of Italy's greatest industrialists. He is a man of honor and high standing. Besides heading the Pirelli Rubber Industry he was an officer or director in many of the largest electric utilities, so he would be a source of information of men of ability and standing in the electric industry. He speaks English.

No. 10 - An engineer of importance as well as being head of the Meridionale Company which serves most of Italy south of Rome. His assistance would be especially helpful in that portion of the country. He has visited the United States and speaks some English.

No. 14 - Was an engineer of importance but some years ago retired from his position as head of one of the large companies operating in the north of the country west of Milan. He might be helpful in giving names of engineers who would cooperate. Does not speak English.

No. 46 - Took the place of No. 14. Is an engineer of standing and could be helpful. Neither he nor No. 14 have been in contact with citizens of the United States.

No. 20 - Headed the important group of Companies operating in the eastern portion of northern Italy. A man of standing who could be helpful in giving names

No. 79 - Headed the important S.I.P. group of Companies operating in western part of northern Italy, after the disappearance of No. 34. I did not know him but Dr. M. points him out.

No. 80 - Headed the Rome group of Companies after the passing on of those heads I knew. He is mentioned by Dr. M.

No. 18 - Was engineer in responsible charge of the Milan group of Companies, the largest group in Italy. An able man. He speaks some English. Has been in this country and made contacts with United States engineers.

No. 32 - Was an engineer in responsible charge of the S.I.P. group of Companies in the western part of northern Italy. A capable man. Think he severed his connection some years ago and was doing a consulting business.

No. 21 - Was engineer in responsible charge of the group of companies in eastern part of northern Italy. Did not speak English. There is an impression that he may be dead.

No. 36 - Was an engineer in charge of the "Conti" group of Companies in northern part of Italy. Did not have much contact with people of this country.

No. 39 - A capable engineer in responsible charge of important plants in central northern Italy.

No. 49 - A capable engineer in charge of design and construction, connected with a group of Companies in the western northern part of Italy.

No. 7 - A promising engineer

No. 9 - A consulting engineer with office in Milan. Very competent in construction of hydroelectric developments

No. 11 - Switched from technical engineering to administrative

No. 17 - Subsequently chief designer in the large chemical company "Montecatini"

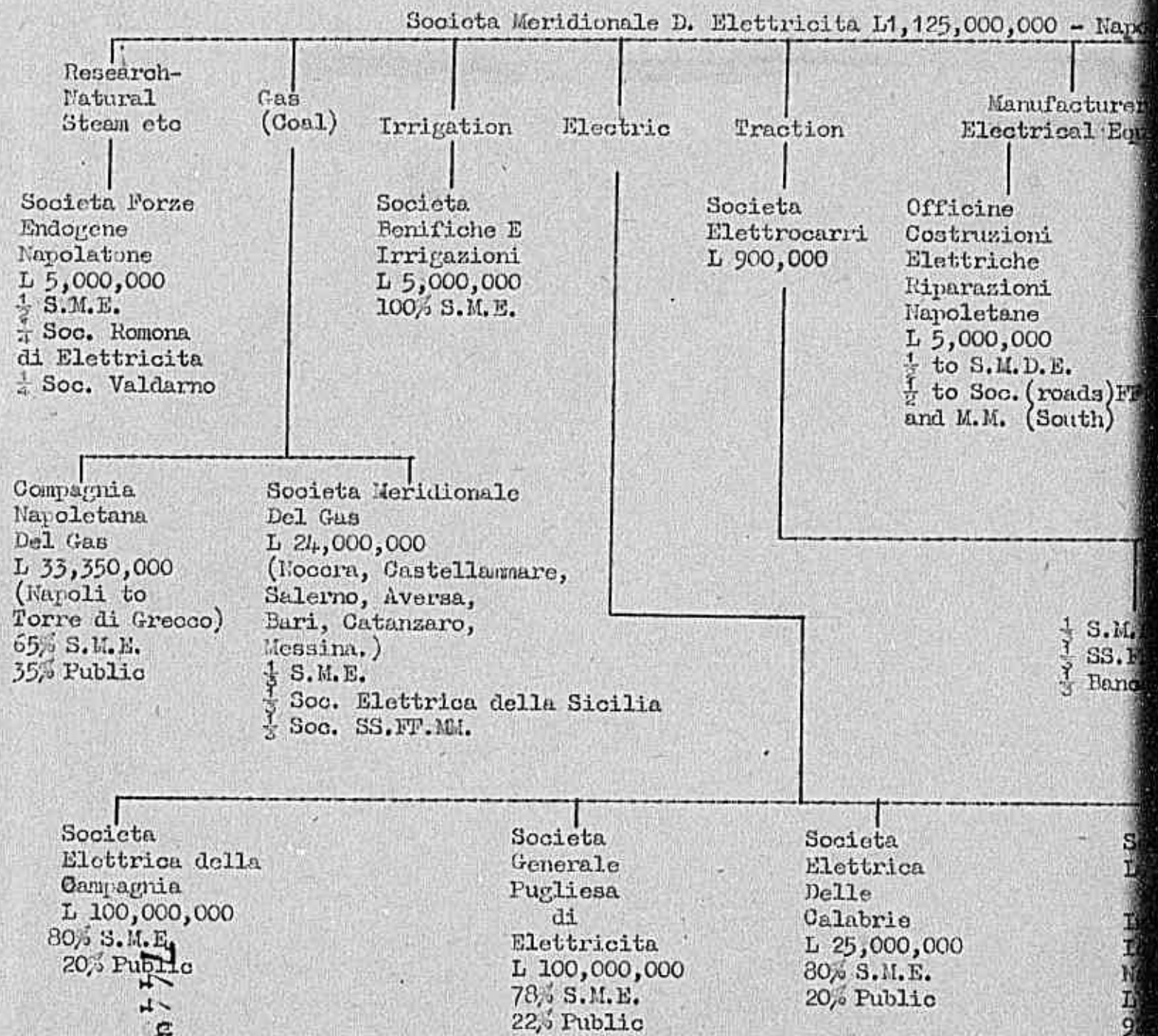

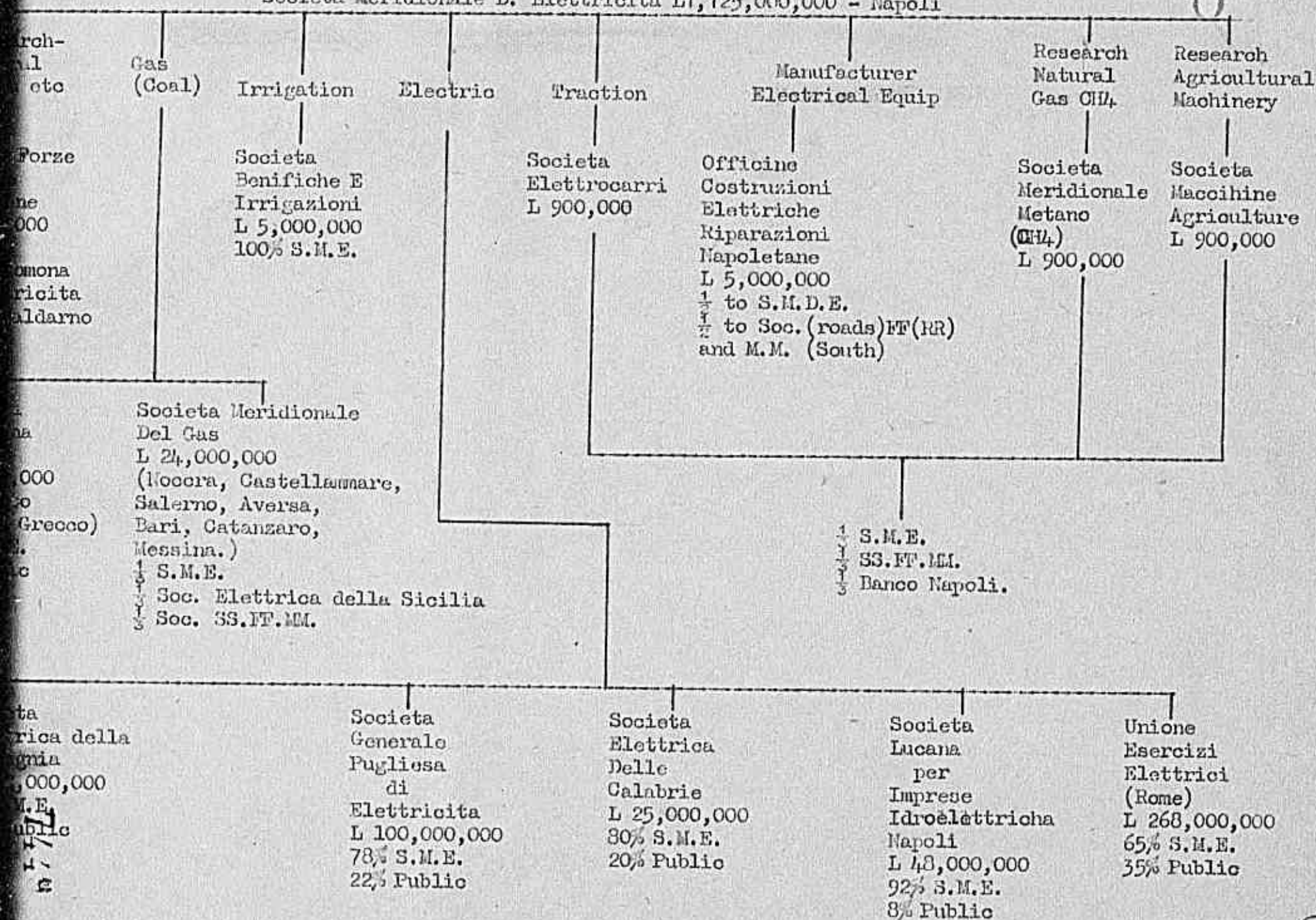
